## America's Greatest Battle Is For The Soul Of Nation

Congressman Upshaw Speaks To A Big Chestertown Audience—Friends Of Law Enforcement Applaud Ringing Words—No Cringing, Half-Hearted, Two-Sided, Hypocritical Politician Has A Chance With The Lovers Of Temperance.

Hon. W. D. Upshaw, of Georgia, surrounded by pastors from seven churches and facing a splendid audience in the Chestertown M. E. Church, Wednesday evening, on "America's Greatest Battle."

Mr. Upshaw said in part, "America's greatest battle is not economic although the sanest and the soundest economics are bound up in its solution."

"America's greatest battle is not agricultural, although I usually vote in congress with the farm bloc which believes their problem to be the base of all bases in our national development."

"America's greatest battle is a fight for the soul of the nation; a battle for the vindication of the ideals of our national life; a battle to prove to our own children who are the 'Tomorrow of the Republic,' and to the nations that watch from across the seas that America is capable of enacting a great moral principle into law and not a farce."

Mr. Upshaw then recited the history of the passage of the resolution by which Congress submitted to the several state legislatures the eighteenth amendment and of its adoption by the states.

Mr. Upshaw continued his address by saying: "And then with the brightest men that liquor money could buy, an internationally known lawyer, who had twice been a member of the President's cabinet, went before the Supreme Court of the United States and there argued the unconstitutionality of the prohibition law; and at the end of his brilliant sophistry"

## DOGS INVADE KENT TURKEY FLOCKS

One of the greatest menaces to the raising of turkeys in Kent county in recent years is not black rot but dogs. Charles H. Crew, of Worton, had his flock torn to pieces last week by dogs.

John W. Biggers, of near Millington, lost 15 well grown turkeys Saturday last by dogs. He had previously lost 10 out of the flock by same cause. He succeeded in killing several of the dogs caught in the flock and last Saturday identified the dogs. He reported the same to the County Commissioners and it is hoped action will be taken.

When the owners of dogs are made liable for loss of sheep, turkeys and poultry and a few cases brought to justice maybe these losses will cease.

**Interesting Tomato  
Figures In County**  
Harry C. Willis, of near Millington, picked 8 tons of tomatoes per acre off ten acres and on 2.5 of an acre he gathered 7 tons. J. W. Biggers, a neighbor, from 6 acres got an average of 8 tons per acre and on 4 acres picked 10 tons per acre.

The New York Cannery at Betterton contracted for 600 acres and the growers averaged 5 1/2 tons. Arthur Brice sold the most tomatoes having the largest acreage, but Wm. Hepburn had the biggest yield—11 tons per acre.

George Townsend, of Quaker Neck, sold on the open market, most of them being early and his average was about 23 cents. His yield was good.

## KENT CIRCUIT COURT NOW IN SESSION!
