

RIGHT OF WAY FOR FIRE ENGINES

A measure, the passage of which would give to police, ambulances and fire apparatus at all times the right

of way over all the State highways and county roads and over private rights of way when responding to calls for aid, has been introduced in the State Senate at Annapolis. Senator Lansdale G. Sasser, of Prince George's county, was sponsor

of the bill. It was referred to the Roads and Highways Committee. The measure, Senator Sasser said, is similar to an ordinance now in effect in Baltimore. A similar bill was introduced in the 1927 session of the Legislature, but was killed.

MAKE THE HIGHWAYS SAFE FOR THE PUBLIC

In an address in Dover last week Delaware's new chief executive, Governor Buck, touched on a vital subject when he branded the drunken man at the wheel of an automobile as a potential murderer, and demanded a greater degree of safety on public highways from the dangers of drunken drivers. An automobile operated by a drunken driver is an instrument of destruction just as dangerous as a dozen sticks of dynamite in the arms of an irresponsible child. Injury and death lurk in its wake, and its hazard is steadily increasing with the growth of motor vehicle traffic. Public travel on the highways of our State should be protected by laws making it a felony punishable prison sentence, for a person to menace the lives and property of others by operating a motor car while under the influence of liquor.

HOME NEAR POND TOWN WAS BURNED

A small dwelling house, occupied by John Ashley, colored, near Pondtown, in the upper part of Queen Anne's County, was totally destroyed by fire Tuesday morning about seven o'clock. The fire spread so rapidly that it was impossible for members of the family to save any of their effects.

New York Doctor Receives French Call

Theatrical Magnate, Ill, Telephones Personal Physician To Come At Once



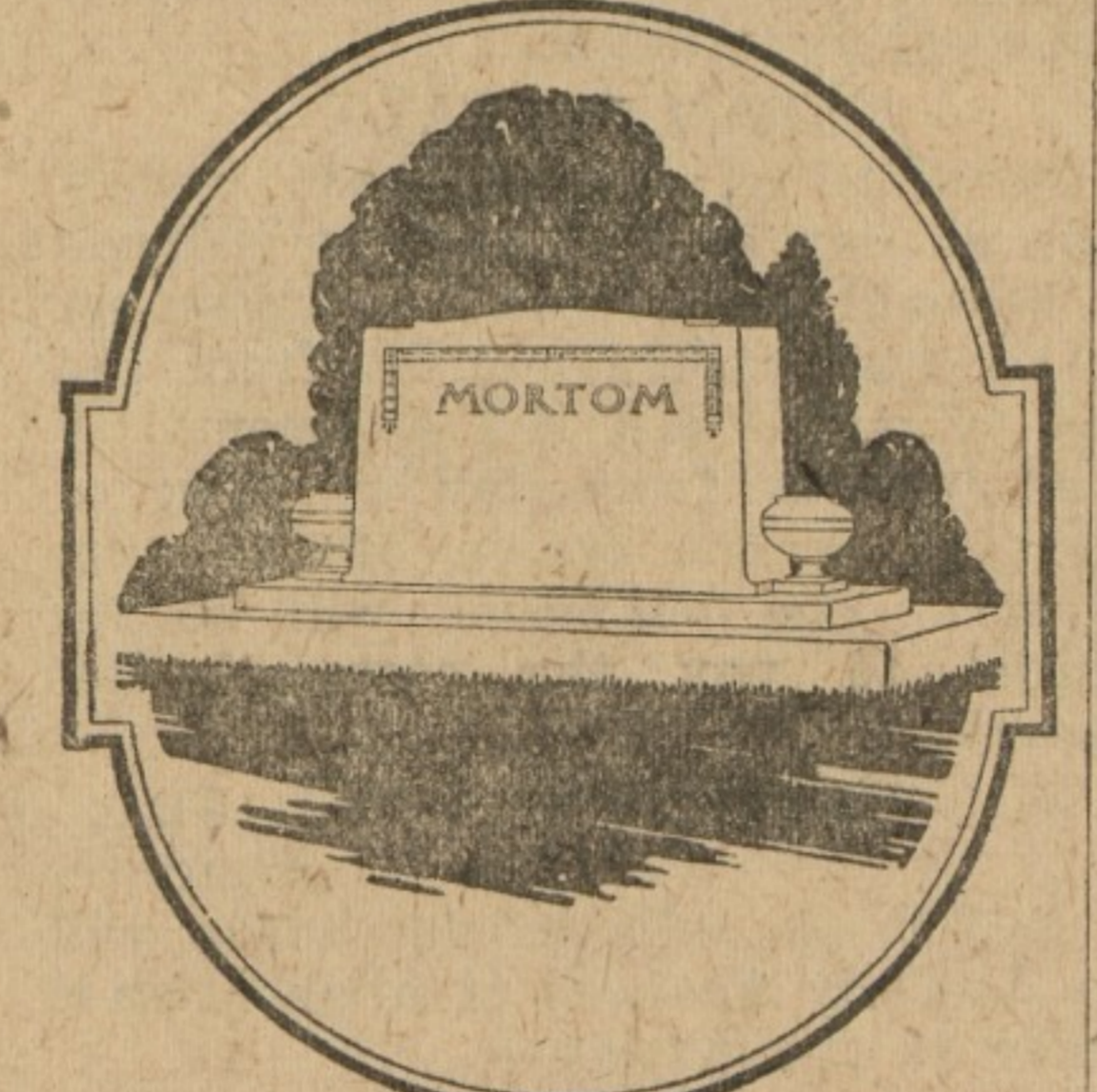
Operator passing European call from New York transatlantic office.

Telephoning for a doctor is not new. But probably the longest telephone call ever made for a doctor was that which came a short time ago to Dr. Richard Hoffman, of New York, from Harry H. Frazee, Broadway theatrical producer and former owner of the Boston American League baseball team. Mr. Frazee, gravely ill in France, telephoned to America by the transatlantic radio telephone service for his son and his personal physician to come to him at once. They were on a steamer leaving New York the next day for a French port.

Transatlantic telephone calls, according to officials of the Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company, may now be made to all points in England, Scotland, Wales, Belgium, Holland, Germany, Denmark, France, Spain and Switzerland, and to the principal cities in Norway, Sweden, Austria and Hungary, and to the Free City of Danzig.

QUALITY AT LOW COST

Safe Expert Opens Door By Telephone

Though 50 Miles Away Man Directs Movement of Tumblers Over Wire

There may be nothing new under the sun, but a young woman employed in an office in a western state certainly used the telephone to a good advantage when she lost the combination to the office safe. Remembering that there was a safe expert in a town about 50 miles away she placed a telephone call asking him to come to her assistance.

The expert, remembering the slogan "Don't travel-talk" instructed the girl to place the telephone transmitter next to the safe door and turn the dial. He then directed her by the sound of the tumblers how to operate the dial. By following his instructions the young woman was able to open the safe door. The entire time consumed in the transaction, including the placing of the long distance call, was less than five minutes.


TELEPHONE BRIEFS

That people are finding new uses for the telephone is very evident. During 1928 there was a daily average of 76,000,000 telephone calls in the United States, which was an increase of 3,500,000 over the average day for 1927. Of course, the number of telephones increased greatly, but the use of the telephone increased even more rapidly.

The United States is not only the most outstanding country in the world, but it has the most efficient and the best developed telephone system. Last year 1500 miles of telephone cable were added to the long distance plant, which was by far the largest amount ever placed in a single year. There are now more than 67,000,000 miles of telephone wire in this country of which less than 8 per cent is open wire.

During 1928 a contract was made between the American Telephone and Telegraph Company and the Western Union Telegraph Company and the Postal Telegraph Company whereby the many developments of the Bell Telephone System research experts were made available to the telegraph companies. The majority of these developments have to do with increasing the message sending capacity of a given group of circuits and in eliminating duplicate pole lines by the joint use of facilities.

Advances in the art of communication carried on during 1928 by the Bell Telephone Laboratories, the research and development branch of the Bell Telephone System, resulted in the development of a deep-sea, long distance cable by the use of which the spoken word may be transmitted across the Atlantic. The Laboratories also developed a new set of magnetic alloys called "perminvar," which are found to be very valuable for use in the continuous loading of telephone circuits and which bring about improved transmission.
