Miss Louise Talley, of the Chincoteague (Va.) High School, carried off first honors.

Miss Louise Townsend, of Snow Hill High School, representing Worcester County, was second, and Miss Virginia Estelle Nickell, of the Calvert Agricultural High School, representing Cecil County, was third.

The judges were Prof. Carl J. Rees, of the University of Delaware; the Rev. Percy L. Donaghy, of Middletown, and Prof. C. W. W. Schantz, principal of the Smyrna (Del.) High School.

President Titworth, of Washington College, introduced the speakers and the Washington collegians furnished music.

Prizes To High School Students Of The Eastern Shore of Maryland.

Too little has been done to call attention to the glorious history and traditions of the Eastern Shore. We all know that our section of the State has played a most important role, but not sufficient honor and respect have been paid to the memory of those Eastern Shore men and women who were creative factors in Maryland History. The Eastern Shore Society is desirous of stimulating interest in all such matters and with that end in view is, for the third time, offering prizes to high school boys and girls of the Eastern Shore for historical contributions. The terms of the contest are as follows:

1. A prize of \$20.00 is to be awarded in each county of the Eastern Shore for the best historical sketch written by a student of that county.
2. The article must be written in its entirety by a member of the class of 1925 of one of the high schools of that county.
3. It must deal with the Colonial Period ending July 4, 1776.

The success of these contests will doubtless lead to more ambitious efforts on the part of the Eastern Shore Society. We have a number of plans in mind for attempting to present in a way we think will be interesting, noteworthy and picturesque in the life of the Eastern Shore.

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### CHURCH NOTES

Catholics of the Delmarvia peninsula, which constitutes the diocese of Wilmington, have successfully ended the recent campaign to secure a fund of \$100,000 with which to restore old St. Peter's Church in Wilmington and provide for its consecration as the Cathedral of the diocese. The fund over the top by approximately \$3,000 more than was needed and the amounts reported at the closing dinner, as contributed by the various parishes outside Wilmington, helped greatly to swell the total and make the undertaking successful.

One of the outstanding features of the campaign was that, in raising the fund, contributions came from so large a number of individual contributors. While there were quite a number of large contributions, it was also evident that the fund could not have been completed so rapidly if it had not been for the prompt response of all Catholics everywhere to whom appeals for contributions were made. The number of individual contributors was close to 5,000. About 2,500 of these had contributed up to the closing day and the rest were reported at the last rally luncheon in the campaign.
