### Narrow Escape From Drowning

W. Frazier Russell, Jr., Esq., was saved from drowning while bathing from Rolph's Wharf Friday evening. He had gone out about 25 yards from the wharf when he was seized with cramps and his call for help brought to his side Jos. N. Wheatley, Carl Lecates, Vernon Kirby and Harry Smith, all good swimmers, who got him safely to shore. Mr. Russell had eaten his supper only about a half hour before and thinks something he ate caused the cramps. The letter below gives a fuller account of the incident.

Mr. Editor: I beg the use of a short space in your paper for the purpose of publicly expressing my deepest gratitude for the heroic service rendered me last Friday by several of our local

young men, who saved me from a death by drowning. I am only too conscious of the fact that any words I might speak or write fall far short of conveying my feeling of appreciation. For such an act of courage and service there can be no adequate reward, and any attempt to measure in a material way this truly noble deed would simply belittle the deed itself. The only reward, therefore, that I can give is that of eternal gratitude and this, I promise, is an unlimited fund from which these heroes may draw as long as I live.

Allow me, then, to submit as appropriate names for the granite shaft or slab of bronze those of Vernon Kirby, Carl Lecates and Harry Smith. Discarding entirely all thought for their own safety, undaunted by the peril which they unselfishly embraced and actuated only by the highest mo-

tives of real manhood, they courageously risked their lives for mine. Their task of loving service was nobly done, and in addition to the immeasurable gratitude which I personally feel, the community at large can justly be proud of such a splendid exhibition of valor.

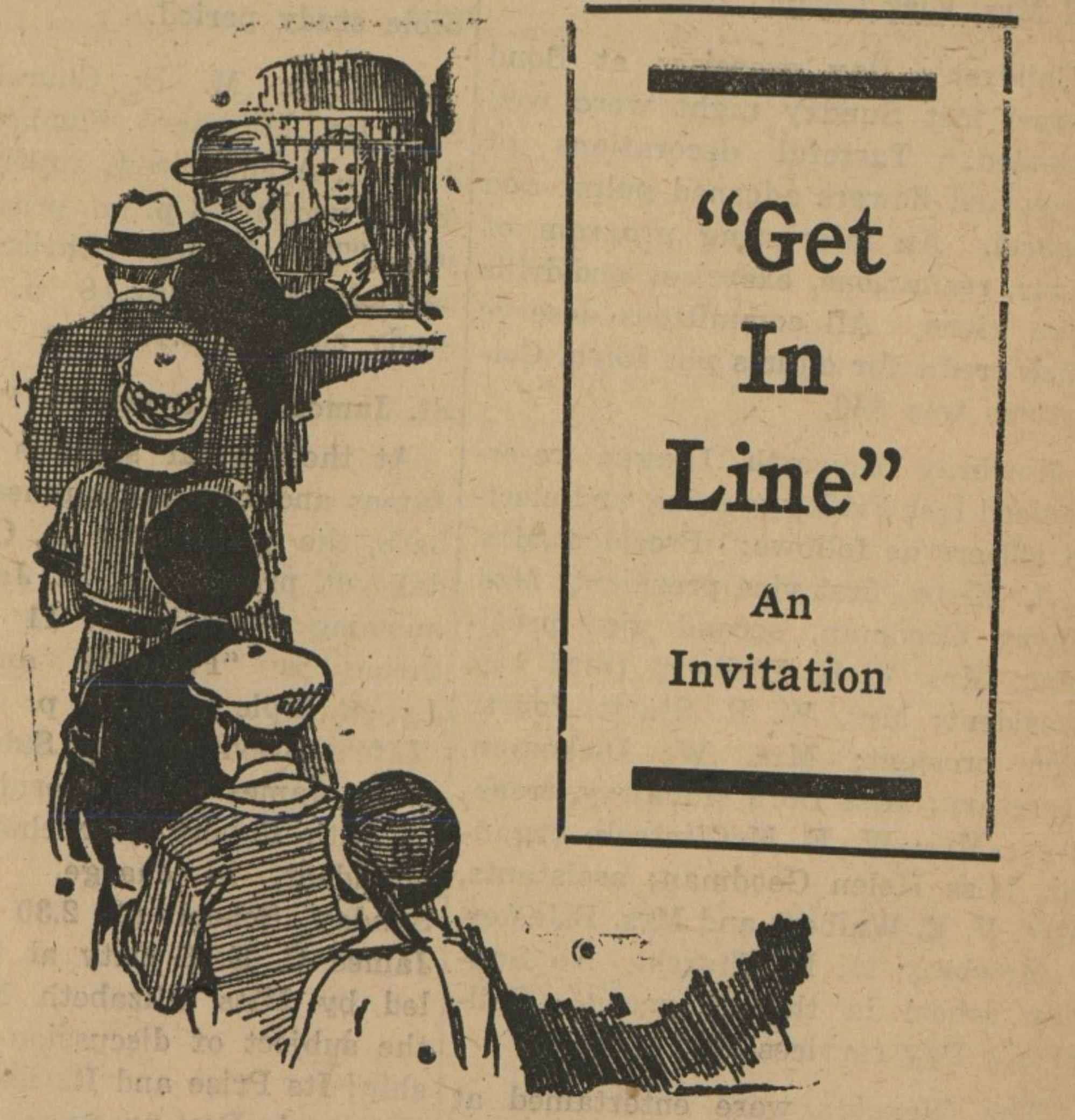
