

### St. James, Noted Kent County Church, Observes Centenary

Methodist Protestants and members of other denominations from all sections of the county and many from nearby cities gathered in Old St. James' Methodist Protestant Church Wednesday, August 6th, to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the founding of the church.

The exercises began Tuesday evening at the parsonage with a reunion of those who had returned for the celebration and many acquaintances were renewed and reminiscences told of days long ago. One of the interesting features of the reunion at the parsonage was the presence of Wilmer Little, of Baltimore, son of Rev. Dr. and Mrs. F. T. Little. Mr. Little was the first baby born in the parsonage and spoke feelingly of his recollections of the church and its people.

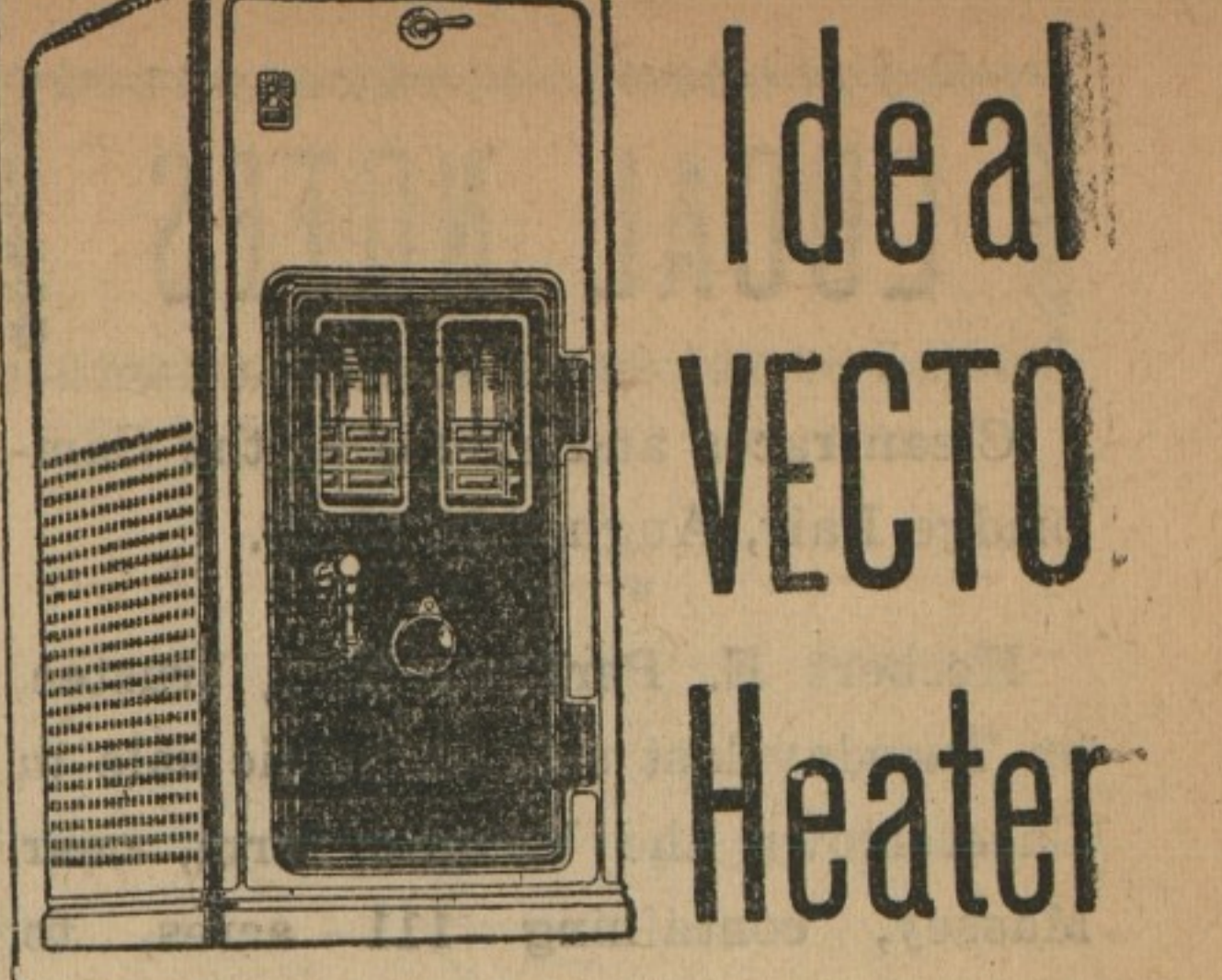
At 10 o'clock Wednesday morning, Rev. Dr. F. T. Little, the first pastor of the church after it became a separate station in 1879, who is now living in Baltimore, having retired from the active ministry after a service of fifty years, and Rev. Dr. Sewell S. Hepburn, rector of old I. U. Protestant Episcopal parish, who represented that denomination of which St. James was originally a part, brought greetings. At 10:30 a. m. Rev. Dr. G. I. Humphries, president of the Maryland Conference, preached the centennial sermon.

In the afternoon an old fashioned love feast and testimony meeting was held in charge of Rev. Avery Donovan, of Fawn Grove, Pa., and Rev. George A. Morris, of Harrington, Del., former pastors, and there were many testimonials from those who

### Has Interesting History.

Few churches on the Maryland-Delaware peninsula have a more interesting history than has St. James. It is one of the oldest organizations on the Shore and so far as is known is the first Methodist Protestant Church on the Eastern Shore to pass the century mark. In the year 1835, on the fifth day of August, the property on which the church now stands was purchased for the purpose of religious worship by the Protestant Episcopal denomination, and was known as "Parson Handy's Church" in honor of its first and as far as is known, its only rector. Progress under the Protestant Episcopal denomination was slow on account of the proximity of the church to I. U. and other churches, and on June 21, 1832, it was decided to the Methodist Protestant denomination, for the sum of \$5 and Rev. W. C. Poole became its first pastor, beginning his ministry really in 1831.

Its first trustees were Francis Lamb, Emory Edwards, Joseph Knard, William Cooper, and David Arthur. Many of the descendants of

### DEPART. OF PUBLIC WORKS STATE OF MARYLAND STATE ROADS COMMISSION NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

Sealed proposals for building one section of State Highway, as follows: Kent County, Cont. K-29. One section of State Highway from end of Cont. K-26 to Crosby, a distance of 1.25 miles. (Concrete.) will be received by the State Roads Commission, at its offices, 601 Garrett Building, Baltimore, Maryland, until 12 M. on the 18th day of August, 1925, at which time and place they will be publicly opened and read.

Bids must be upon the blank proposal form which, with specifications and plans will be furnished by the Commission upon application and cash payment of \$100, as hereafter no charges will be permitted.

No bills will be received unless accompanied by a certified check for the sum of Five Hundred (\$500) Dollars, payable to the State Roads Commission.

The successful bidder will be required to give bond, and comply with the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, respecting contracts.

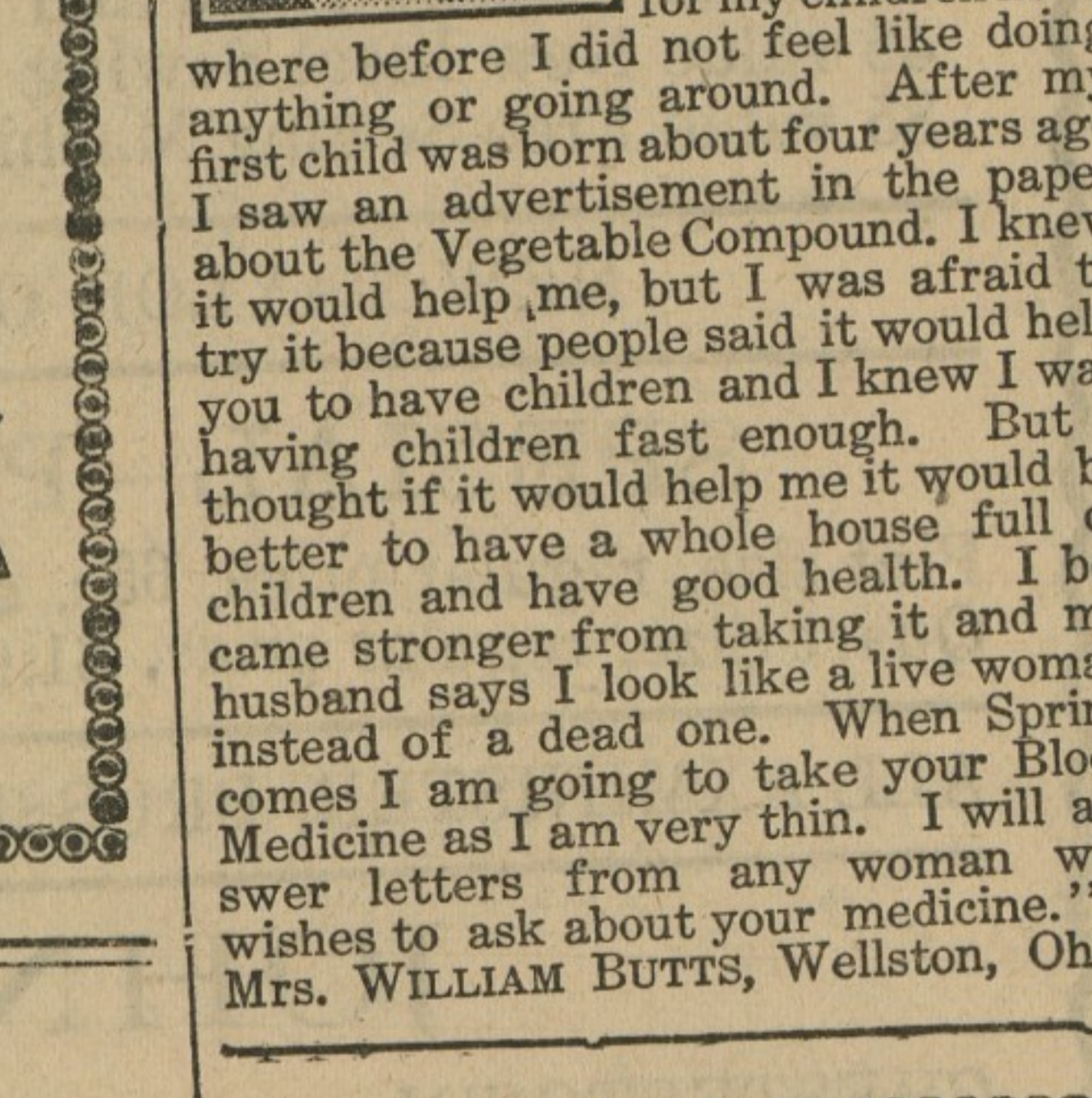

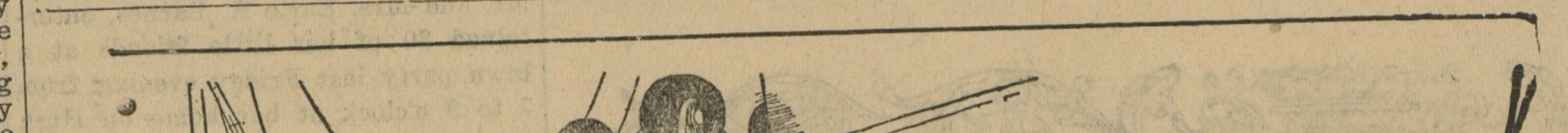

in the State at a cost of \$35,000, there already being a large and commodious parsonage located a short distance from the church. Today St. James has one of the largest and most influential constituencies in the Maryland Conference, numbering more than two hundred members; a Sunday school with a membership of 175 over which Robert G. Nicholson has presided for the past seventeen consecutive years, and a Christian Endeavor Society numbering 180, the largest in the State, with H. Stockton Startt as the president.

The official board of the church is Robert G. Nicholson, John P. Nicholson, J. Elwood Morris, Harry I. Parsons, H. Stockton Startt, Sewell J. Lee, Samuel Loller, Ralph Usilton, Mrs. Walter Taylor and Harry Rash. At the parsonage there were on display a number of old books, pictures, papers and other relics of olden days which brought vividly to mind the scenes of the childhood of many of the visitors and gave much valuable information concerning the early history of the church. Ralph Usilton, a descendant of one of the founders of the church, was chairman of the committee on the arrangements for the celebration. A basket luncheon was enjoyed.
