Washington College In Class A

Springing a surprise on fifty assembled members and guests of the Philadelphia Chapter of the Washington College alumni association, President Paul E. Titsworth announced at a recent meeting the elevation of the historic Eastern Shore institution to the grade of a Class A College. The meeting, which was held at six o'clock at the Meridian Club on Camac street, Philadelphia, has been called to hear an address by professor George William McClelland, Vice Provost of the University of Pennsylvania, on the subject "The Significance of a List of Accredited Colleges." The Philadelphia savant was the principal speaker. It was in connection with this leading topic of discussion that the Shore College head delighted graduates and friends of Washington with the statement that on Monday, November 16, the Commission on Institutions of Higher Education of which Professor McClelland is secretary, had placed the school on the accredited list. This action will be confirmed at a meeting in New York on November 27 of the Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools of the Middle States and Maryland.

The meeting on Friday, November 20, was opened by Rev. Arthur Walls, of Ardmore, who pronounced the blessing. Superintendent of Schools of Delaware, H. V. Holloway, then spoke on "The Accredited College from the Professional Viewpoint." The Delaware school official, who is a frequent visitor at the Chestertown institution, was followed by Loran Langsdale, of the Maryland Advertising Company, Baltimore, who brought greetings from the Baltimore Chapter of the Alumni Association. Among other speakers were Superintendent Norman Cameron of the Pottstown, Pa., public schools and Ernest Howard, of Wilmington, who extended the good wishes of the Wilmington Chapter. Among other prominent guests at the dinner were John I. Coulter, Dr. Ward Brinton, Mr. and Mrs. C. C. Brown, Norman Perkins, J. S. E. Pardee and Dr. Mary C. Burchinal.


