### COLORED MAN KILLED

Timothy Johnson, aged 35 years, a laborer on the farm of J. Wilmer Hall, near Church Hill, met his death Wednesday afternoon when he was thrown from a horse. In falling he became entangled in the harness and was dragged a considerable distance. One leg and an arm were broken and he died from internal injuries.  
Johnson had just completed his day's work and was preparing to leave the field for the barn. When he attempted to ride the horse the animal bolted, throwing him off. The man was picked up unconscious and carried to Church Hill. Dr. N. S. Dudley was out of town, however, and Mr. Hall continued toward Chestertown. Johnson died before the car could reach a doctor in Kent. The young colored man had worked for Mr. Hall for several years.

### Will Run

An enticing picture of travel up and down the Eastern Shore is painted in the announcement of the Shore Transit Company that by the middle of May twelve automobile coaches will be in operation between Elkton and Salisbury, touching at every town between the two ends of the Shore that can be reached over stone roads. Sharpstown, Preston, Hurlock, Easton, Centerville, Chestertown, Chesapeake City, Greensboro, Goldsboro, Galena, Church Hill, Denton and Federalburg, scattered over the two loops of State road, will be brought into easy contact with each other before the coming of hot weather it is declared.

### Centerville Realty Deals

E. E. Bramble, for many years a Commerce merchant, last week purchased from James H. Costin the two-story brick building on Water street, Centerville, now occupied by the Misses Straughn. Mr. Bramble will move his grocery business to the building January 1. The purchase price was \$6000. Another important real estate deal just consummated is the sale of the store and residence property occupied by Sunset Pharmacy and the home of C. H. Kenton. Mr. Kenton last week sold this property to A. A. M. Dewing, proprietor of the Sunset Pharmacy, for \$15,000.

### Expert Shots To Be Developed In Sanitary Detachment, First Infantry, Md. N. G.

Now that Spring is almost here and the time for out-door activities is fast approaching, plans are rapidly being developed for the Field Training of Company "SD" First Infantry, Maryland National Guard this city. In order to devote the maximum amount of time while on the range to actual firing, much of the preliminary instruction will be given in the Armory before going on the rifle range. Rifle shooting in the Army is at long ranges as compared to civilian practice, and therefore requires careful, systematic instruction. The method followed in making good shots of the users of the weapons of various kinds, do not differ materially, and they will be given the same instruction as the rifle.

After having completed the preliminary instruction at the Armory, there will follow a tour of duty at the State Rifle Range, at Glenburnie, Maryland, where he will demonstrate by record firing his qualification. There are three classes into which soldiers qualifying are divided, first the Expert Rifleman, which is the highest, next the Sharp-Shooter, and the other marksman. As a mark of distinction a Silver Badge appropriate to the classification is issued the soldier qualifying, and will be worn by him as a part of his uniform. Men interested in learning how to shoot who are not members of Company "SD", should speak to Captain Hines without delay so that they may enlist at this time and take advantage of the instruction from the start, and in so doing they will not be at the disadvantage of having received less practice than the other men of the Company. In no previous year at camp or on the rifle range has the shooting efficiency of the National Guard received the consideration that it will during the coming summer, and it is hoped and expected to establish a record for the Maryland National Guard and to place Company "SD" at the head of all the Companies in rifle marksmanship. Time of encampment, July 22 to August 5, inclusive, at Edgewood, Maryland.
