The anniversary of 35 years of successful business was observed Tuesday evening by stockholders of the Third National Bank with a banquet for stockholders and their guests, Cross Street Hall. Covers were laid for 100 guests. Women of the Christian Endeavor Society of St. James M. P. Church served dinner.

H. Stockton Start of the board of directors was toastmaster. Addresses were delivered by W. Bradford Copper, president; Thomas D. Bowers, vice-president; W. Robert Huey, cashier; Robert S. Belknap, of Baltimore, representative of the National City Company, and Wilbur W. Hubbard, a former director. Music was furnished by the Washington College

Orchestra.

The Second National Bank was organized in this town 35 years ago, among its most prominent promoters being Hope H. Barroll, W. W. Hubbard, the late Judge James Alfred Pearce, Judge Joseph A. Wickes and Harrison W. Vickers, and other influential men. W. B. Copper was the first cashier of the bank and enjoys the distinction of having been connected with the institution since its organization. But two other original stockholders are still connected with the bank, Cavt. Wm. C. A. Thompson and Thomas G. Wroth. 
