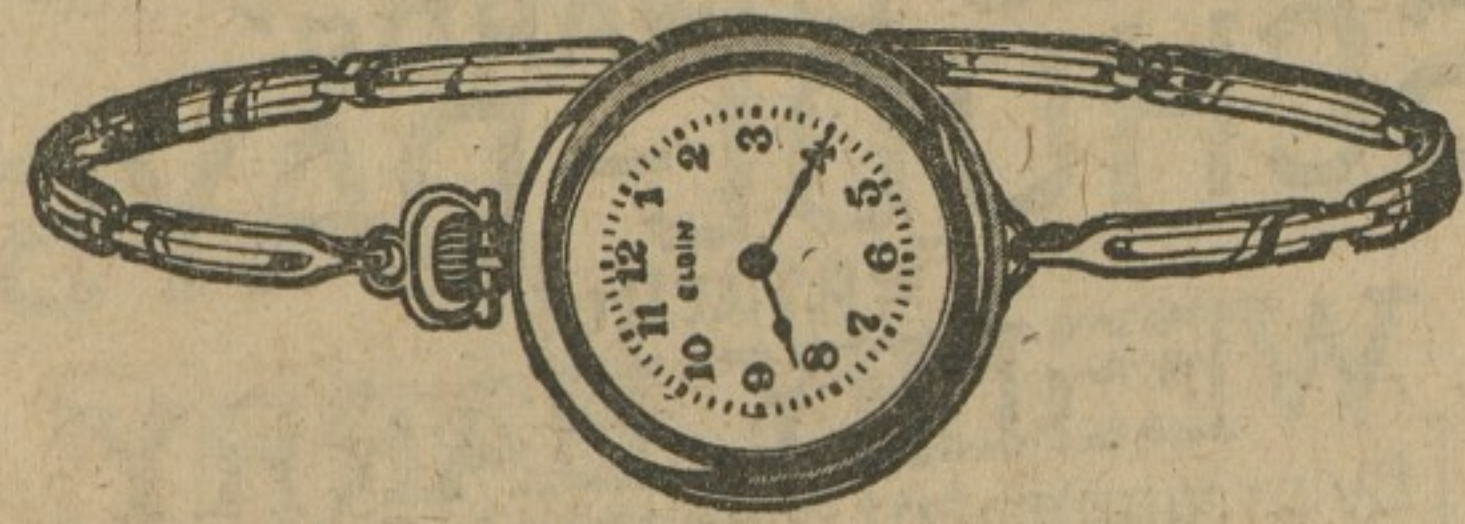

Newnam and brother of John Newnam, of Galena, this county. Funeral services were held at the residence of his mother, Mrs. Hiram C. Powell, Warwick, Md., interment at Crumpton, Queen Anne's county. Rev. Mr. Sterling of Galena, officiated. The bearers were: William Stradley, Medford Ford, Ernest E. Hickes, Philip Ireland, Lester McCauley and P. K. Horsey. Young Newnam had been employed for a number of years in the Baltimore Machine Shops. He was a very popular young man and had a host of friends. He lived for a number of years near Galena, before going to Wilmington.

### \$275,000 LAWSUIT

Hubbard Fertilizer Company To Call Scientists To Show Damage Done By Potash.

Many expert witnesses are expected to be called in the trial of the \$275,000 suit by the Hubbard Fertilizer Company against the American Trona Corporation of Sears Lake, California, growing out of the contract and delivery of domestic potash foreign product due to the war. The case is being tried before Judge Stanton and a jury in the Superior Court, Baltimore.

The action is a sequel to an attachment more than a year ago of Trona potash valued at \$40,000 under a claim for unliquidated damages by the Hubbard concern through attorneys Harry M. Benzinger and Henry H. Dimmeen.

Ten carloads are said to have been delivered under contract in 1918 to the Hubbard plant in Searsport, Maine, the product being represented as containing 50 per cent of actual potash to the ton, with nothing which might be injurious to crops. This was used in the manufacture of fertilizer, according to witnesses, and the material was said to contain 10 per cent of borax in unrefined form, having a caustic effect upon the potato crops of the Maine farmers.

The Hubbard interests maintain that the result was a settlement of claims among the growers amounting to more than \$300,000 for damage to crops in addition to the sale of the plant at a great loss at a time when \$500,000 annual business was being done. The case promises to consume many days, and the defense will be offered through Attorney Charles McHenry Howard.

One of the witnesses summoned will be Bailey E. Browne, whose experimental work in the fields of Maine was reported to the Department of Agriculture. In this report, it is said, comparative photographs were published showing the alleged detrimental effect of the potash put out through the California corporation.

\$275,000 Suit Taken From Jury  
Taking the case from the jury, Judge Stanton in Superior Court yesterday gave a verdict in favor of the American Trona Corporation of California, the defendant in a suit for \$275,000 instituted by the Hubbard Fertilized Co. of Maine.

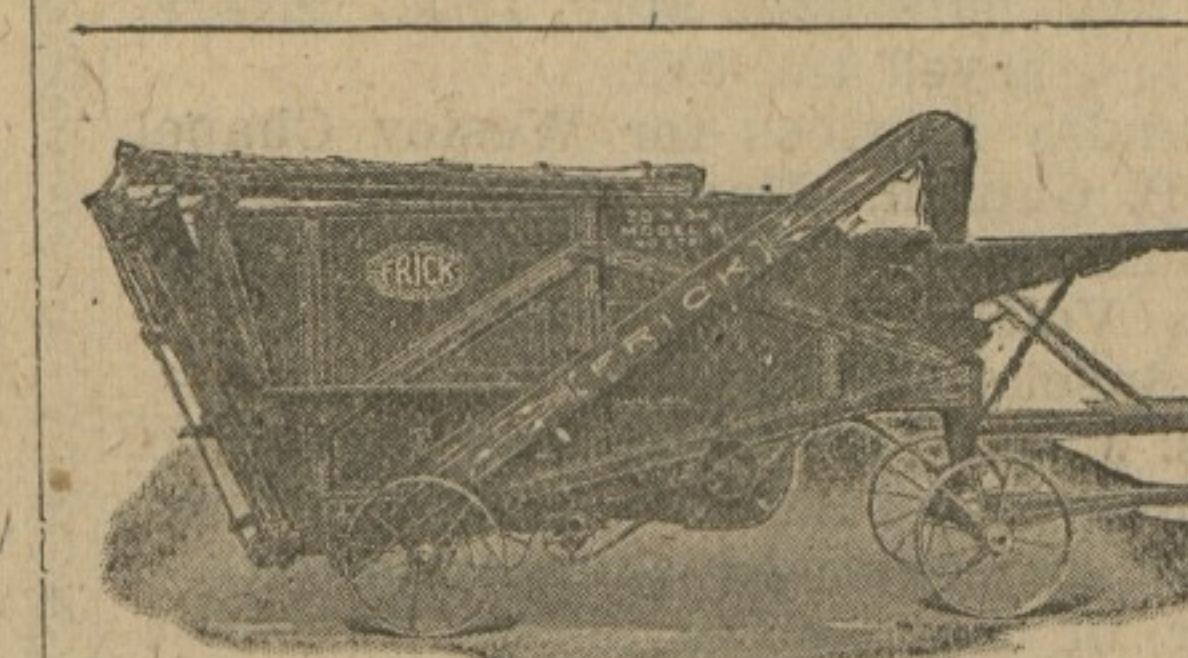

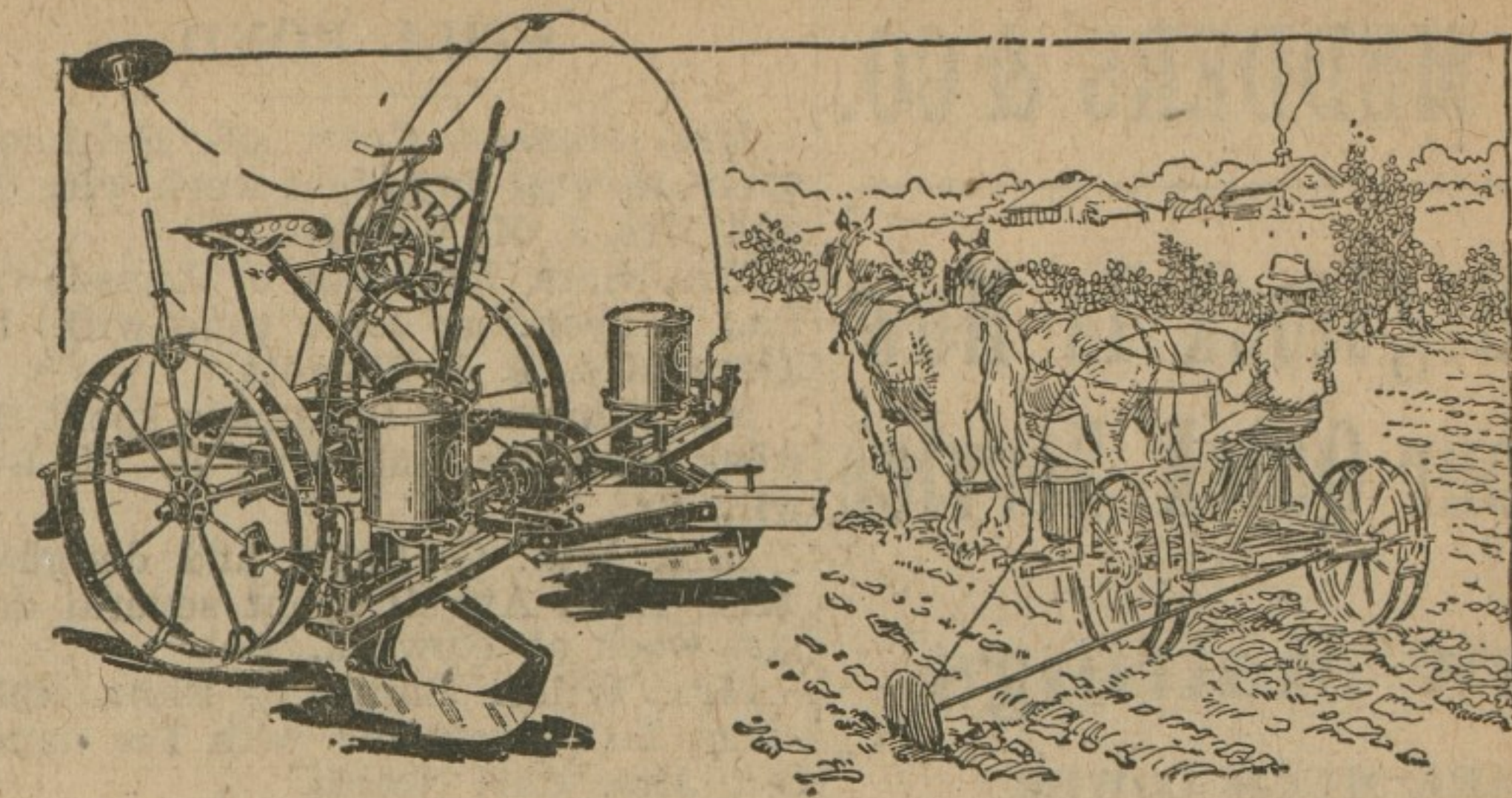

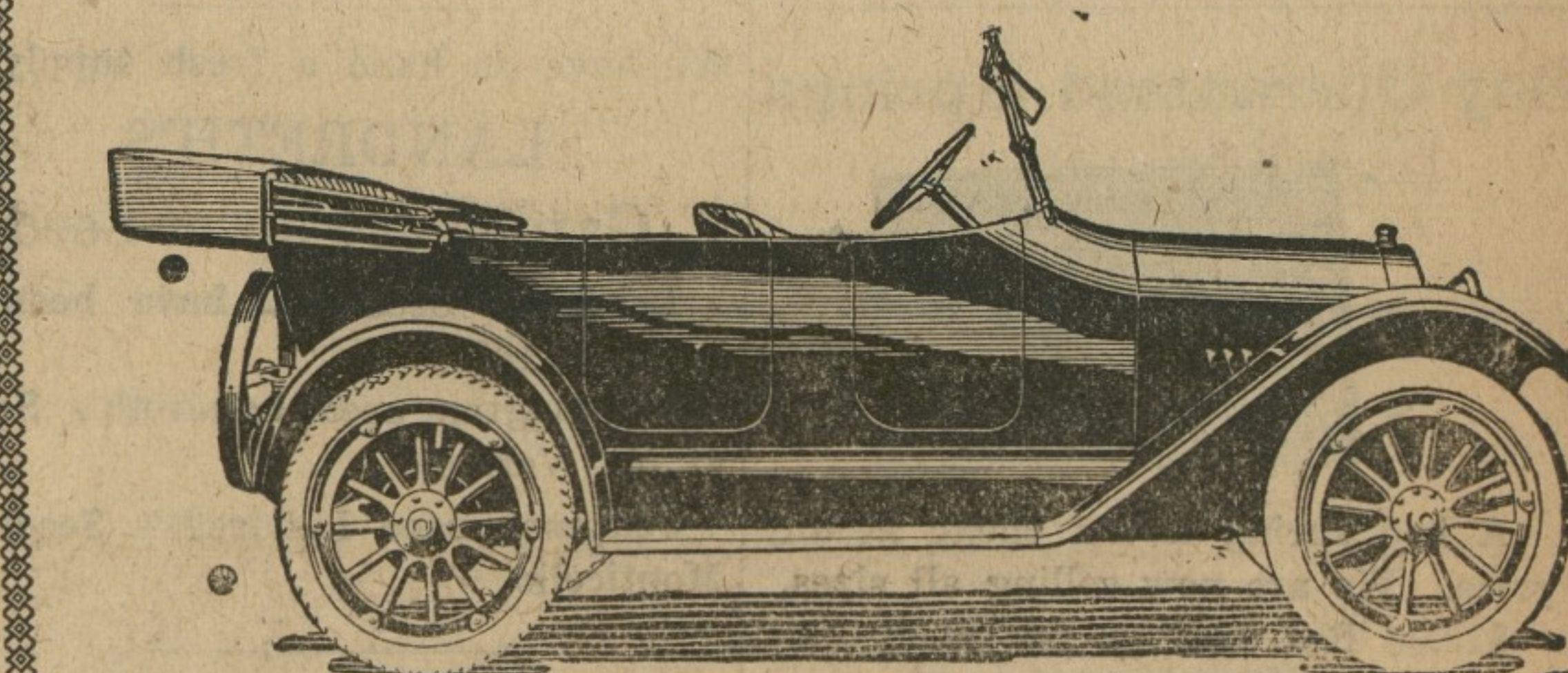
