

### COUNTY NURSES ACTIVE IN KENT

During February 1929 the two public health nurses of Kent made 105 visits in the county. Sixty-six different homes were visited where thirty-five actual nursing visits were made and seventy instructive visits. Nursing and instructive visits cover a wide field. They follow up surgical cases when the patient has returned to his home and include medic cases, tuberculosis, communicable disease, pre-natal cases, infant, pre-school and school children who have been examined in the various clinics held throughout the county. In the tuberculosis cases the patients are supplied free of charge with sputum cups and napkins. Instruction is given as to the care of the patient's diseases and every means are taken to protect the other members of the family from infection.

The nurses are in touch with seven-

ty-two tubercular cases in Kent and accompanied to the Easton Hospital. Dr. Holden, of Baltimore, and local physicians, operated upon seven children and one adult for tonsils and adenoids in the Kent County Hospital, Chestertown.

Since the local hospital was opened in September, 1928, nearly one hundred operations have been performed. During early fall operations took place twice a week. The present quarters are too small to permit daily operations or even three operating days a week. The hospital has a waiting list and demand for the work is growing daily.

Seven births were reported for February.

The nurses spent much time and effort in securing places in the various sections for the holding of the classes in Midwifery which were begun in March. Besides finding quarters for the classes the nurses got in personal touch with the midwives of the county and with several persons desiring to take up the work. The classes are being held under the direction of Dr. Catherine Goodson.

### REASONS LOSSES OF DAIRYMEN

Much of the trouble from poor quality milk in Kent County can be traced to an insufficient amount of good quality roughage.

According to the 1925 census, in the best dairy counties of the State, from one and one-half to two tons of hay is grown per animal.

A dairy cow should have one and one-half tons of hay and the dairyman should plan to grow two tons for each animal. Legume hay is best since it is higher in protein, lime and vitamins.

Silage is an important feed for dairy cows. Good Legume hay and silage will maintain a Jersey cow and produce 12 pounds of milk a day, and will maintain a Holstein cow and produce 16 pounds of milk and this without any grain.

Farmers feeding alfalfa hay and silage, with no grain, have produced milk at a cost of 85 cents per 100 pounds of milk a year.

In sections where an abundance of good roughage is provided there is very little trouble from off flavored milk this time of the year for the reason that the dairyman can keep their cows up and feed them until the grass gets a good start. Not only does the dairyman get better milk but he has a much better pasture throughout the season, because the grass was given a chance to get started.

Experiments have shown that one minute after a cow eats garlic it can be detected in the milk. The cow however, must be off of the pasture seven hours before milking to remove the garlic flavor. This means that the cows must be taken up at eleven o'clock, if you are milking at six o'clock.
