The April term of the Circuit Court for Kent County was convened on Monday with Judge Lewis W. Wickes and Thos. J. Keating on the bench, and the regular court officers in their respective places. The juries were drawn as follows:

Judge Wickes delivered the charge to the Grand Jury in his usual impressive style. The several dockets were called and orders for disposition entered. Court took a recess from 12 o'clock noon to 1 o'clock p. m., when first case was called for trial.

State vs. James B. Brown, George Johnson, John Brown, charged with being incorrigible. Appeared from docket of Justice R. H. Collins. State vs. Justice R. H. Collins. Charged with carrying concealed weapons. Appeared from docket of Justice Collins. Court trial. Verdict guilty. Sentenced to 6 months in House of Correction.

State vs. Marion Cannon, charged with assault and battery. Appeared from docket of Justice Collins. Jury trial. Verdict guilty. Sentenced to 3 months in House of Correction.

Grand Jury brought in a number of presentments and true bills. Court held memorial exercises for the late Sidney P. Townshend, Esq., Herbert E. Perkins, Esq., presenting the memorial resolutions, to which Judge Wickes responded. The resolutions follow:

In Memoriam The late Sidney P. Townshend, Esq., a man in a tragic manner, the ranks of this Bar has been invaded by Death. On Monday October 20th, 1924, in the morning, the day of convening of the October Term of Court, Sidney P. Townshend, age 62, departed this life.

The deceased was admitted to the Bar of Queen Anne's County on November 2nd, where he practiced until his removal to Kent County, January 21st, 1922, at which time he became a member of this Bar.

As a lawyer he acquired an honorable place in the confidence and good will of the Bench, the Bar, his clients and the public generally. Conspicuously honorable was he in all his dealings with clients and his brother lawyers, cherishing the highest ideals of his profession, with a keen sense of professional ethics. As a citizen he was highly esteemed and public spirited; kindly in nature, possessed with a great fund of common sense and general humor, he was one of the most approachable of men.

The keynote of his life's work was his generosity; his humanity being expressed in his every act and deed. Therefore, be it RESOLVED:—That we, the members of the Kent County Bar, by and through the undersigned Committee, do hereby record, our deep sense of loss and regret at the demise of our Brother, Sidney P. Townshend.

And Resolved:—That we extend to the family of the deceased our sincere sympathy and condolence, and move the Court to direct these Resolutions to be recorded in the Records of this Honorable Court; and that the Clerk be directed to send a copy to the family.

Herbert E. Perkins, Wm. Frazier Russell, Jr., S. Scott Beck, Committee. Tuesday, April 21 Court called at 9:30 a. m., with Judge Wickes, Wickes and Keating on the bench. Case of State vs. Henry Lloyd and Jesse Lloyd, charged with larceny. Tried by jury. Verdict guilty. Court took recess at 12:30 and reconvened at 1:30. Grand Jury brought in a number of true bills and submitted their final report making a record for this court, having been in session, actual time of less than a day and a half. Examined 27 witnesses and brought 17 presentments with 16 true bills. The court highly commended the jury for their work.
