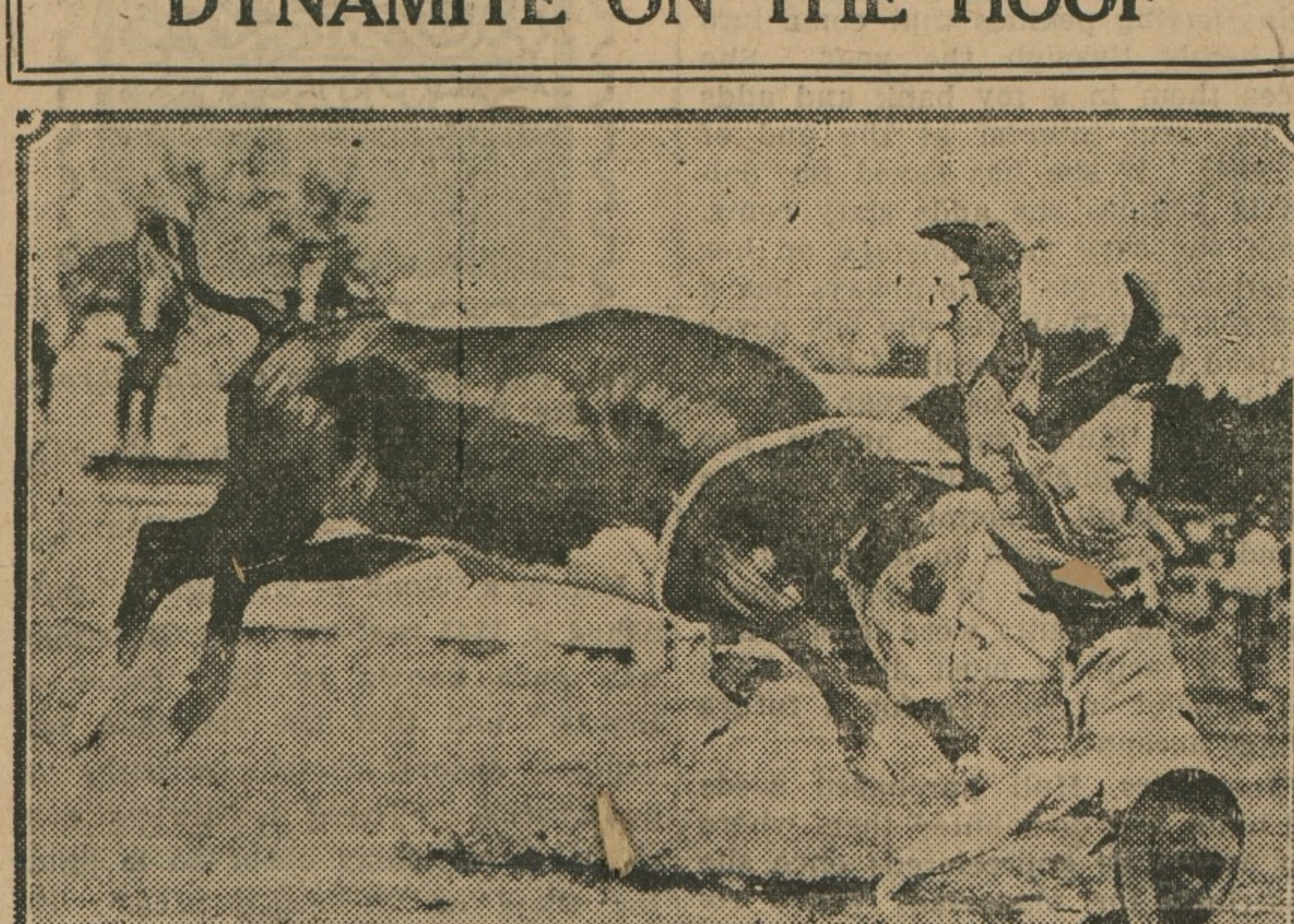

DYNAMITE ON THE HOOF



Riding a wild steer is anything but a "pink test" sport and if you don't believe it, ask any of the many cowboys who will try to stay on these chunks of living dynamite during the Chicago Roundup and World's Championship Rodeo, beginning August 15. The Brahma steer, a cross between the Mexican longhorn and the Brahma, or sacred cattle of India, is a fighter from the word "go," according to the boys who have tackled them, and after throwing a rider they'll frequently try to maul him up.

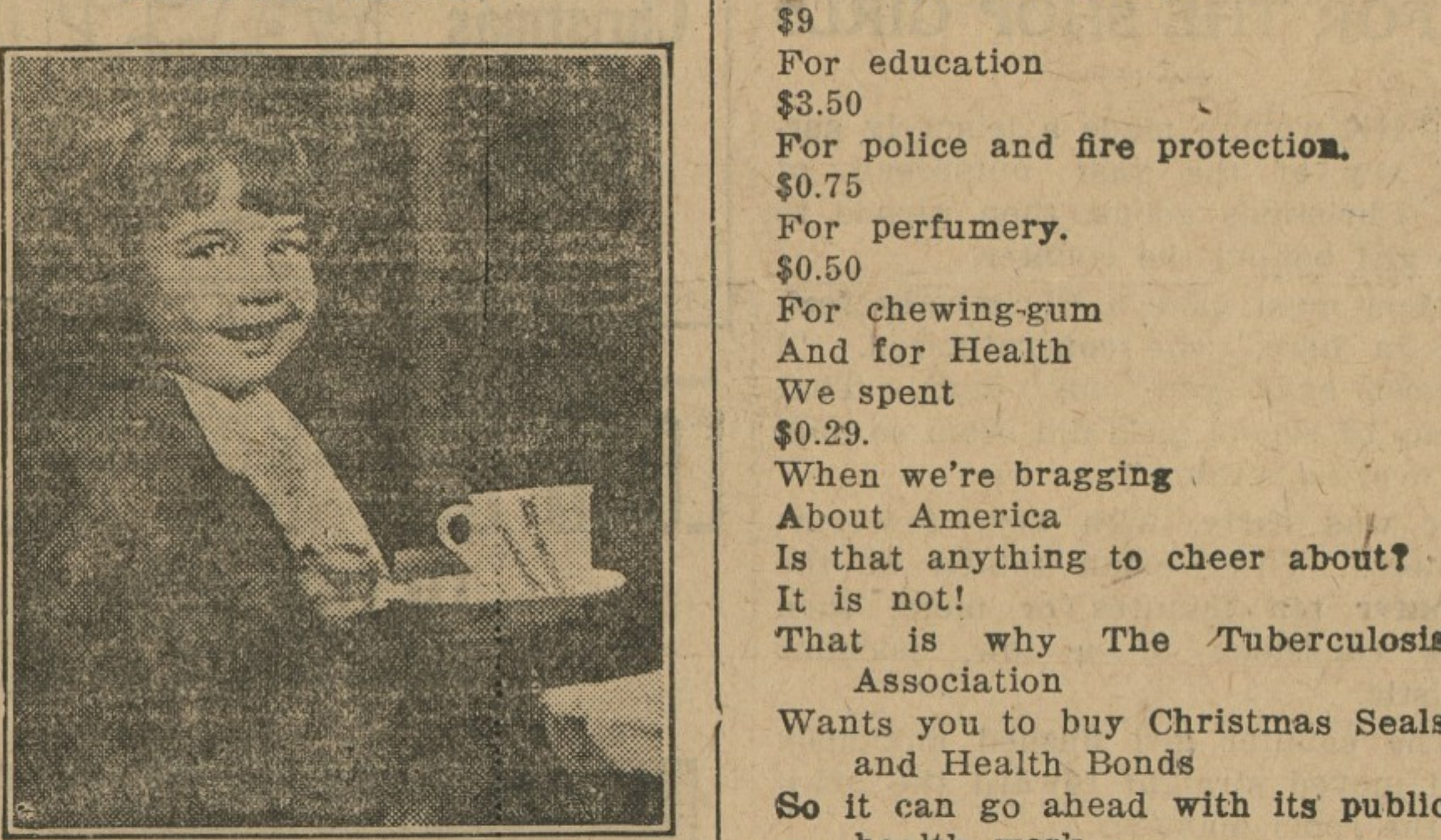
Steer riding, calling for an excess of skill and daring, is one of the features of the Chicago Roundup, which will be held under the auspices of the Chicago Association of Commerce for nine days. The competitions are under the direction of Tex Austin, who has managed the largest and most successful of rodeos. More than \$30,000 in cash prizes will go to the winners of the events, together with the world's championship titles.

Rollin Kirby

Rollin Kirby, who drew the cartoon for the Christmas Seal sale, shown on this page, has twice won the Pulitzer prize of \$500 awarded annually for the best cartoon of the year. In 1924 he won it with "News From the Outer World," and in 1921 with "On the Road to Moscow."

His experience has been a varied one. Born in Galva, Ill., he went to New York as soon as he could get there and began selling his drawings to Colliers' Magazine, McClure's, Life, American and Harpers. For the past thirteen years he has been cartoonist on the New York World, going to that paper from a similar position with the Mail and Sun.

THE WHY OF SUPERSTITIONS

ACORNS AND LOVE

IT MAY surprise many people to know that in current superstitions there survive not only remnants of tree-worship, nature-worship, sun-worship, moon-worship, etc., which have been changed by the ages into formalisms the origin and meaning of which those who use them are entirely ignorant, but that also there still remain open and direct appeals to the heathen gods who are invoked directly by name. Of this latter sort is superstition which is circulated largely throughout the country in nearly all those little paper-covered books dealing with dreams and charms which are so extensively consulted by the uneducated and, it must be owned, not infrequently "an the sly" by persons of intelligence and education. The superstition in question is a rite for discovering a young woman's future husband. An odd number of girls not exceeding nine assemble and each strings on a chord as many acorns as there are girls present. Then each girl places her string of acorns in the fire and watches it burn in silence. When the acorns are consumed each girl retires to her bed, saying as she gets between the sheets:

May love and marriage be the theme To visit me in this night's dream; Gentle Venus be my friend, The image of my lover send.

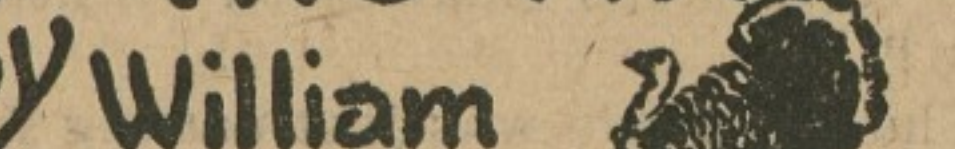
Then the young man whom she is destined to marry will appear to her in a dream. The use of the acorns is, of course, a remnant of tree-worship; an appeal to the oak, that great and popular tree god of our ancestors. They are offered to him, consumed by fire upon an altar. The acorn has another ancient significance which cannot be gone into here which makes it an appropriate offering in such cases. So far the charm is a mere survival whose significance is entirely unsuspected by the practitioners of the rite. But then comes the direct appeal by name to Venus, the goddess of love of the old Roman mythology, word for word such an inquisitive maidens might have used it in the days when Aeneas "brought into Latium his gods."

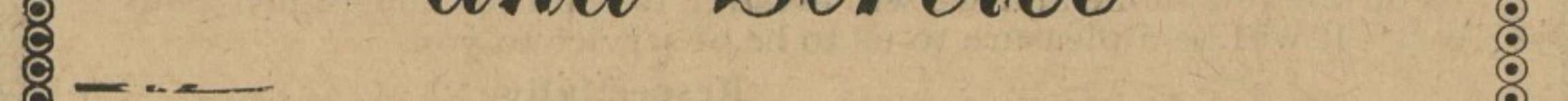

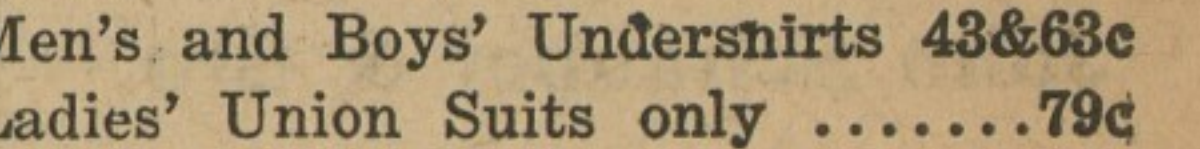
