METHODIST PROTESTANT CONFERENCE

The M. P. Conference adjourned last Monday night to meet next year in Wilmington at Rev. Leonard B. Smith's Church.

Immodesty in women's dress and deportment on the street and in the home, indecency on the stage and in motion pictures, non-enforcement of the Volstead act, lack of respect for Sunday laws and a growing laxity in the marriage rate were scored in resolutions adopted in the closing hours of the conference.

Governor Ritchie, as chief of the police power in Maryland, was condemned for "refusal to enforce the laws that he has sworn to uphold."

The resolution also expressed regret that the press of Baltimore "is usually found on the wrong side of every moral question, and swift to champion the cause of the liquor gang, the race-track inquiry, a Continental Sabbath, Sunday movies and kindred evils."

The present was referred to in the resolutions as a period of "perilous days" that "call for militant action."
