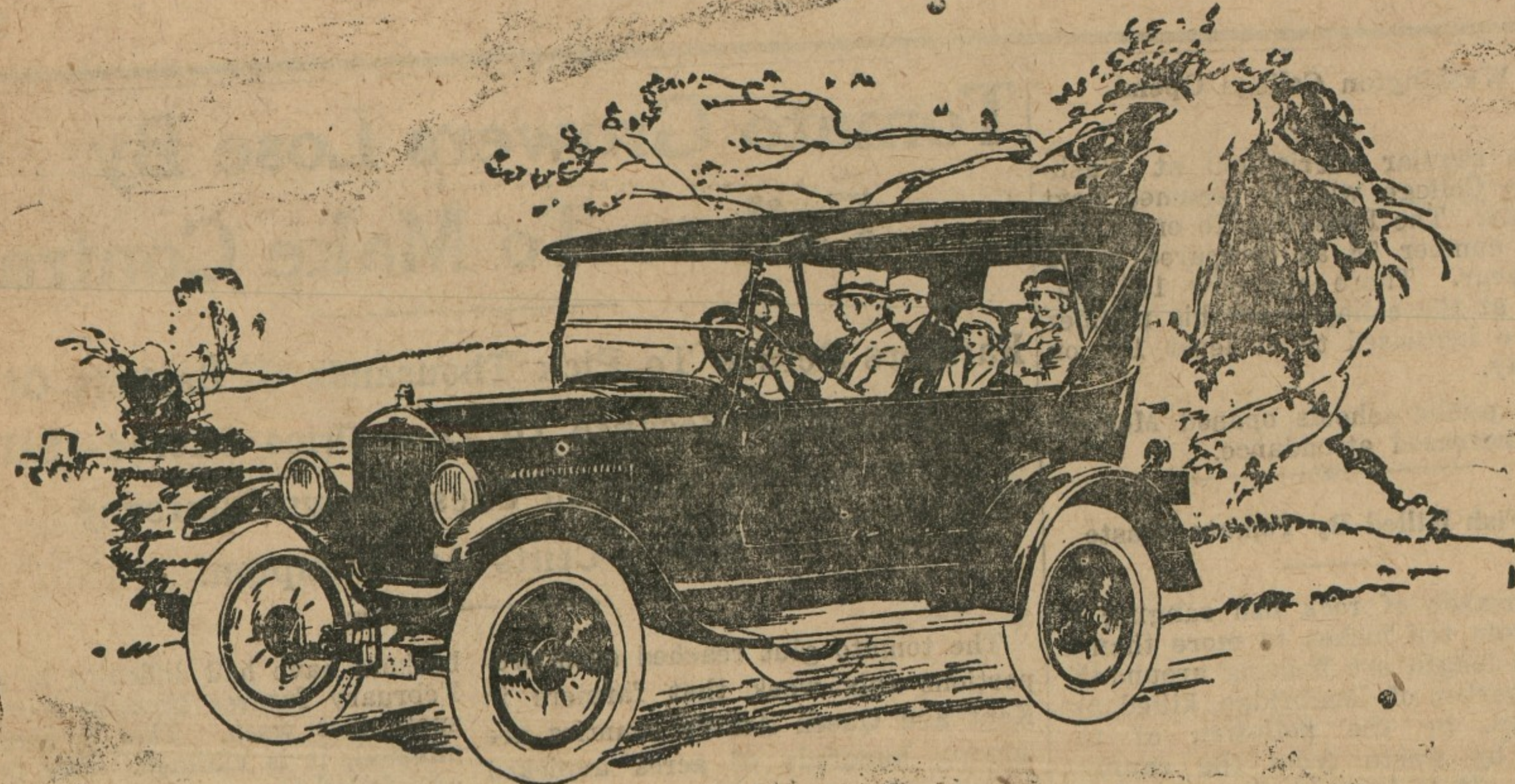

### STRANG ON JOB AT ROCK HALL
