CAPT. TAYLOR DIES SUDDENLY

Capt. William J. Taylor, master of the steamer B. S. Ford, was found dead in bed on the boat Wednesday morning. The Ford had been on the ways for a month and on Tuesday was piloted by Capt. Taylor to the Light street wharf ready to resume her trips next morning to Chestertown. The Captain went up town and boarded for awhile, then returned to boat and conversed with the crew until 1 a. m. The night watchman called him at 5.30 a. m. but did not respond and upon investigation found him dead. He had been afflicted with heart trouble for some months.

Capt. Taylor was 64 years of age and unmarried. He entered the service of the Chester River Line when quite young and for more than 35 years had been on the steamer plying the Chester river. He was an ideal captain respected by his crew and having the highest confidence of the traveling public. He was big hearted, affable and courteous, kind and considerate, generous and sympathetic. We know of no better tribute to our friend than these lines:

He was not beautiful, he had No comeliness or grace, No winning, sweet attractiveness In figure or in face; Yet was there something in his mien That brightened every place. He had no learning, deep, profound, He knew not, could not say Aught of the deeds of heroes great That long have passed away; He only knew and did the right, That came to him each day. He had no wealth, no stocks, no bonds, No acres fair and wide; He had no mansion, palace, planned, Adorned and beautified; But earth was richer while he lived, And poorer when he died. The funeral took place yesterday morning from the residence of his nephew, Major Louis E. Lamborn, 1740 Park avenue, Baltimore, interment private. He leaves a brother, James, living in Wilmington, and a sister, Mrs. Mary Lamborn, living in New York.
