SHIPMENT OF WOOL

Wednesday, July 19th, has been decided upon by the Kent County Produce Exchange as the day for its members to ship their wool to the Chatham Mills to be made into Blankets and Motor Robes.

It requires 10 pounds of wool in the grease to make a double blanket 72 by 84 inches. If the wool slightly burry it will require 11 pounds to make one of these blankets and if it is very burry it will require 12 pounds. The cost of manufacturing one of these blankets is \$5.00. If all the wool shipped aggregates 1000 pounds or more the cost will be 10 per cent or \$4.50. The estimated cost of freight on the wool, express on a blanket, and labor in making the shipment is 75 cents per blanket. Therefore, for every blanket ordered a total of either \$5.75 or \$5.25 per blanket, depending on the size of the shipment must be deposited in a bank, which will be designated when the wool is shipped, at the time of shipment, July 19th, to cover the above costs.

It requires 8 pounds of wool in the grease to make one Motor Robe 60 by 72 inches. If the wool is slightly burry it will require 9 pounds, and if the wool is very burry it will require 10 pounds to make this Motor Robe. The cost of manufacturing this Motor Robe is \$4.00. If all the wool shipped aggregates 1000 pounds or more the cost will be 10 per cent less or \$3.60. The estimated cost of freight on wool, express on each Motor Robe and labor in shipping wool is 50 cents for each Motor Robe. Therefore, a total of either \$4.50 or \$4.10 per robe, depending on the size of the shipment, must be deposited on the day of the shipment, July 19th, to cover the above costs.

The above are all the charges to members of the Kent County Produce Exchange. All others will be charged a commission of \$1.00 per Blanket and 50 cents per Motor Robe for the transaction. Any balance from the freight charge will go into the treasury of the Sheep Wool Committee with the commissions.

The Sheep and Wool Committee of the Kent County Produce Exchange will receive the wool at the Pennsylvania Railroad Station in Chestertown on Wednesday, July 19th, from 8:30 a. m. to 2 p. m.

All wool for shipment must be packed in either wool or feed sacks in good condition, which sacks will be used in the shipment and not returned. Samples of the blankets will be in the County Agent's office until July 19 and on that date, at the railroad station for shippers to select the colors desired.

The Blankets and Motor Robes will probably not be returned until about the first part of September. While the Sheep and Wool Committee of the Produce Exchange is making the shipment, yet it must be understood that every one who makes a shipment is responsible for his individual amount of wool. When the finished product returns all shippers will be notified as soon as possible and will be expected to get the articles ordered promptly. All members of the Kent County Produce Exchange are especially urged to take advantage of this opportunity to have their wool made into fine wool blankets and motor robes. All others are welcome to do the same, but will be charged the above mentioned commission.

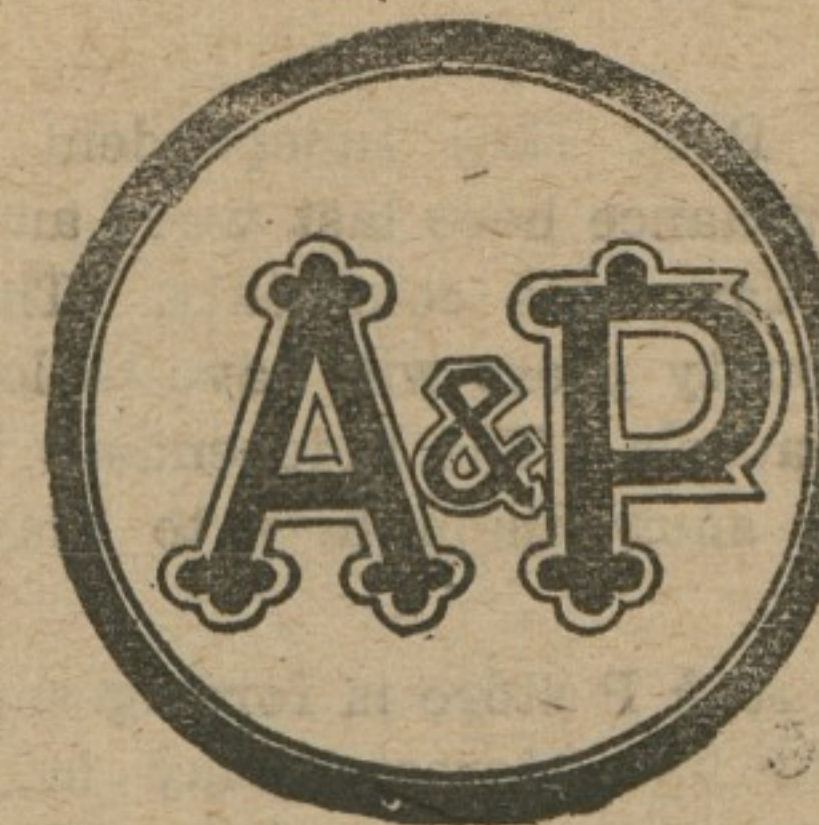

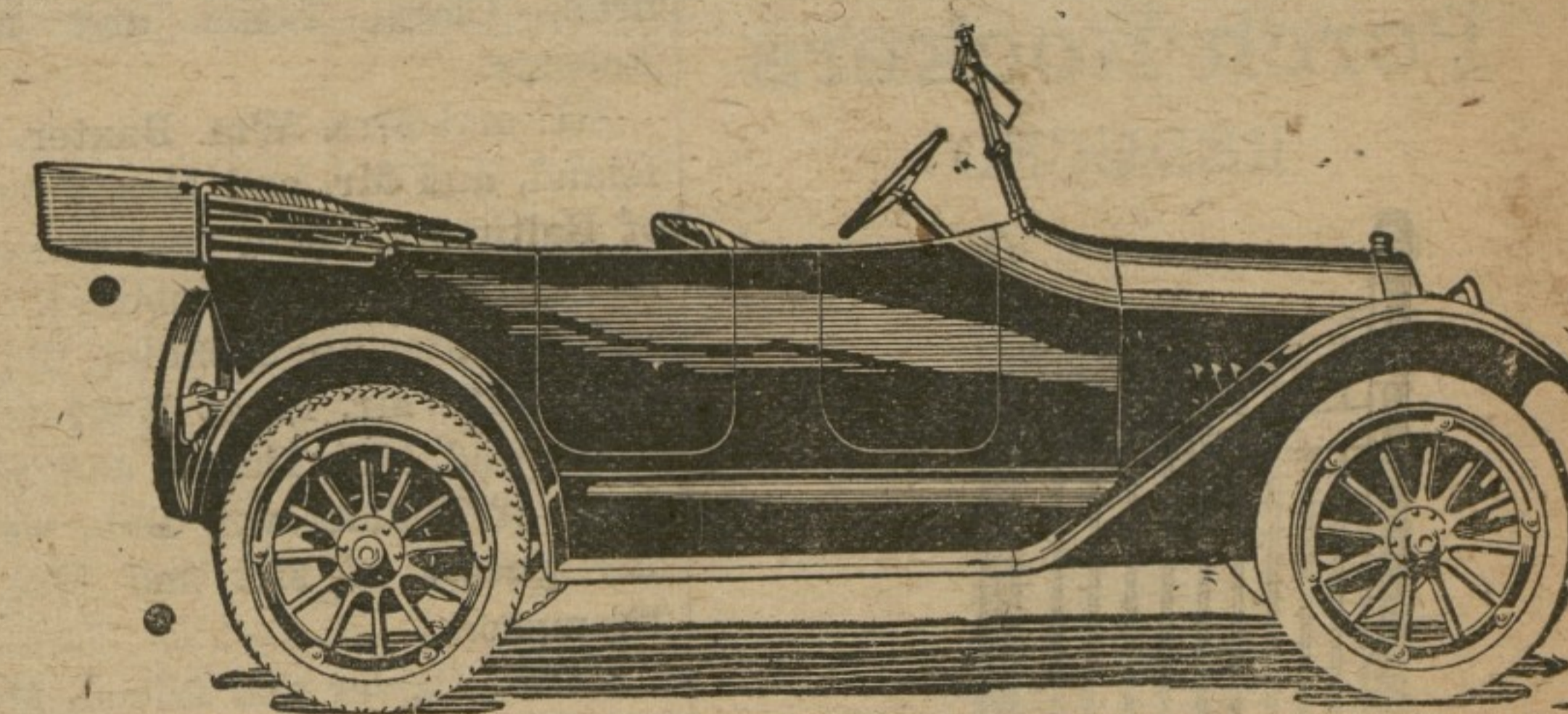
