THE COAL SITUATION
There will be no anthracite coal in Kent this winter, unless miners begin work very soon, is the opinion of our coal dealers. Soft coal is still to be had and there is no immediate danger of there being a shortage of this type fuel. However, those hoping that they will be able to purchase pure anthracite, may as well banish their thoughts, as there is not a single mine in the country selling it today.

"Brickets," contrary to the belief of many, is not an anthracite coal. It is a combination formed by a mixture of anthracite and soft coal, the two being molded into a solid, by terrific pressure. It, however, makes a splendid fuel and Kent will undoubtedly have to be satisfied with it or soft coal during the coming winter months.

As far as the soft coal situation looks, Kent counties need have no fear of any dangerous shortage. Every indication at the present time leads dealers to think that the fuel will be available all winter. But, as far as pure regular anthracite goes—nothing doing.

Centreville Court Notes

Breaking all court records for the last quarter of a century, by bringing in a total of 50 presentments in the first four days of their term, the Grand Jury of the November term of the Circuit Court, with Charles A. Busted, as foreman, concluded their labors Monday.

In his charge to the jury, Judge Keating made the specific request that the Grand Inquest investigate these rumored infractions of the law:

That it was reported a colored man had been accidentally shot or murdered near Pondtown, and subsequently buried without even the formality of a Coroner's Inquest.

That there have been reports of violation of the law in respect to persons driving automobiles while under the influence of liquor, creating a distance hazard on county highways.

On Monday the Judges of the Circuit Court announced the appointment of Attorney Madison Brown, as special State's Attorney to work with State's Attorney Charles E. Tucker during the present court term. Both attorneys have been kept busy handling the tremendous volume of criminal business during the week. Tuesday a climax was reached in conditions by the resignations of State's Attorney Charles E. Tucker.

Wednesday the bench warrant issued by the Circuit Court for the arrest of Adlai Bryan, presented under 10 counts by the Grand Jury, for alleged fraud in dealing with the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, had not been served. Sheriff T. Frank Seward reported to have located the accused man.

The case of Record Manufacturing Co., of Harford county vs. E. Thos. Massey, of Massey, was tried Thursday before a jury. Verdict for Mr. Massey. This was a suit for \$1600 for carload of cotton seed meal. It was removed from several courts and finally tried in Centreville. John D. Urie and Edwin H. Brown, Esqs., represented Mr. Massey while the plaintiffs were represented by Shehan and Marshall, of Easton, S. A. Williams, of Bel Air, and J. H. C. Legg, of Centreville.

GUNNING SEASON HERE
