## KENT BOYS WIN HIGH HONORS

Three counties, Montgomery, Harford and Kent, will each have an agricultural club boy on the team that will uphold Maryland's reputation as a State that knows good dairy cattle at the National Dairy Show at Indianapolis, Ind., October 10 to 17.

Ralph Walker, of Gaithersburg; Arthur P. Dunningan, of Pylesville; and Stanley B. Sutton, of Chestertown, have been announced as the winners in the State dairy cattle judging contest at the Timonium Fair last week and will be awarded the prize trip to Indianapolis where they will compete against teams from other states in the national junior dairy cattle judging contest.

While the high individual boys were selected from three different counties, Harford county made the best showing and will be awarded the silver cup offered for the highest scoring team. The Harford county team composed of Thomas Kelley, Breckenridge Heaps and Arthur P. Dunningan ran up a total of 3,440 points. Ralph Walker, Thaddeus Bussard and Grover Walker, representing Montgomery county, scored 2,920 points for second place; and Walter T. Morris, Stanley B. Sutton and Norman E. Pennington put Kent county third with 2,895 points.

In addition to the three boys selected to represent the State at the National Dairy Show because of their ability in judging the four principal breeds of dairy cattle, boys who made the best records in each breed were awarded money prizes as follows: Holsteins, Stanley B. Sutton, Kent county, first, \$20; Ralph Walker, of Montgomery county, second, \$15; Arthur M. Ahal, Frederick county, third, \$10; Burton Kephart, Carroll county, fourth, \$5.

Jerseys, Thomas Kelley, Harford county, first, \$20; Arthur P. Dunningan, Harford county, second, \$15; James H. Almony, Baltimore county, third, \$10; Norman E. Pennington, Kent county, fourth, \$5.

## DR. TWILLEY HAS NARROW ESCAPE

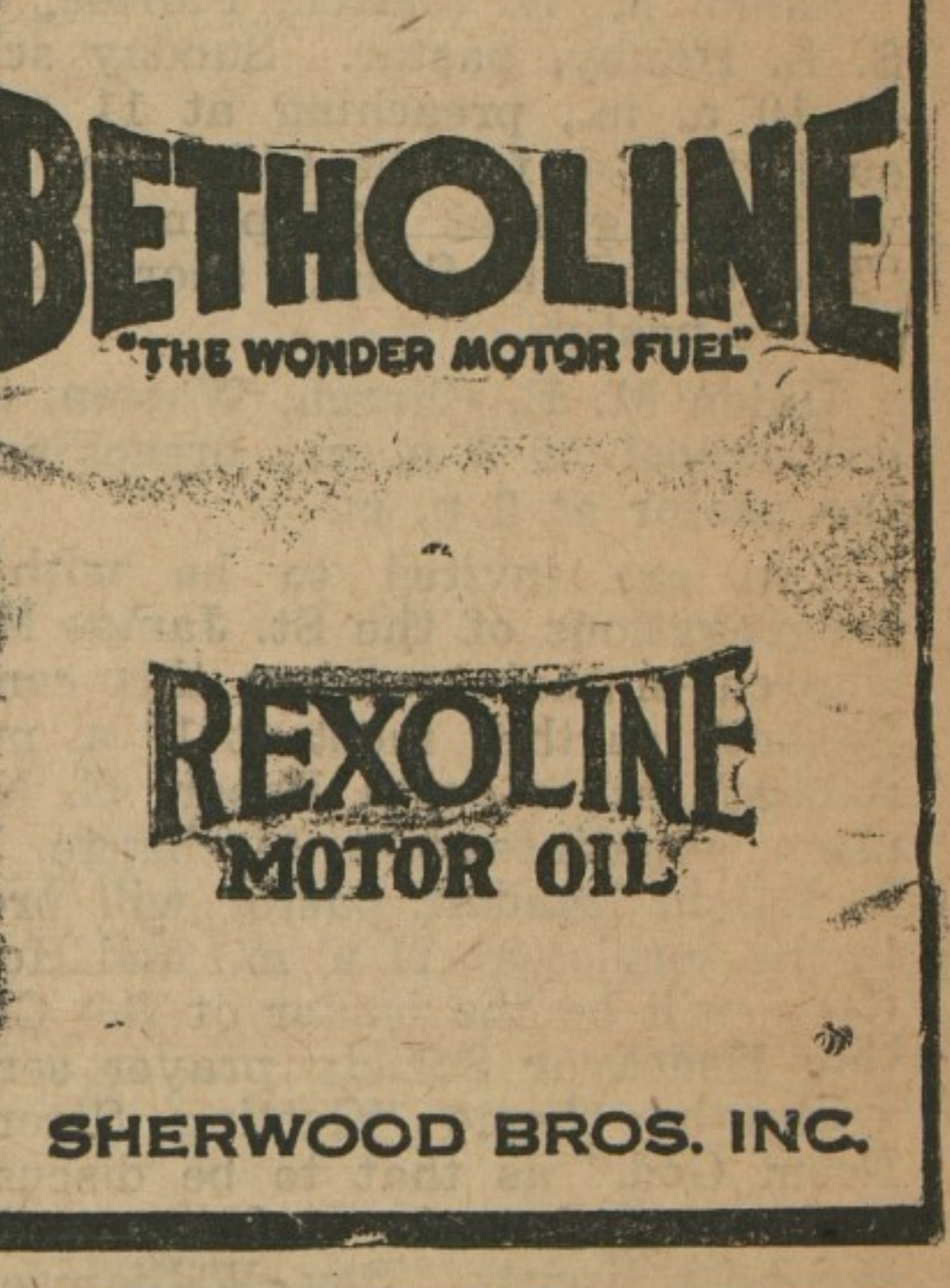
Dr. J. M.
