UNDERWRITERS' TEST OF NEW FIRE TRUCK SATISFACTORY

Sleeping Quarters For Two Men And Drying Tower For Hose To Be Added

Much interest is being manifested by the Chestertown Volunteer Fire Co., in giving to the town and county likewise neighboring communities the best of protection against loss by fire. In addition to the new county truck plans are under way looking toward the erection of a drying tower, with which the hose equipment may be always in first class shape, also means added life to the same, there also will be "bunk" accommodations for two men placed in the fire house. With a couple of the firemen always on hand at night, thus saving much valuable time in case of night calls.

Word has been received that the test recently made by the Board of Underwriters of the new truck was satisfactory and with the addition of a drying tower and the placing of two bunk men in the fire house an additional cut in the insurance rate is looked for, which means much to the business interests of the town.

While a cash settlement was made for the new truck it was necessary to borrow money from the bank to make this possible. There is yet needed more than a thousand dollars to clean up this debt and it is hoped that those who desire to aid with donations to this worthy cause will send in their cash or check to Treasurer B. REV. J. M. GRANT FLETCHER MATERIAL WORSHIP

The Rev. James M. Grant, assistant rector of St. Patrick's R. C. Church, Wilmington, declared during a sermon this week on "Christ before Caiphas," that America has embraced a new paganism like that of ancient Rome, beautiful on the outside but inwardly decayed. Three thousand people attended the services. "Pagan voluptuousness, worship of materialism, worship of self, disregard for the laws of God and nature, filth, degradation, crime, immorality, debauchery and the like caused the downfall of Rome," he added, "and are now eating out the heart of this nation."

"Where are we to find the remedy for our social and moral ills? Not in legislation, not in hypocritical reforms, not in philanthropy, not in telling everybody else what to do and what not to do, not in jailing everybody. These are quick remedies and often multiply the diseases. The only remedy there is a generous return to the practice of a Christian life."

"When men recognize Jesus Christ as true God and submit to His authority—let men work out their own salvation; when they put into practice His precepts of charity, humility and purity of heart in their own lives, then, and not until then, will men find salvation from the flood of evils that make the twentieth century a reversion to ancient paganism."
