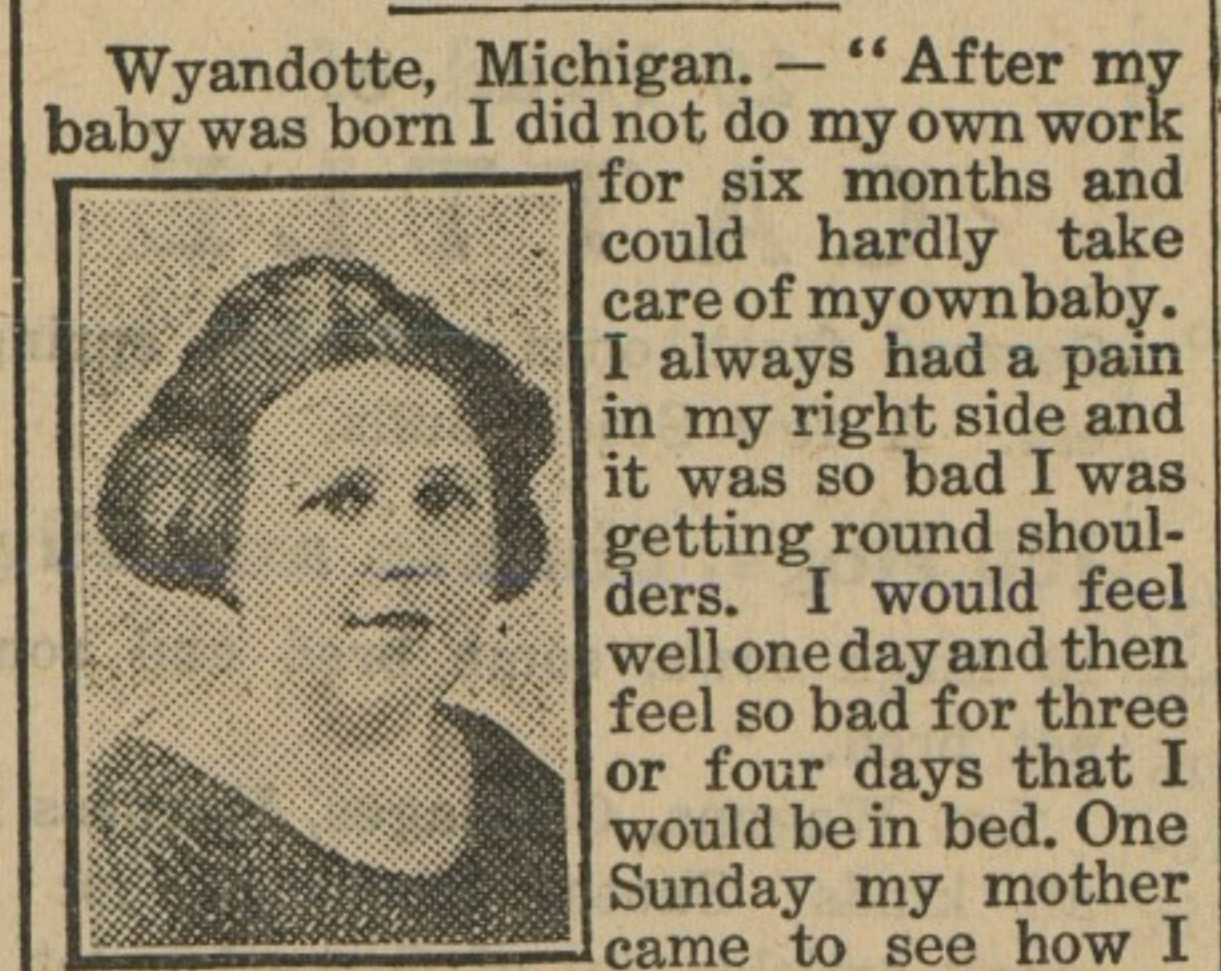

CHESTERTOWN KENNEDYVILLE BETTERTON GALENA

Elkton's Clautauqua closed Wednesday evening, after presenting an attractive and pleasing program.

The attendance was fairly good but the guarantors were called upon to make up a considerable deficit. Notwithstanding this, an increased number signed for Clautauqua's return next year.

Chautauqua will come to Easton next year for its fifteenth time. There was lacking something less than two hundred dollars for this year and this amount was assumed by a committee of ten. The old guarantor plan has been abandoned, and a return to the ticket subscription plan of a few years ago. The plan next year is for a program lasting five days instead of six, the cost being much less, the only loss being that the top-notch lecturer is not included in the program, this making a saving of about \$500. It was believed by the committee that this would not detract from the entire series to the extent of the cost involved and when the matter was explained the plan was approved.

Scholarship Examination.

A competitive examination for a free scholarship at Washington College including tuition, board, room and text books for a period of four years beginning September, 1925, will be held Tuesday, August 18th, 1925, at 10.00 a. m.

The requirements are that each applicant shall have completed successfully a four year high school course or the equivalent of the same.

The examination will be given in the following subjects: 1. English — Grammar and Rhetoric. 2. Elementary Algebra. 3. Plane Geometry. 4. Modern European and American History. 5. Latin.

Applicants will be required to take the examinations in any four of the above subjects.

Those desiring to take this examination are required to file with the Register of Wills, Chestertown, Md., not later than August 6th, 1925, their applications with certificates as to mental and moral qualifications.
