PINEY NECK ROAD TO BE FINISHED

Here's good news for the Piney Neck people. The Kent County Board of Commissioners last Tuesday agreed to anticipate the lateral road fund for the next year and allow the money to be spent now to finish out the Piney Neck road to Crosby's Corner. The Piney Neck citizens sent a delegation to Chestertown last Tuesday asking for the road now. The Commissioners had twice before passed an order to use the lateral road fund for Piney Neck and they were much gratified that Chairman John M. Mackall, of the State Roads Commission was in harmony with the plan to build the road at once while Contractor Kaufman was right there with his road machinery.

Elsewhere in the Kent News

The State Road Commission is asking for bids for this section which is one and one-quarter miles long. Chairman Mackall says that the contract will be given to Mr. Kaufman even though he may not be the lowest bidder.

The financial end of the proposition will be taken care of by local people; the Kent County Savings Bank, The Third National Bank and The Chestertown Bank of Maryland, all being willing to take either all or a part of about \$25,000 to insure building the road at once.

This will be a fine convenience for lower Kent county.

DIPLOMAS CONFERRED

The young people's conference of the M. P. Church, which was in session at Western Maryland College through last week closed Sunday with graduation exercises at which diplomas were presented to 19 graduates in Christian training. To Dedicate New Fire House

Residents of the town of Millington are planning to dedicate the new Community Fire House on Wednesday evening, August 26. The celebration will form a part of the third annual carnival to be held by the firemen August 21 to 29. Contractor Benjamin F. Duling expects to have the building entirely completed by that time.

The building will be of two stories, providing for a store and a commodious town hall on the entire second floor. The building will cost \$5,000 when equipped, the entire amount having been raised by the firemen through private subscriptions and various entertainments. Residents of the town are having made a memorial tablet upon which will be inscribed the names of the soldiers who died in the World War, the tablet to be placed in a conspicuous place on the front of the building and unveiled on the 26th with appropriate exercises.

A committee has been appointed to arrange the program for the dedicatory exercises.
