The farmers of Kent are getting anxious about the price of tomatoes. Many have refused to contract for less than 30 cents. It is evident that if the growers would stick to this agreement the price would be 30 cents. But, it seems that there are always some who are fearful of not getting a contract and will sign up at a low figure. They are lead astray by the offer of getting more money if the "others" give more. As soon as the signature is gotten for a low price it is shown the "others," and then the price fixed. H. Clay Lusby says he has contracted with farmers about "Shipyard" wharf, near Edesville, for 175 acres at 25 cents "or more if others give more" the farmer being McGrath & Company.

Frank L. Rigby, of near Easton, died Friday week at Easton Hospital after a month's illness, aged 35 years. He leaves a widow and two small children. Also three brothers, Charles Rigby, of Easton, Arthur, of Easton, and J. Ivin Rigby, of near Chestertown, and five sisters. Funeral was held Sunday from his late home.

Rev. Julius A. Brewington died at his home at Hebron, Wicomico county on Sunday last, aged 68 years. He was a retired preacher of the M. E. Church. He leaves a widow, who was Miss Ida Wood, of Talbot county, also four children by former wife. The funeral was held Wednesday with interment at Denton. Presiding Elder Dashiell officiated at funeral. The widow is a sister to Mrs. J. Iven Rigby, of near Chestertown.

VICTOR STRADLEY KILLED
A fatal accident occurred Friday afternoon just below Cecilton. Hanson Horsey, Keith Cochran and Victor H. Stradley, Jr., were on their way to their homes in Galena, Mr. Horsey driving the car. Mr. Stradley was on the rear seat. The vehicle ran so close to the side of the road that the top scraped a telephone pole and Mr. Stradley's head came in contact with the pole with such force that his skull was fractured. When his companions discovered his plight he was taken to Dr. R. M. Black, who had him carried to Union Hospital, Elkton, where he died a few hours after being admitted. The other occupants of the car escaped injury.

Coroner Howard W. Green held an inquest at Cecilton Saturday afternoon. Mr. Horsey admitted that he purchased liquor from Thomas Boulden. The jury returned the following verdict: "That the said Victor H. Stradley, Jr., came to his death by coming in contact with a telephone pole and fractured his skull while sitting in a car driven by Hanson Horsey, and we the jurors recommend that Hanson Horsey be held for both local and State authorities investigation, also that Thomas Boulden be arrested for selling whiskey to Hanson Horsey, also recommend that Keith Cochran be held as a witness."

Mr. Stradley was about 30 years of age and was engaged in the mercantile business at Galena. He is survived by his wife and two children.

At hearings before Police Justice Gove S. Scotten on Monday, Hanson Horsey was fined \$100 and costs for driving a car while intoxicated, \$10 and costs for having no registration card, and \$10 and costs for displaying markers belonging to another car. He and Keith Cochran were held under \$100 each as witnesses against Thomas P. Boulden, who waived a hearing and gave bond for Court on a charge of selling liquor. The Cecil Grand Jury will likely consider other phases of the accident.
