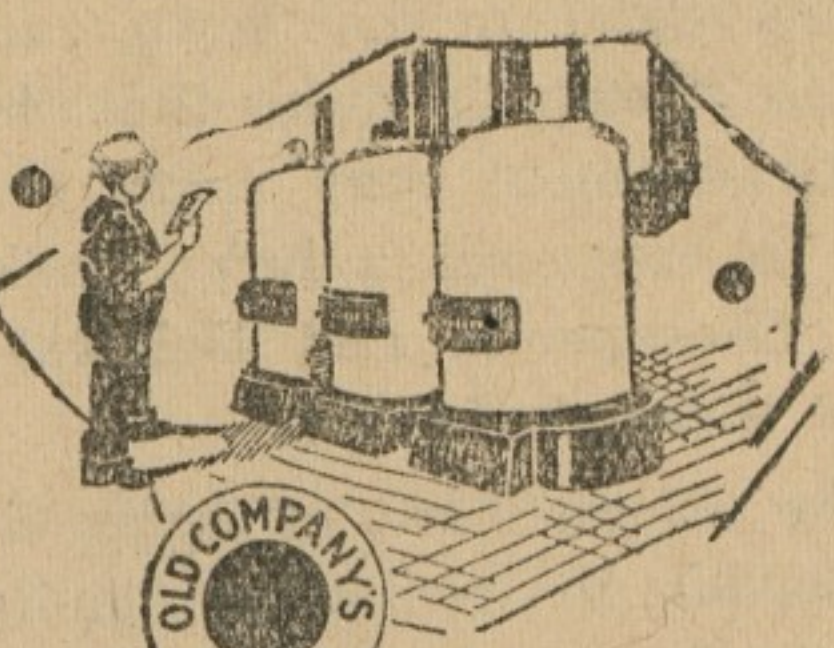
An order for shrubs and flowering bushes has been given, for the further beautifying of the grounds, and the "Playground Committee was authorized to spend more money in playground equipment.

NUTRITION AS A PART OF THE SCHOOL CURRICULUM

Before a boy can learn to read, he must have eyes. Before he can learn to write, he must have hands. Before he can learn to think he must have an active brain. Before he can learn that he has a definite responsibility towards life, he must have red blood in his veins. It would seem then that the first thing a boy needs in school is the body for of course, no body—no boy.

The physical condition of children is an important factor in their being able to get along at school, and the food one eats and the food that the parent has eaten before one's birth, is the greatest contributing cause of physical deterioration. Nutrition, as a subject, should be a regular part of every school curriculum, because the study of it is a permanent value to the lives of children.

Nutrition need not be taught only as a separate subject, it may be correlated with others. Every school child at some time learns to measure. Why not learn to measure himself, weigh himself as well as weighing rocks or measuring tables?

Children learn to determine the number of pints in a gallon, bushels to a barrel. They cannot see what a bushel really is; they know it only as a unit measure. Why should they not learn about calories and learn to figure their own food needs?

Our fathers commenting on the many things that children have in school today as compared to their own day, say: "But when did children learn to read and multiply?" Can children not learn to read as well when reading about what to eat or how to live as fathers did when they read about "Seeing the cat?"

Can they not learn subtraction by using one number representing what they ought to weigh and another representing what they do weigh, thus finding out about how many pounds they are underweight or overweight? In composition can they not write about health as well as about bridges? Vitalizing the curriculum—that is what nutrition study is doing to our schools. Statistics, experiments, experience proves that it pays.

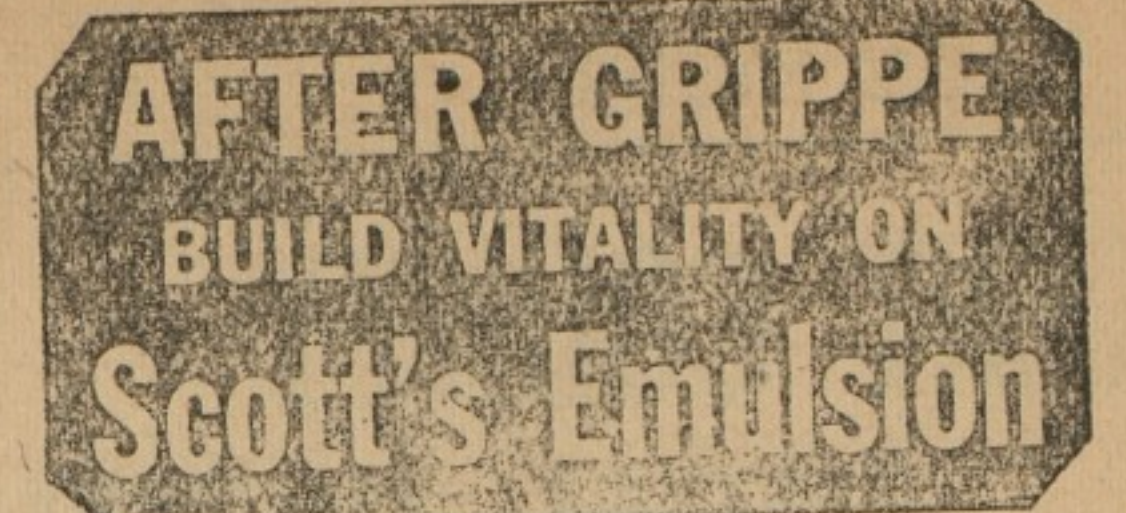

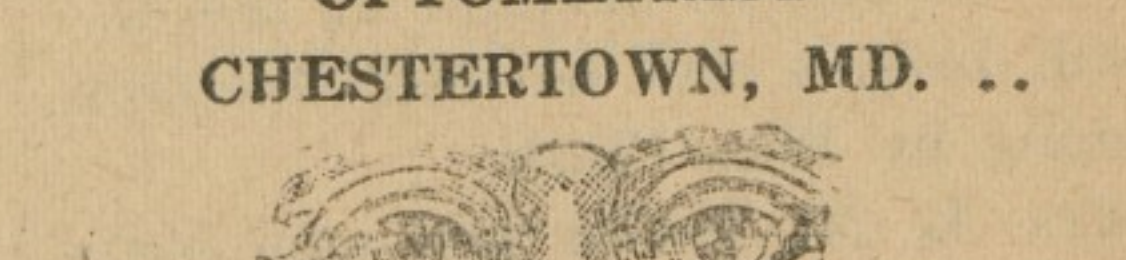

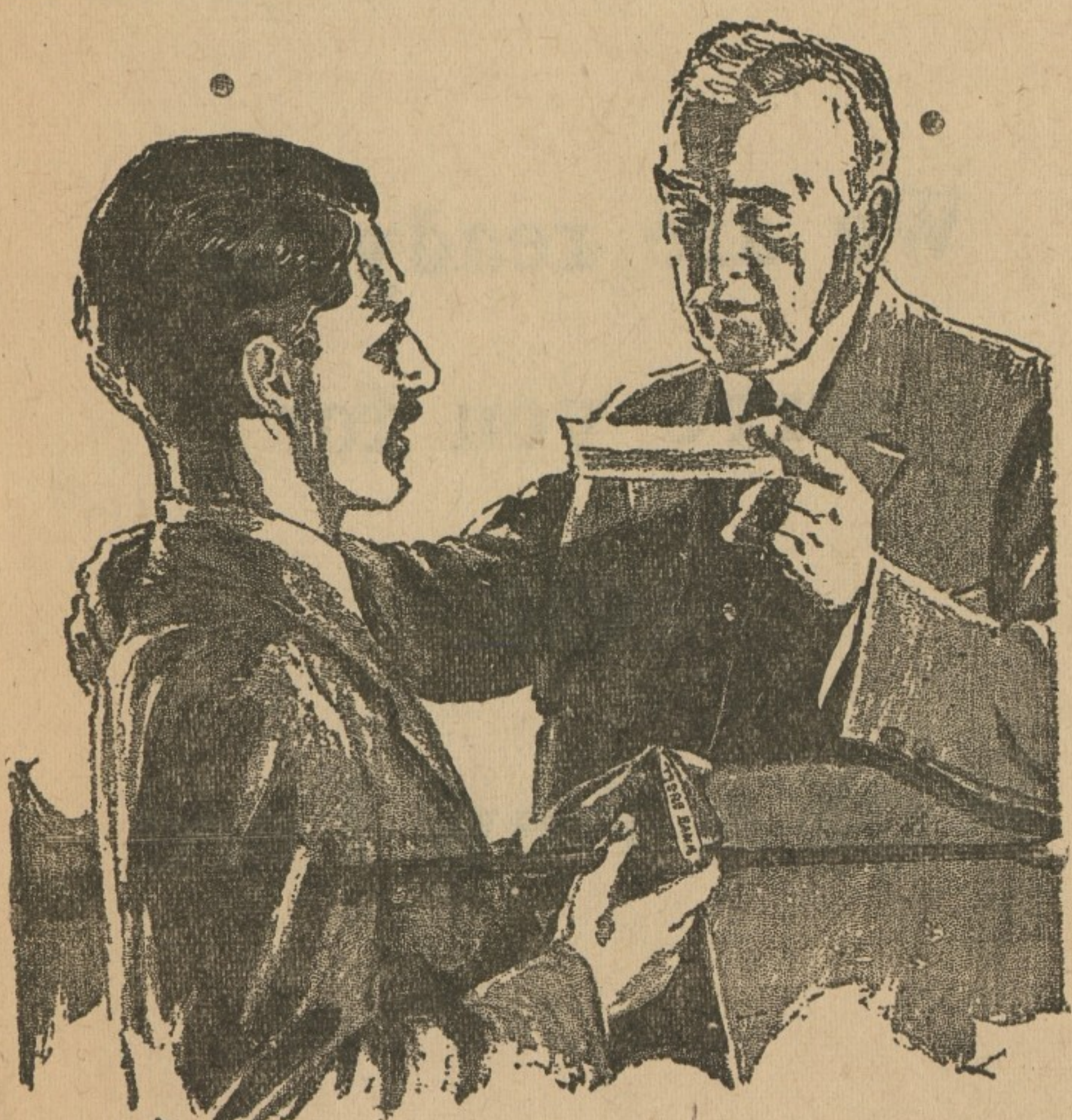
