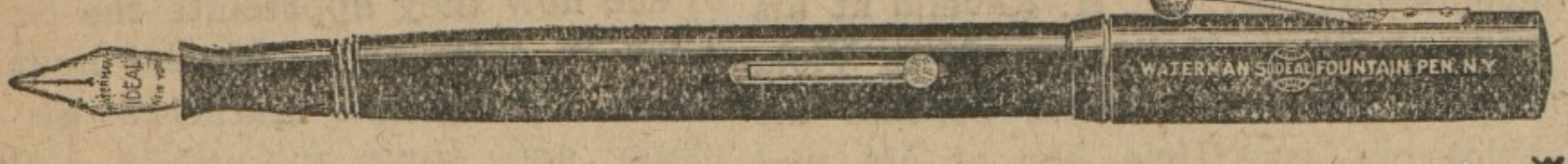

Automobile Accidents

Automobile accidents in the United States in 1921 caused the death of 12,500 persons—one person killed every 41 minutes day and night. More than 300,000 persons were injured. The fatalities on our highways last year were more than the American lead in the Spanish-American War, while the injured far outnumbered our 221,000 wounded in the World War.

That the automobile hazard is growing steadily is shown by the fact that, although accidents on the railroads are decreasing, automobile crashes in 1921 increased 4 per cent over 1920.

For more than two years the Baltimore and Ohio railroad has placed men at crossings where large numbers of automobiles pass. These observers note the machines crossing and taking down the license numbers of those whose drivers fail to take any precaution.

In 1920 these observers noted 398,000 vehicles and, according to their records, 25,000 drivers failed to take any precautions at highway crossings. In one month of this year 16,177 automobiles were checked by the railroad's observers and 2,972 drivers were reported as having failed to stop, look or listen before crossing the tracks. During the first four months of this year 58,806 machines were observed and the "failures" reached 17 per cent.

Goes To Western Maryland

The fifty-ninth year of Western Maryland College will begin Monday with the largest enrollment in its history.

The increased attendance has made necessary the election of a dean of the faculty. Heretofore the duties of that office have been performed by one of the young professors, S. B. Schofield, assistant professor of chemistry, filling the position last year.

The Rev. K. K. Haddaway, recently pastor of Knoxville Church Pittsburgh, Pa., has been elected dean. He is a son of the Rev. Dr. G. W. Haddaway, pastor of Starr M. E. Church, Baltimore. He is a graduate of Baltimore City College and the Maryland University Law School and also has done post graduate work at Columbia and Johns Hopkins Universities.

TO BE HARD WINTER

According to the predictions of some of the oldest and best known weather prognosticators in the country, the winter of 1922-23 will be the longest and most severe for a number of years. It is stated that the fall will be unusually early and the weather extremely cold. This prediction is based on the erratic weather that has been prevailing along the Atlantic States this summer. The weather has been unseasonable, many nights during August having been very cold. The rainfall, taken as a whole, has been extremely heavy throughout most sections, while in the Middle Western States they have suffered from severe drought conditions. The reasons given in this country for the prediction of a hard winter are that the corn husks are heavier than usual at this time of year; the little fur bearing animals are carrying heavier and thicker coats of fur; and the oak trees are laden with acorns.

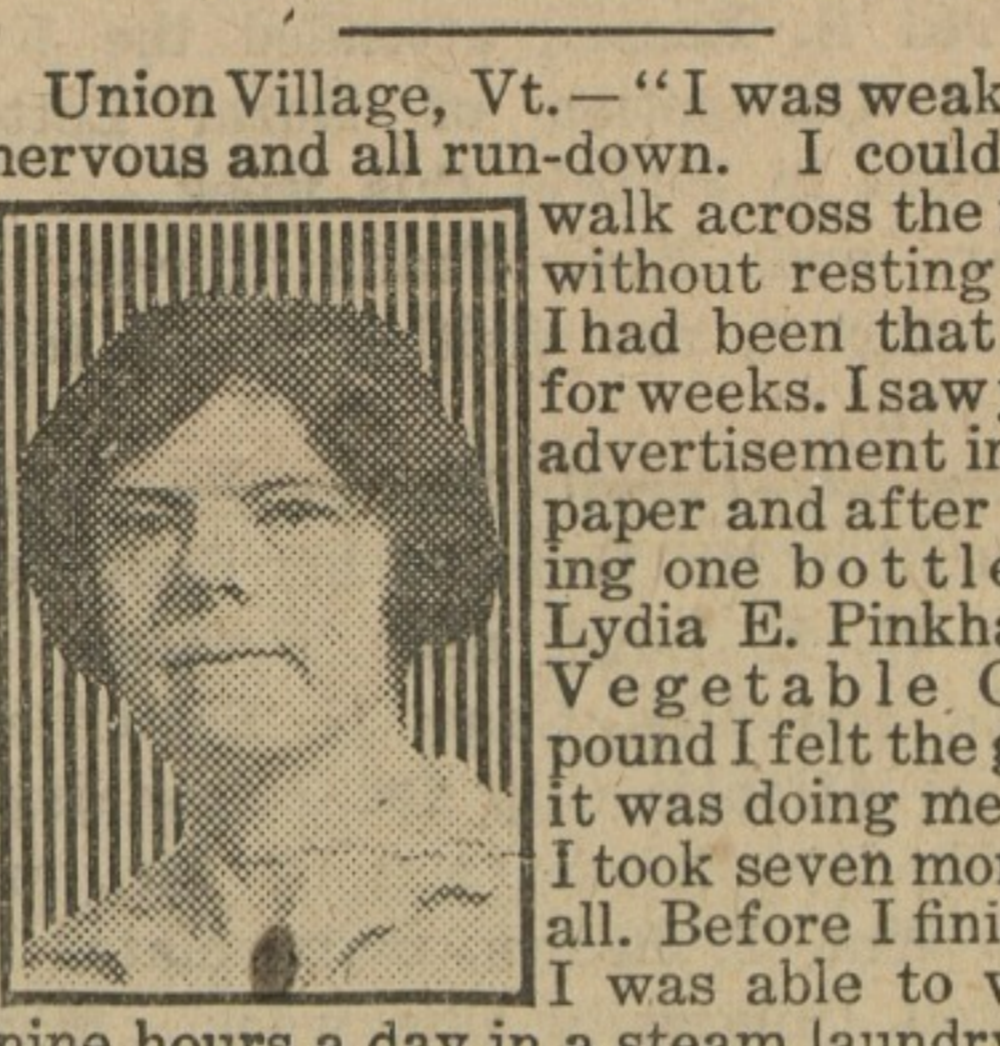

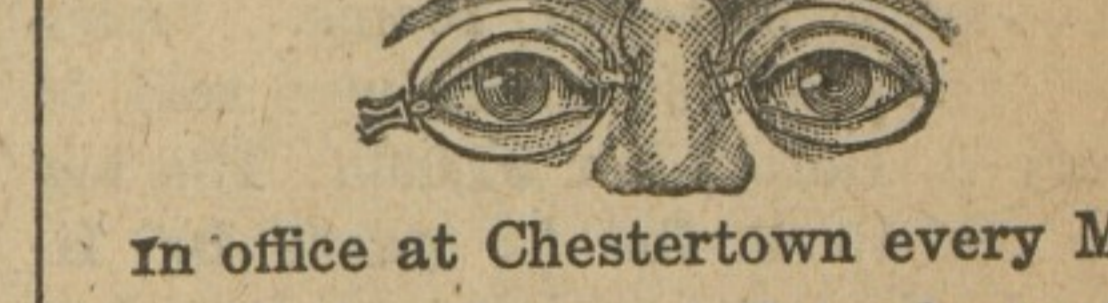
