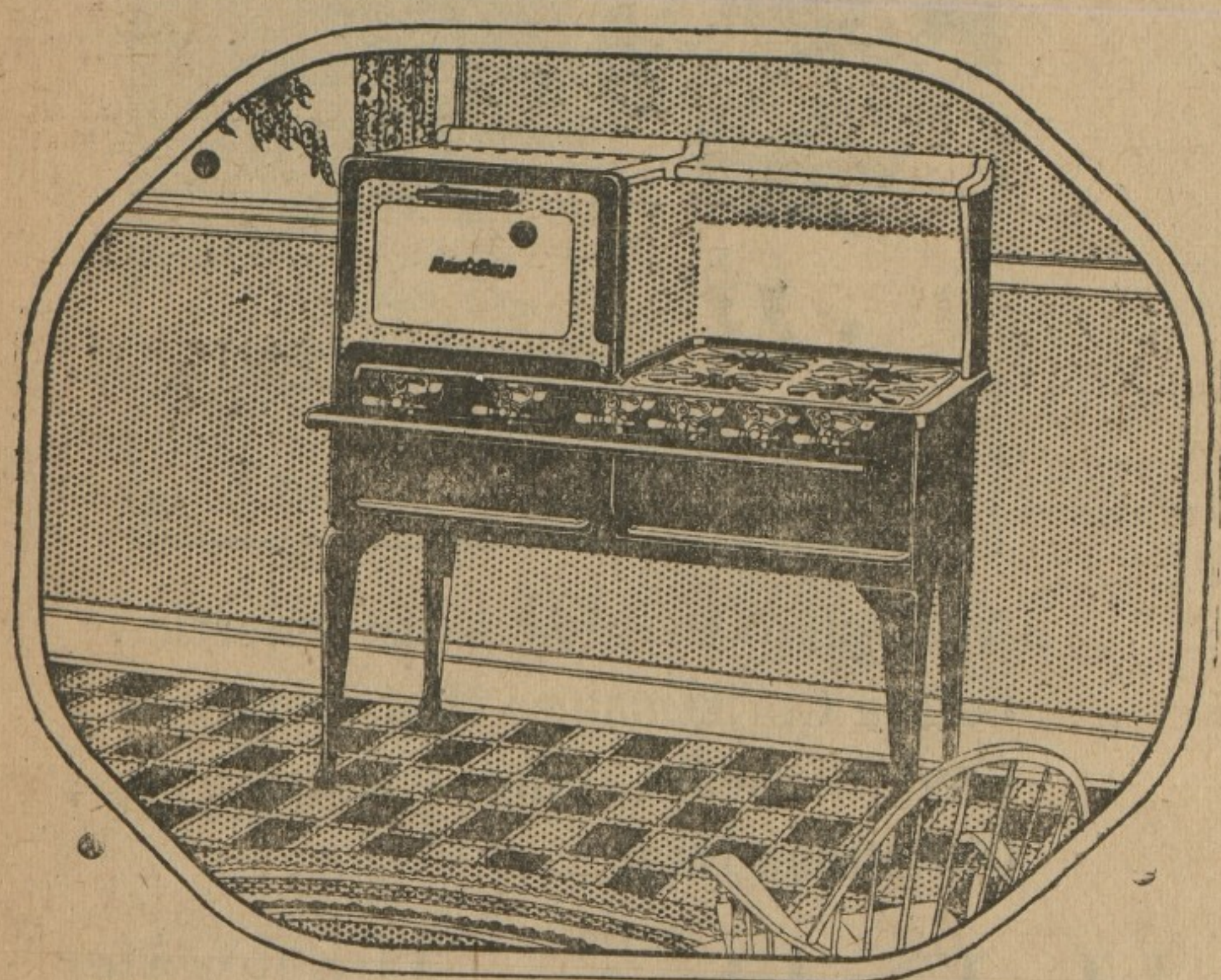

AUTHORITY TO LICENSE AUTOS TO BE ASKED

Legislation to give Maryland municipalities authority to license automobiles may be sought by Chestertown and other towns at the next session of the General Assembly.

Efforts to impose a tax upon automobile owners have utterly failed to accomplish that purpose, and a system of licensing motor cars appears to be the only solution open if revenue is to be derived from this source.

Towns are prohibited by the State from licensing automobiles. It has been found the method of taxation for automobiles in Chestertown almost impossible and very unfair.

"Efforts to exact revenue in this manner has been a deplorable failure. Our assessors function only at appointed intervals, and from time one assessment is made until the next report many automobile owners have traded, sold or purchased new property. The records are necessarily confusing and a large loss of revenue results.

By means of licensing, every car owner in the city would be compelled to display a small marker and there could be no evasion of the law. Other towns have found it to be an effective and profitable venture. In Salisbury a committee has been appointed to report.

This would include virtually all classes of insurance agents, manufacturers' representatives, saloons, restaurants and "fly-by-night" concerns.

The only classes now licensed by the towns are theatres, pool rooms, hucksters and house-to-house canvassers. Milk dealers and distributors are compelled to secure licenses, but no fee is charged.
