STATE TO CLOSE GAP IN ROAD

State Highway Commissioner John N. Mackall Agrees To Complete Thoroughfare Between Kent and Queen Anne's Counties This Year. Plan Sponsored By Senator Roe.

Following the discovery that Chester River bridge, which connects Queen Anne's and Kent counties at Chestertown, was weakening under the strain of constant heavy traffic, a conference was held Thursday between State Senator Dudley G. Roe and Highway Commissioner John N. Mackall, which resulted in a definite agreement whereby the gap between Sudlersville and Millington will be closed this year.

The highway between these two towns has been completed with the exception of a stretch of 1.1 miles, now under construction, and a gap of 1.5 miles which under the original plan would be built in 1926. Under the proposal suggested by Senator Roe and accepted by Highway Commissioner Mackall, the road would be built at once, and the cost underwritten by the Sudlersville Bank until June 15, 1926, when State funds would be available.
