Interstate Milk Producers Meet In Philadelphia

Philadelphia's milk supply has fallen behind the growing demand for that dairy product during 1925, and dealers are faced with the problem of extending their already broad zone of sources throughout what is known as the Philadelphia milk shed.

This fact was pointed out in an address by H. D. Allebach, president of the Interstate Milk Producers' Association, Monday, at the ninth annual meeting of the National Co-operative Milk Producers' Federation in the Benjamin Franklin Hotel, Philadelphia.

At an election held during the afternoon session of the following directors were re-elected for the ensuing year: E. Nelson James, Cecil county; J. W. Keith, Queen Anne's county; H. I. Lauver, Juniata county, Pa.; E. R. Pennington, Kent county; H. B. Stewart, Huntingdon county, Pa.; S. U. Troutman, Bedford county, Pa.; and A. B. Waddington, Salem county, N. J.

Following the election of the directors of the Interstate Milk Producers' Association an organization meeting was held at which were elected the following members of the executive committee: H. D. Allebach, Montgomery county, Pa., president; Frederick Shangle, of Mercer county, N. J., vice president; Robert F. Brinton, Chester county, Pa., treasurer, and R. W. Balderson, Delaware county, Pa., secretary. H. D. Allebach was named chairman of the committee.

With a menu, the principal items of which were products of the dairy, and the predominating beverage milk, more than 600 delegates and their guests attended the annual banquet of the association at the Benjamin Franklin Hotel. Following the banquet, F. P. Willis, secretary of the Department of Agriculture of Pennsylvania, took command of the situation and presided over the list of speakers that had been assembled for the evening.

GAME WARDEN ARRESTED

District Deputy Game Warden John Anderson, of Cecilton, upon stopping in Elkton for a short time after returning from the Susquehanna "Flats," famous ducking grounds at the mouth of the Susquehanna river, where he caused the arrest of several persons for alleged violation of the ducking laws of Maryland, was arrested on a warrant sworn out by a North East man.

Anderson is charged with operating an automobile while he was under the influence of liquor. Anderson was taken before Magistrate G. W. Owens, of North East, where he denied the allegations and insisted upon a court trial, but this was denied him and a fine of \$250 was imposed. An appeal was taken at once and bond furnished.

Anderson alleges that his arrest was the outgrowth of his activities in causing arrest of alleged violators of the ducking laws governing the flats.

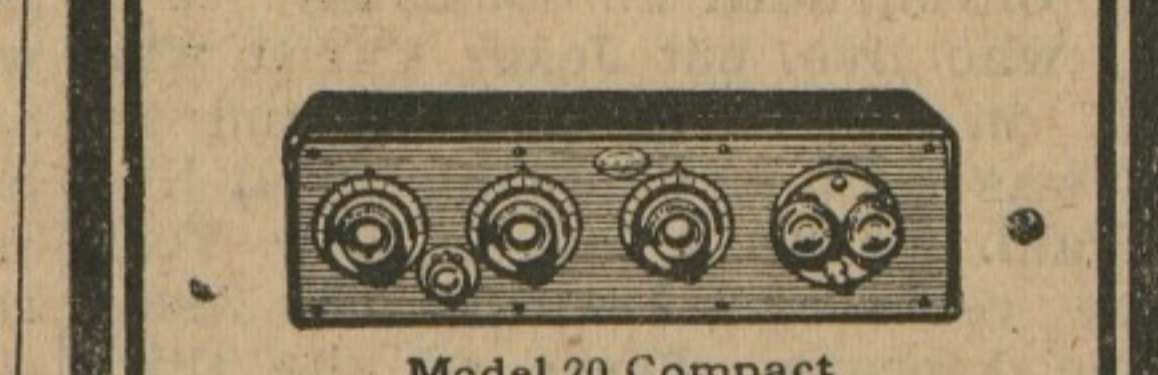

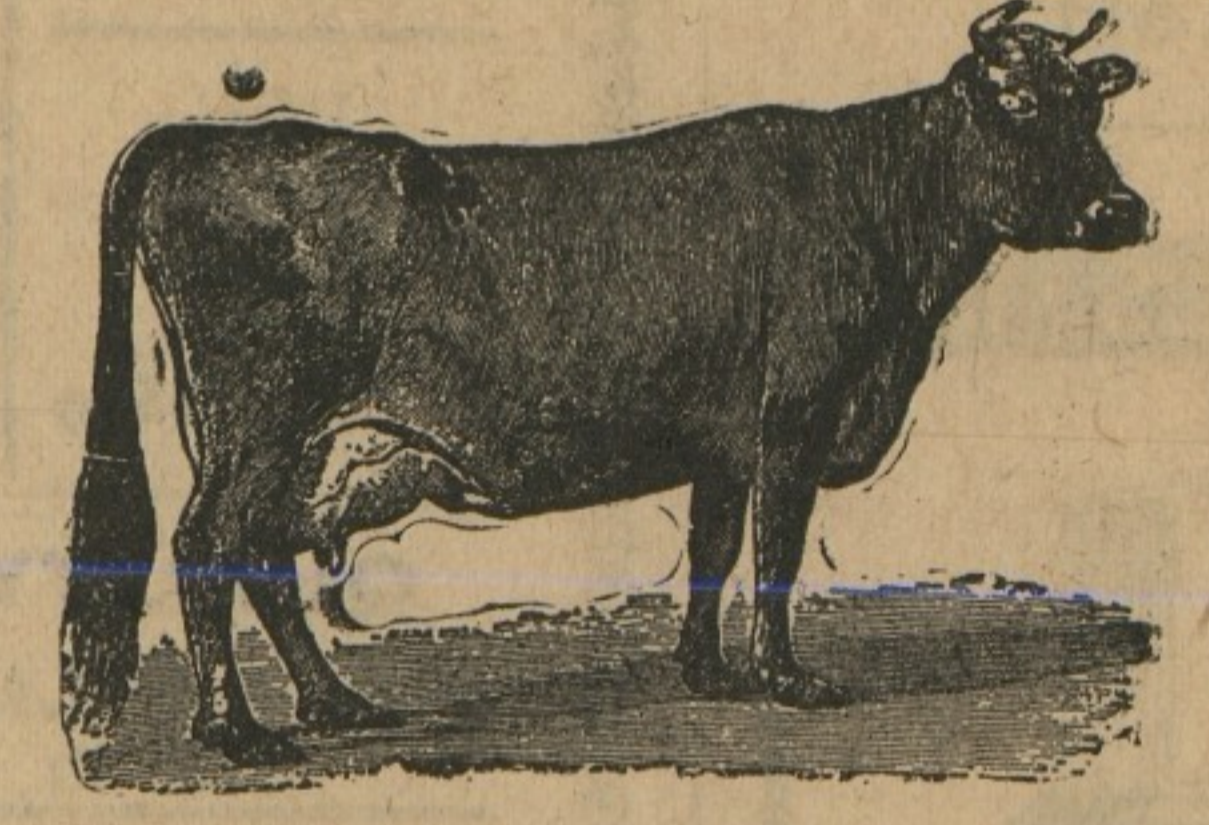
