TREASURER'S SEPTEMBER SITTINGS

On the first day of January all taxes unpaid are declared by law to be in arrears, and delinquents are warned that unless settlement in full is made before April 1st, the Treasurer of the county will proceed to seize and sell their property to pay taxes due with charges and all costs of sale. The Treasurer would, therefore, respectfully urge all tax-payers to pay promptly.

### McCOLLISTER FIGHT AT CHURCH HILL

Two quarts of water, the Klu Klux Klan, memories of the World War, sticks of firewood, doctor's bandages, charges of perjury, echoes of the Norris bandit murder in Baltimore, and evidence that was a complicated blend of contradictions, counter charges and allegations, all played a more or less conspicuous part in another chapter of the McCollister feud, which was renewed in Church Hill last week.

At frequent intervals Church Hill has been startled by these periodical pugilistic rogies, and this most recent outbreak resulted in the arrest of Jay Gould McCollister, of Baltimore, and Milton H. McCollister and Carroll McCollister, of Church Hill. All three are the sons of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel G. McCollister, of Church Hill.

#### The Charges.

Briefly the charges were as follows:

Carroll McCollister alleged that Jay and Milton "double-teamed" him and clubbed him practically into unconsciousness and then beat him unmercifully.

Samuel G. McCollister, the father, alleged that Jay Gould McCollister knocked him down, sat on his chest choked him and beat his head upon the ground. While this performance was in progress he stated that Milton McCollister, another son, rubbed the sole of his shoes over his face. Although he is 78 years old, he says he offered to fight them man fashion, but that they preferred to keep him down and stay on top.

Milton McCollister charged that his brother, Carroll, thumped him in the back with a brick and then attempted to beat him with a board.

Jay Gould McCollister admitted that he clipped his brother Carroll under the chin with a stiff right-handed blow, but insisted that he had not assaulted his father. He maintained that it was necessary to subdue his father in order to keep from being beaten with a stick of wood, which the senior McCollister carried.

#### Town Started By Row.

Church Hill folks were startled by a rumpus on the back-yard of the McCollister home. A few minutes later Carroll McCollister emerged with blood streaming from his head, and Dr. Norman S. Dudley took two stitches in an ugly scalp wound, and bathed numerous bruises about his face. Constables Perkins and Council, of Centreville, were summoned and all three of the young men were brought to Centreville jail.

The case was called for trial yesterday at the office of Justice Robert Coursey. Residents of Church Hill and Centreville appeared in such numbers to witness the trial, however, that it was necessary to vacate

the smaller quarters and hold the trial in the court house.

#### Doctor Testifies.

Dr. Norman S. Dudley, of Church Hill, who dressed the injuries of the only man hurt in the fight, testified that the frequent outbreaks had grown distasteful to the people of Church Hill and they were sick of the numerous escapades. He stated that Jay Gould McCollister had never previously been a party to any of the various difficulties of the family.

At the conclusion of the trial Justice Robert Coursey delivered one of the spiciest verdicts ever rendered in the Queen Anne's county court house. He denounced Milton McCollister as a slacker, draft dodger, coward and ingrate. He also added that the accused had been impeached under oath in previous cases, and concluded by sentencing him to 12 months in the House of Correction for assault on his father, 12 months in the House of Correction for assault on his brother,

Carroll, and \$10 and costs for disorderly conduct. The terms are to run concurrently.

Jay Gould McCollister was found innocent of assault on his father, but was fined \$25 and costs for assaulting Carroll McCollister.

Carroll McCollister was acquitted. In his final statement Mr. Coursey expressed the belief that the Ku Klux Klan might find abundant opportunity for public service in breaking up these frequent feuds.

Senator France Proposed for Medical Care for Soldiers He first proposed in the Senate adequate hospital facilities for wounded soldiers. This Bill had the endorsement of the Surgeon General and leading Army surgeons. Senator France helped to write the first hospital bill which became a law.

#### Senator France Secured Great Hospital for Maryland

This Public Health Service Soldiers' Hospital was established as a government plant at Perryville, Md. It has become one of the most important Federal hospitals in the entire country.

#### Senator France Voted Against Each-Cummings Law

Feeling that it did not offer a solution of the railway problem and that it would ultimately present a serious situation such as now in fact confronts the country, Senator France opposed this measure.

#### Senator France Saved Country Nine Hundred Million Dollars

Believing an extra session of Congress necessary for reconstruction legislation and a fair consideration of the appropriation bills, he forced the extra session, which cut Nine Hundred Million Dollars from the Democratic-controlled Congress bills.

#### Senator France Opposed An Imperial League of Nations

He was unwilling to see Free America enter into an alliance with European empires that would have made our country a party to their endless contentions and strifes. He has always favored a True Association of Peoples.

#### Senator France An Expert on Export Trade

Realizing that Industry in America could not revive and Europe could not be restored without vigorous exportation of American goods, he has spoken on this subject in all parts of the country before business men and his views have been commended by the conservative press of the nation.

#### Senator France's Russian Policy

In 1920 he advocated sending an economic commission to Russia to study conditions with a view to restoring business relations. The efforts of President Harding to establish a basis of trade with Russia at this present time is proof of the foresight and practical wisdom of the entire record of Senator France in the matter of trade with Russia.

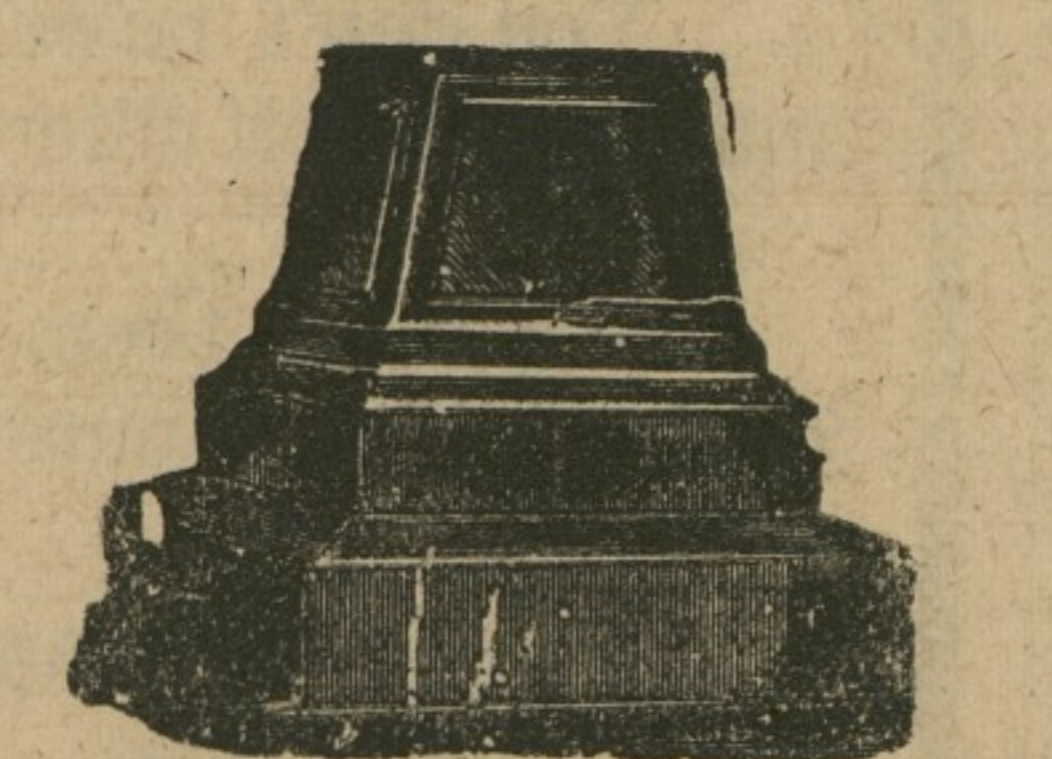

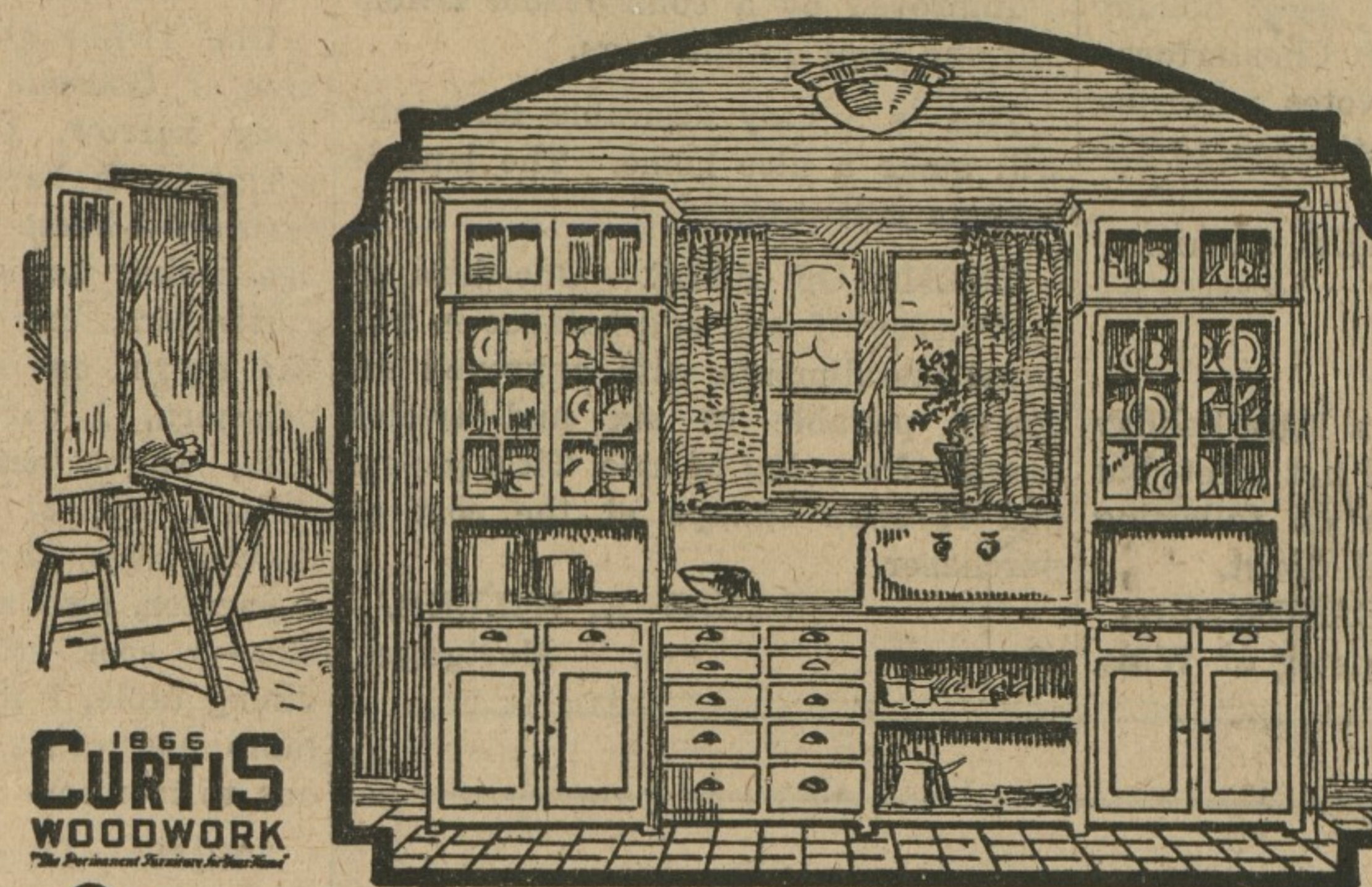
