HOG CHOLERA GAINS VICTIMS

On the premises where hog cholera was reported to exist during the month there were 614 hogs when the disease appeared. One hundred three of these were dead and 127 visibly sick before the outbreaks were reported. Two hundred sixty-eight of the animals were in garbage feeding plants.

The disease was reported to exist on 23 premises against 15 a year ago and a 10 year average of 20 for the same period. Eight were classed as backyard outbreaks, while 15 occurred on farms where hogs are bred and raised. Twenty-one were classed as primary or new outbreaks, while two were secondary infections or spread of the disease from nearby premises. Five were in garbage feeding plants of various proportions.

For the first time in many moons Kent county stepped into first place with four outbreaks registered. Baltimore, Montgomery, Prince George's and Washington counties ran neck and neck for second place with three outbreaks each. Howard was in third

place with two cases of the disease, while Anne Arundel, Caroline, Carroll, Frederick and St. Mary's got in the line light with one outbreak each.

Nineteen of the 21 primary outbreaks were apparently due to the feeding of infected pork in garbage, table scraps, kitchen swill, etc. One was the result of the purpose of infected hogs and one the result of a departing tenant leaving his hogs in the new owner to confine his hogs in. One of the secondary outbreaks was due to permitting hogs to run at large and one to the movement of an animal from infected premises.

A certain party was so impressed with the value of garbage as a hog feed that he was induced to pay \$150 per barrel of approximately 200 pounds of the precious stuff. Had the garbage been of the best quality a barrel of it would have made approximately 5 pounds of pork. In other words it was costing the owner approximately thirty cents to make a pound, live weight, of pork. However, his hogs now are all sick with cholera and the owner insists that garbage is neither a proper or profitable feed.

AL SMITH GETS LIFE ANNUITY OF \$6,000

Former Governor Alfred E. Smith received Friday from the State Controller a certificate of membership in the Employees' Retirement Service. This entitles him to an annuity of \$6,100.51 for life, or \$508.38 a month. Mr. Smith during his terms of public service has made contributions to the retirement fund as prescribed by the laws of 1920 and 1924. For the purpose of fixing the annuity the State Controller found that Governor Smith was entitled to credit for 25 years, 10 months and 16 days of public service up to his retirement from the office of Governor on December 31, 1928.

In the absence of Mr. Smith it was impossible to determine just how the period of his public service was fixed. Mr. Smith was Governor eight years, an Assemblyman 12 years, Sheriff two years and President of the Board of Aldermen one year, a total of 22 years. Prior to his election to the Assembly in 1908 he served eight years as a process server in the office of the Commissioner of Jurors.

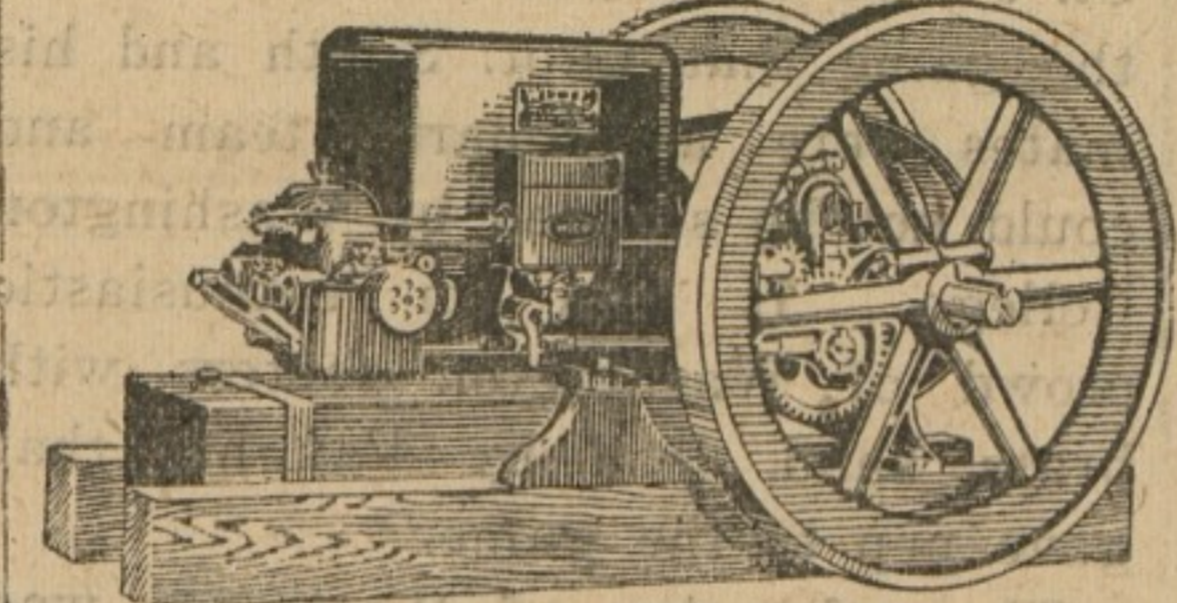
PRETTIEST COUNTRY IN THE WORLD
