What is the difference between Chairman Wade accepting an automobile from a man who hoped to sell groceries to the concern represented by Mr. Wade, and Gov. Ritchie accepting a case of rum from the same man who hoped to get an office from the Governor?

It is stated that the deficit of the United States Shipping Board in its operations of merchant ships and care for the numerous vessels it has in charge which are absolutely idle for lack of business will amount to more than \$2,000,000. This is startling evidence of loss.

It costs enormously to continue the ownership and partial operation of these vessels, and the Shipping Board is asking, with earnest approval of President Harding, for a subsidy of more than fifty millions a year. But this would only add to the burden imposed upon the people. Sound policy points to summary means for getting the government entirely out of the shipping business.

DR. WADE'S REMOVAL

Every good citizen in Maryland will regret the circumstances which brought about the necessity for a trial of so prominent and courteous a gentleman as Dr. J. Herbert Wade. It is also regretted that the doctor was unwilling to state the facts. In the decision of Gov. Ritchie removing Dr. Wade from his office as a member of the State Board of Prison Control, Governor Ritchie said that refusal to explain may be proper tactics in a criminal trial, but should hardly be resorted to as a means of refuting charges of misconduct in office. This aptly summarizes the common sense of the matter and expresses the general opinion. After Dr. Wade and his friend, Mr. Leibowitz, refused to testify, the only course open to the Governor was dismissal. His statement of his findings is convincing evidence that he could not have done otherwise.

Dr. Wade will have the sympathy of many friends, but he must suffer for what was at the least sad lack of judgment. The good that should come out of the case is the lesson it should carry to office-holders, whether of boards or of institutions, that dealers with the State who bear gifts are dangerous associates.

The attack on Gov. Ritchie by Dr. Wade's attorneys did not help the cause of the accused one bit. The acceptance by Gov. Ritchie of Leibowitz's rum proved him guilty of gross indiscretion to say the least.

Harrison's Nurseries have invited the Peninsula Horticultural Society and the Maryland Society to hold their summer meeting at the Harrison orchards, at Berlin, on Friday, July 14th, and the invitation has been accepted. The Harrisons will serve lunch.

The Queen Anne's tax rate is \$1.43 The basis is \$12,986,113, which is \$27,000 less than last year.

Talbot has fixed its rate at \$1.53, increase of 14 cents over that of last year. To give an idea of how the cost of education has increased from year to year the total levy for schools in 1917 was only \$38,000. This year it is \$113,995, made so by law. The total levy is \$239,415, or about \$27,000 increase in round numbers over that of last year.

The assertion that labor demands beer and light wines was declared to be "unfounded," by Wayne B. Wheeler, general council and legislative superintendent of the Anti-Saloon League of America, in an address before the convention of the International Sunday School Association in Kansas City Monday.

"Thus far we have established two facts: Prohibition enforced is a success, and even when only partially enforced it is better than the license system. The following results prove it: Drunkenness has decreased more than one-half. Those opposed to prohibition admitted, after a survey made recently, that consumption of beverage liquor has fallen off 70 per cent and that the number of drinkers is reduced over 17,000,000. Crimes related to liquor have fallen off materially and all existing crime induced by drink proves our contention that alcohol provokes crime and should be eliminated. Nineteen hundred and twenty-one was the healthiest year in the United States. Liquor as a contributing factor in poverty is now negligible. Over \$2,500,000 wasted for drink has been turned into useful channels. Bank deposits and savings have increased and the net increased wealth of the country last year was \$8,000,000,000.

"The attempt of the liquor interests to nullify this law is a challenge to red-blooded Americans. The higher the individual in social or business life, the greater the responsibility that should be attached when he defies the law of the land.

"The Eighteenth Amendment was adopted by twenty-three — twenty-fourths of the States, a greater proportion than ever for the ratification of any other amendment. It is therefore entitled to proportionately greater respect."

Wool To Blankets And Motor Robes.

The Sheep and Wool Committee of the Kent County Produce Exchange met in the County Agent's office recently and decided to give the members of the Kent County Produce Exchange and others an opportunity to pool their wool and have it manufactured into bed blankets and motor robes again this year. Wednesday, July 19th was decided upon as the date to make the shipment.

It takes 10 pounds of clean wool in the grease, 11 pounds if slightly burry to have a fine wool bed blanket 72 by 84 inches double made. It requires 8 pounds of clean wool, 9 pounds if slightly burry and 10 pounds if very burry to have a fine large motor robe made.

Further particulars will be published in this paper before the time of shipment, July 19th.

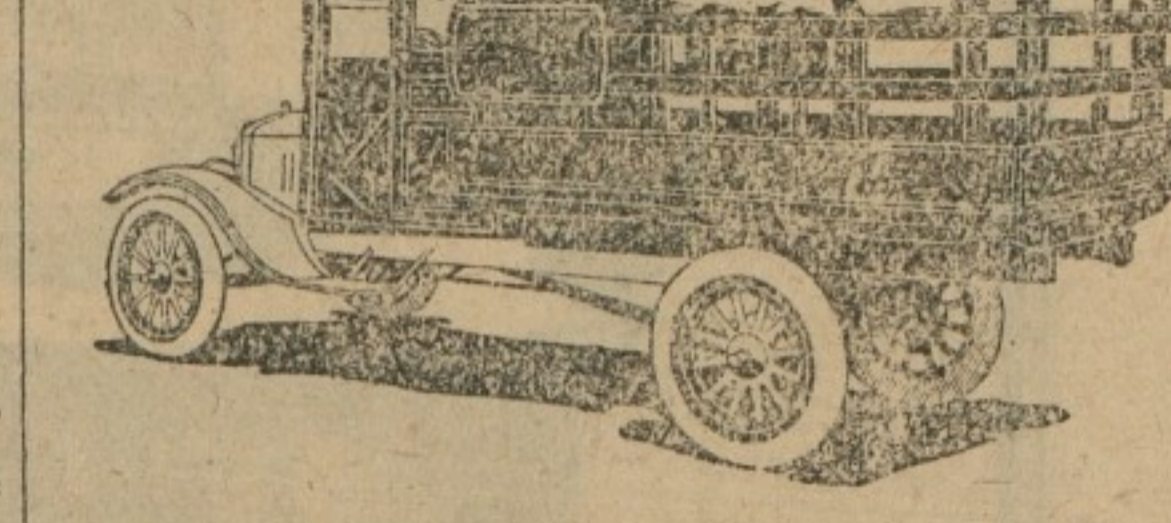
