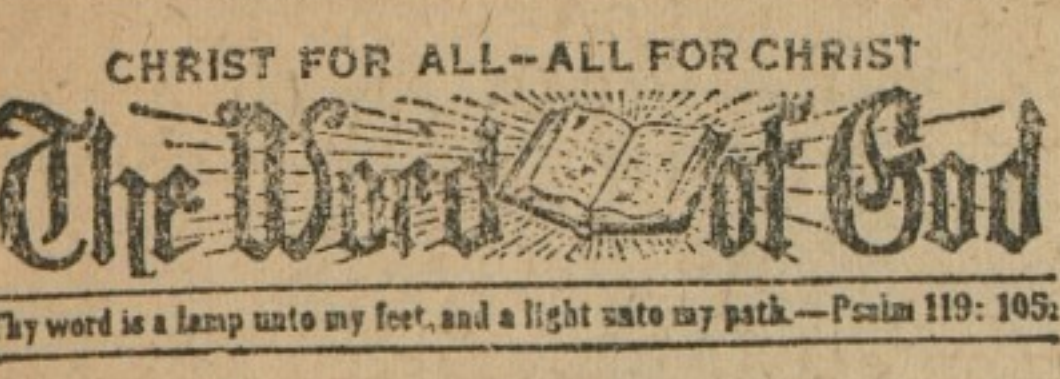


### CHURCH NOTES AROUND KENT
