### HARMONY RULED P. E. CONVENTION

The General Convention of the Episcopal Church, which just closed in New Orleans, was not only the most largely attended in the history of the church, but was characterized by more complete harmony than has ever before existed.

"Controversial questions were avoided apparently by common consent. It was realized that the affairs of a rapidly changing world would not be settled by a convention dictum.

"The case of Bishop Brown, of Arkansas, was a very sad one. His deposition by the House of Bishops under the circumstances was inevitable.

"Important changes in the prayer book were effected, including revision of the marriage service, and a change from the present three forms of baptism to one uniform baptismal service. These changes will have to be ratified by the general convention three years hence before they become permanent.

"The convention voted for co-operation with all departments of the work of the Federal Council of Churches, but declined membership in the organization. This is a considerable advance in its former attitude toward the Federal Council."
