THE STATE ROADS BOARD

Events have followed fast in the effort to straighten out the State Roads Commission tangle. All three of the members together with Engineer Mackall have resigned.

GETS ROAD CONTRACT

Almost a half million dollars will be spent by Delaware for the construction of two Delaware bridges and one road, according to bids opened by the State Highway Commission Tuesday.

The bids were made on the three separate operations and the total cost of all as determined by the lowest estimates in each instance is \$459,369.60.

An exceptionally large number of firms, 51 in all, submitted bids on construction of the 7.66 miles stretch of road parallel to the duPont Highway from St. Georges to State Road.

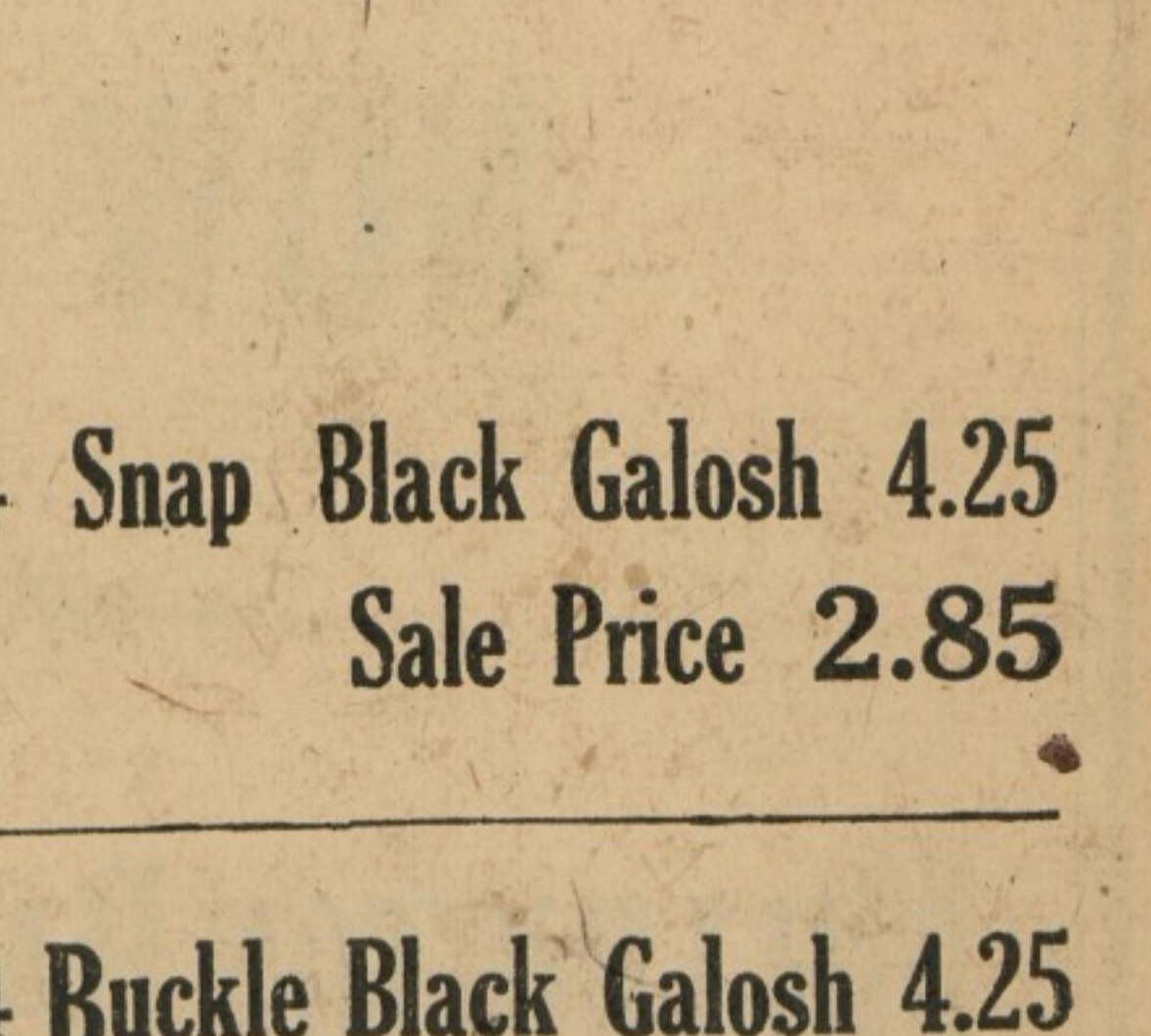
