

Election Notice

By virtue of power contained in a Bill herewith published there will be an election held

Monday, May 15, 1922

at the Court House, in Chestertown, Md., between the hours of 9 a. m. and 6 p. m., for the purpose of voting for or against a Bond Issue for Chestertown, the particulars being found in the following bill:

LAWS OF MARYLAND.
January Session, 1922.
SENATE BILL NO. 320.
Chapter 173.
A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT to provide for a bond issue by the Commissioners of Chestertown, Kent County, Maryland, for

the improvement of the streets of said town and to submit to the legally qualified voters of said town the question of whether or not said bonds shall be issued.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioners of Chestertown are hereby authorized and empowered, in their discretion, and subject to the provisions of Sec. 4 of this Act, to borrow upon the faith and credit of the said town a sum not exceeding \$50,000, and to issue and sell coupon bonds therefor in sums of not less than \$100 or more than \$1,000, each to be signed by the President of the Commissioners of said town, and to be countersigned by the clerk thereof, and the seal of said town attached. Said bond shall be known and designated as "Street Improvement Bonds," and shall bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of January and July in each and every year until the said bonds are paid; said bonds shall be exempt

from all State, County and municipal taxation, and shall have printed on them a distinct reference to the Act authorizing their issue.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That said bonds shall be so issued that two thousand dollars thereof shall become due and payable on the first day of July, 1924, and two thousand dollars thereof on the first day of July in each and every year thereafter until the whole amount so issued shall have been paid, and said bonds shall be sold at public or private sale in such amounts, not less, however, than \$500 at any one time, and not exceeding in the total the said sum of \$50,000, and at such time as the Commissioners of Chestertown, in their discretion, may deem proper. It is especially intended that the power hereby vested in said Commissioner shall be a continuing power until the whole \$50,000 of bonds shall have been issued and sold.

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted, That the money arising from the sale

of said bonds shall be paid to the Commissioners of said town and by them be deposited in some safe bank, and shall only be drawn therefrom on checks signed by the President of said Commissioners and countersigned by the clerk, and the said clerk shall keep in a book for the purpose a full registry of the bonds sold, the number of bonds and name of purchasers and the amount realized on the sale and any transfers and assignments of the same. The said funds shall be available for the improvement of the public streets and sidewalks of said town.

Sec. 4. And be it further enacted, That the question whether said bonds shall be issued by the Commissioners of Chestertown shall be submitted to the registered and qualified voters of said town at a special town election to be held on

MONDAY, MAY 15, 1922, and there shall be printed on each ballot the words
"For Street Improvement Bonds"

and "Against Street Improvement Bonds," the same to be printed on the ballots so as to give the voter an opportunity to designate by a cross (X) in a square or box opposite the above-mentioned words, his answer to such question.

If a majority of those voting on the question at said election shall be in favor of issuing the above-mentioned bonds, then this Act shall immediately become effective, but if a majority of those voting on the question shall be against the issuance of said bonds, this Act shall be of no effect and the said bonds shall not be issued.

Sec. 5. And be it further enacted, That this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency law and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, and the same being passed upon a ye and nay vote, supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, shall take effect upon the date of its passage.

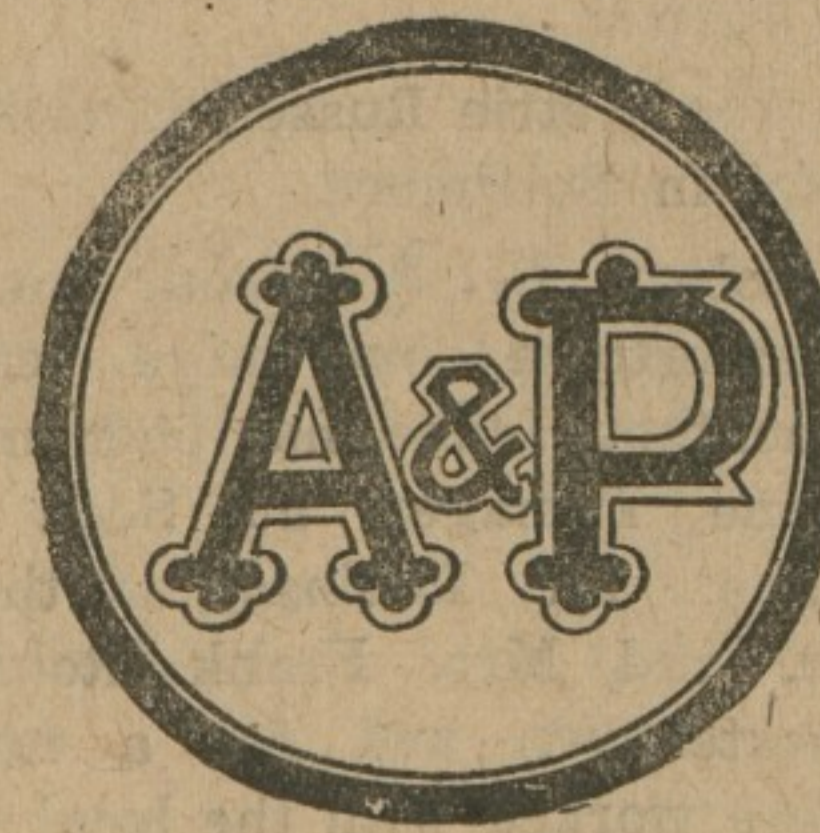

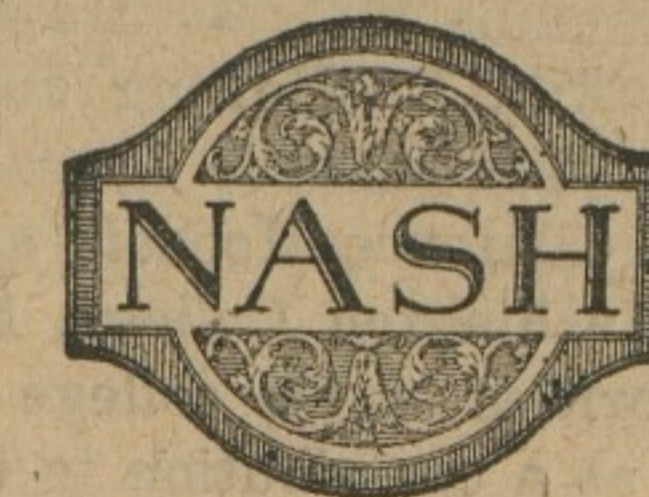
