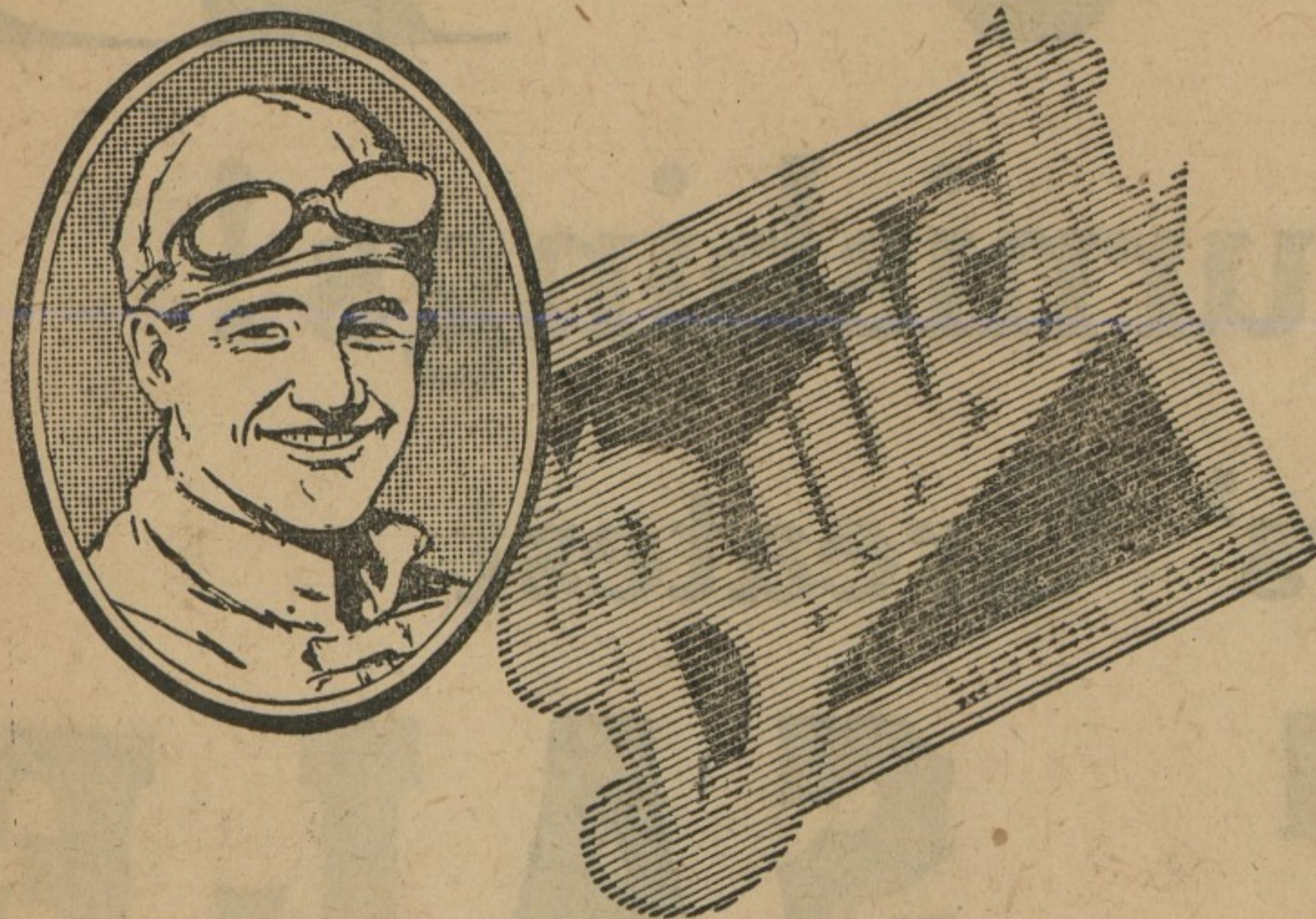

CHESTERTOWN VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY ACTIVE

Confer With Commissioners of Rock Hall and Betterton—To Visit Tolchester Tonight

Officers and members of the fighting force of Chestertown's Volunteers have conferred with the town Commissions of the above named towns and suggested a plan for co-operation, it now rests with citizens to back up the town boards that their part of the program may be successfully effected.

A conference is scheduled for this Wednesday evening with Mr. W. K. Hudson, President of The Tolchester Co. and Mr. J. Frank Wheatley, Sup't. at Tolchester. Last evening, Tuesday, the Fire Company, visited "Montebella Lake," the County home of Mr. Clinton E. Woods, who made a liberal donation to the new Countywide fire apparatus fund, and from the unlimited supply of water of the lake gave a demonstration, following which the boys were invited to partake of tempting prepared repast, which all greatly enjoyed.

Stork and Automobile Win In Race From Millington

The automobile, under the guidance of a state highway policeman and the husband of Mrs. Ola Price, of Millington, broke all speed records in the race to the hospital, winning out with a good margin of time to spare.

Arriving at the hospital Mrs. Price, who is 31 years old, was immediately taken to the maternity ward. The new arrival in the Price family arrived soon after weighing 9 pounds and named for his father.

The race to Millington was decided upon by Mr. Price, following a consultation with the family physician, who stressed the necessity of removing the expectant mother to a hospital there.

The husband placed his wife in his car and stepping on the accelerator sped over the rough county roads and across the Delaware line.

At Odessa State Policeman Wm. Workman received word that the husband desired a police escort into the city so that he might get every ounce of power out of his car's motor without fear of being halted for speeding. Workman joined the couple at St. Georges, and standing on the running board, cleared the road.

The machine raced through the central section of the city and out Delaware avenue to the hospital.

Years that are past cannot sever Our loving remembrance of you, On the hill side sweetly sleeping, Far away from care and pain,

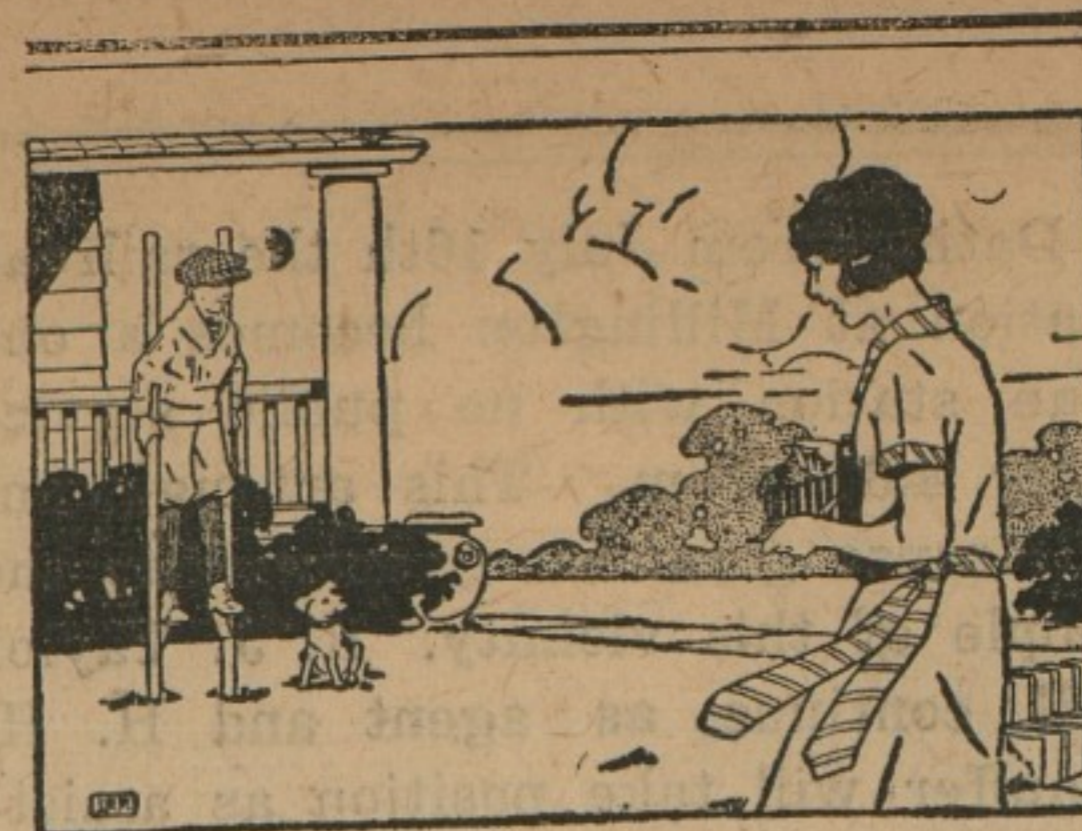

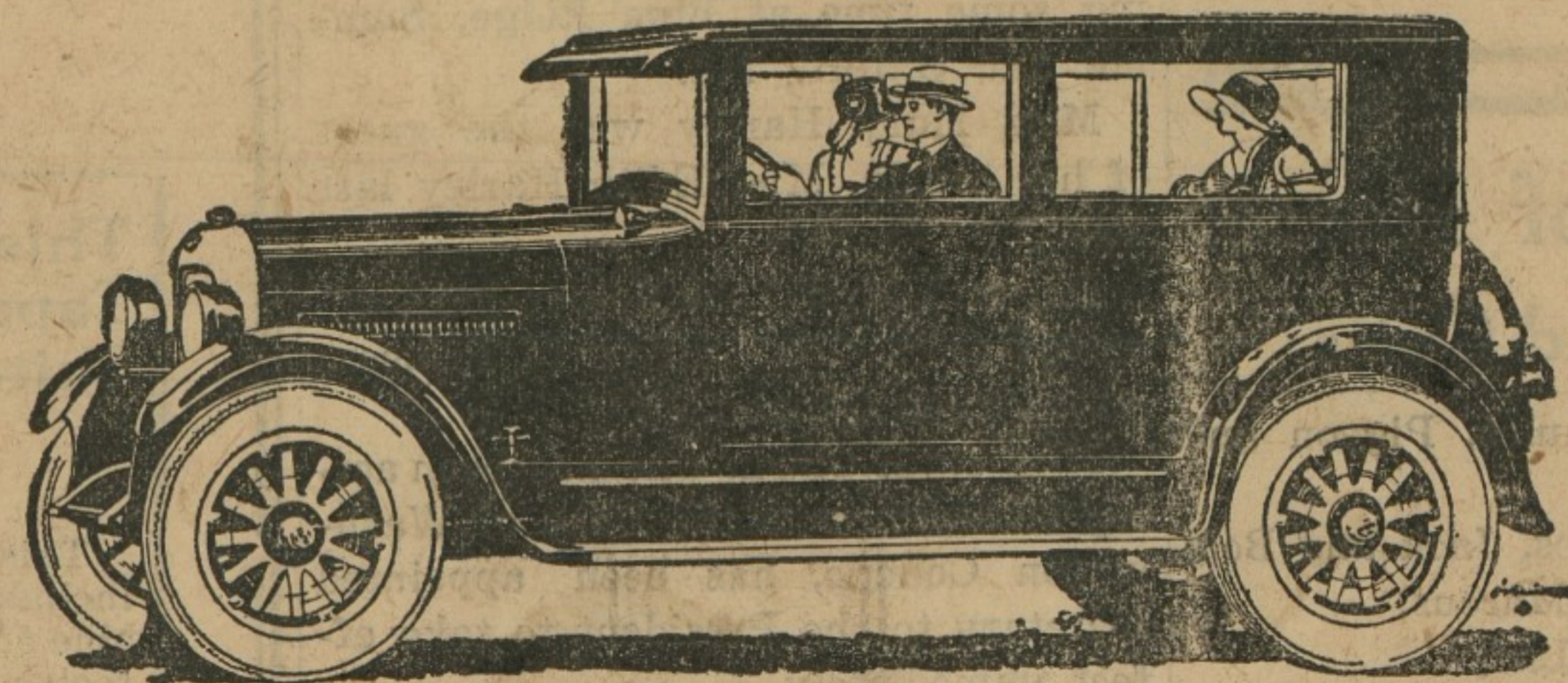
