LICENSE LAW

EFFECTIVE JAN. 1, 1916.

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that the License Laws of Maryland were amended by the General Assembly of 1915, and new sections added providing for the licensing of Detective Agencies and Agents, Garages, Cash Registers and Adding Machines, Commercial, Mercantile and Mutual Protective Agencies, Intelligence Offices and Employment Offices, Laundries, Junk Dealers, Trading in Farm Machinery, Soda Water Fountains, Livery Stables, Bowling Saloons, Storage Warehouses, Check Rooms, Dyeing, Cleaning and Pressing Companies, Shoe-Shining parlors and Hat-Cleaning Establishments, Restaurants or Eating Places, Plumbers and Gas Fitters, Construction Firms or Companies, Non-Resident Wholesale Tobacco Dealers and Non-Resident Wholesale Liquor Dealers. For information of the license fees under this law apply to the Clerk of the Circuit Court.

STALLIONS—Any owner and keeper of every Stallion or Jack shall before being permitted to stand or station such animal pay to the Clerk of the Court or some one of the counties of the State the highest sum that he intends to receive for the season for each mare, with the seal of his court attached thereto for said sum, shall be the license for standing or stationing such a stallion or jack for one year from the date thereof; provided, that in no case shall the sum directed to be paid by this section for such license be less than ten dollars, and that every stallion or jack, upon which the said tax is paid, shall be exempt from all other State tax.

Any owner or keeper standing or stationing any stallion or jack without a license shall forfeit and pay twice the sum authorized and required to be paid in the last preceding section one half to the State and the other half to the informer.

MARYLAND ASKED TO AID COLLEGE

State Urged to Help Western Maryland College Raise Needed \$375,000.

FRIENDS ARE BUSY

On Success Of Campaign Depends Rockefeller Gift Of \$125,000 And State Appropriation.

Beginning with the second week in May, the people of Maryland will start the work of raising \$375,000 as additional endowment for Western Maryland College in order that the college may benefit by the offer of the Rockefeller Foundation to give \$125,000 as an endowment and also obtain a state appropriation of \$125,000 for a new building provided the college raises \$250,000 for endowment. By raising \$375,000 the college will obtain both gift and appropriation.

An official announcement by the officers of the college says:

"The Maryland Legislature has made an appropriation of \$125,000 for a Building at Western Maryland College, conditioned on the college raising \$250,000 additional endowment. This appropriation is payable July 1, 1927.

"The General Education Board of New York City (the Rockefeller Foundation) announces a conditional gift of \$125,000 to Western Maryland College provided the College raises additional endowment to the amount of \$375,000, which with their gift means a total additional endowment of \$500,000. This condition, if met, will bring the total endowment of the college up to \$800,000, and place Western Maryland College in the front rank of American colleges. In other words raising \$375,000 secures the state's appropriation of \$125,000 and the Rockefeller gift of \$125,000, a total of \$250,000.

"The Board of Trustees of the College at a meeting held in Baltimore, Maryland, December 9, 1924, gave hearty endorsement to the campaign to raise \$375,000 for endowment, to meet the conditions imposed by the State of Maryland and the General Education Board.

"It is desirable that this campaign shall be put on before commencement of 1925, probably during the month of May.

"Herein is the promise of a new day for Western Maryland College. The hopes and fears of all the years' of the remarkable history of this college are met in this challenge to our loyalty and to our faith. An opportunity is now presented where we must think and give in larger terms than ever before. The alumni and friends of other colleges have met their responsibilities in generous fashion, and it is confidently believed that our alumni and friends will do the same.

"But this cannot be put across unless everybody does his part. The call to the colors will be sounded in the ears of every former student of Western Maryland College. The response will measure their love for the old college and their belief in the ideals for which the college has stood since the day of its founding. And everybody must have a part in the rejoicing of this venture of the successful ending of the actual work of raising the fund desired will be undertaken by students, present and former, in this and every other county of the state. One hundred former students have been named as "captains of ten," meaning that each captain will have under him, as a team, nine other students. The captains may also add to their teams such other persons as are interested in the movement to put Western Maryland College "in the front rank of American colleges."

The campaign manager will be Col. Robert J. Gill, of Baltimore, attorney and noted for his splendid services during the war. He will direct the campaign. Meetings of the captains and teams are scheduled for next month in various parts of the state.

GREATLY AIDS HIGH SCHOOLS

Western Maryland College Graduates Add To Teaching Forces.

Of the 1,306 graduates of Western Maryland College, 379 have taken up the work of teaching, according to statistics just made public by the college. One hundred and four have gone into business, 379 have adopted teaching as their profession, 104 persons entered the ministry, 53 took up law as a profession, 39 entered the medical profession, and 288 engaged in the profession of "home maker."
