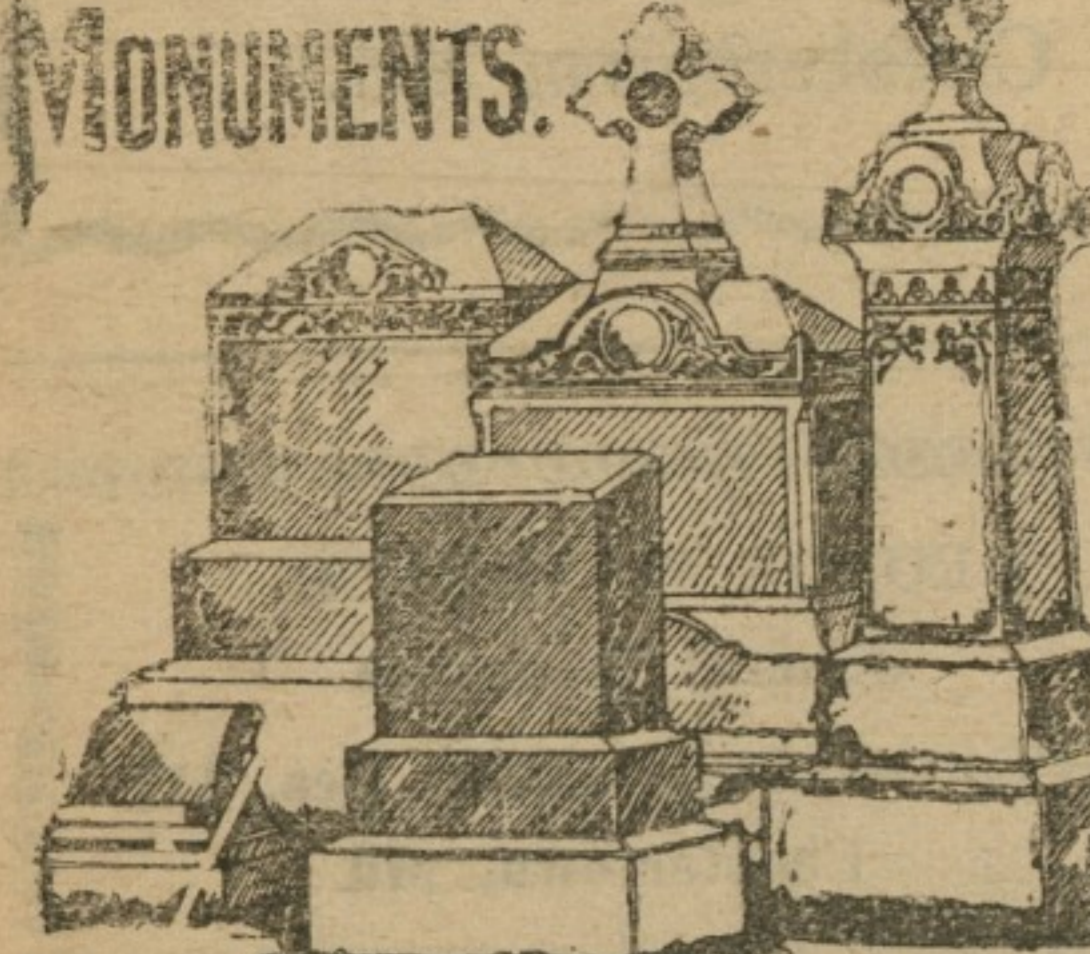

fast traveling but we need the rest after a strenuous visit in Athens and in anticipation of equally as strenuous activities in the Crescent City. What we have already done in the way of sight-seeing since we departed the Holy City would make a long story and what we shall do before we leave the land of the Turk remains to be seen. At present we are traveling on a French boat, in fact we are living on it, from Naples to Beirut, a twelve days' trip, stopping at Malta, Athens, Constantinople, Smyrna, Rhodes and Cyprus, leaving ourselves plenty of time for sight-seeing. Our boat accommodates 100 first class passengers; 30 of the second class, and stowage passengers without limit. We are all surprised at the immense cargo the ship is carrying. In fact, passenger traffic seems to be of secondary importance, although we are receiving the finest sort of treatment. Meals are served four times daily and this, as you may well imagine, is a highly important matter to us. We also enjoy the pleasures of a music room, a library and a lecture room, the last of which is just large enough to hold my party. Here we gather frequently for games and lectures.

Everything is decidedly French and we are trying to be apt students. By the time we arrive in Paris, a month hence, we shall be able successfully to conduct ourselves under the most complicated circumstances. Our stewards, as a rule, claim France as their native land but the more menial of the ship's crew come all the way from China; poor ignorant coolies who look upon the franc as a coin of large value. My bath man rejoices inwardly as I hand him a franc tip for a bath, although it means less than five cents to me.

By the way, we are too far away for authentic news but we are really anxious to learn the latest from China. The wireless, posted daily, says nothing and yet we have forebodings. If some of us were to follow our own personal inclinations we would take the famous Simplon Express tomorrow morning for Paris, forty-eight hours away and a jaunt of merely 1800 miles! But we are pilgrims traveling in the interest of education in order, upon our return home, that we may render a large service. And so we continue on our way, observing, comparing, dreaming and with frequent longings for loved ones in the homeland.

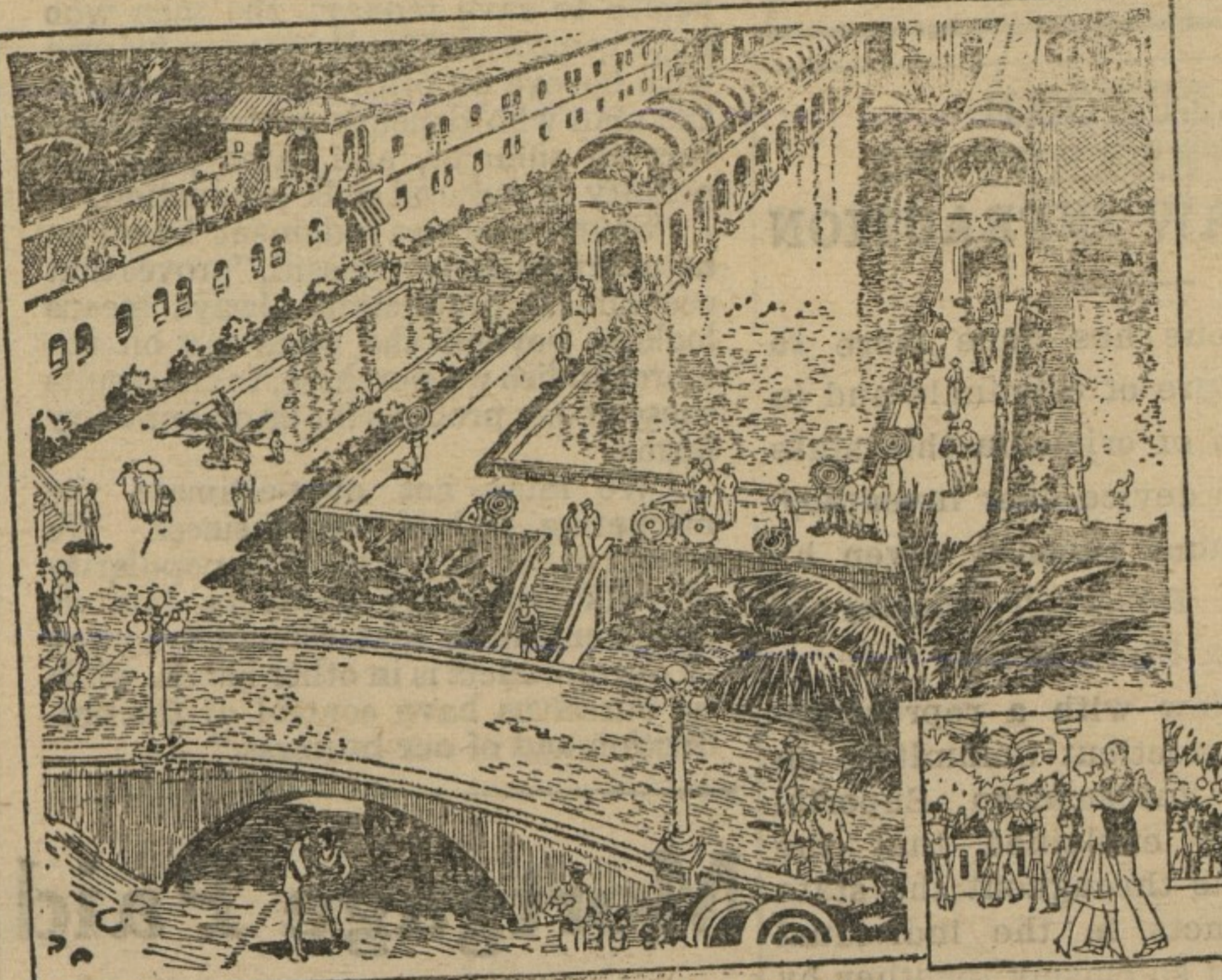
