### "LILAC TIME" HERE NEXT WEEK

### VISITORS TO KENT

Commissioner Harrison, of Talbot, on Tuesday reported to the Commissioners of a trip made by himself and seven other prominent men of his section. They came to Chestertown to consult with Engineer Townshend, the new State road engineer of this district. In the party, besides Mr. Harrison, were ex-County Commissioner James S. Sewell, J. S. Harrison, D. Earle Kemp, C. B. Frey, Owen Harrison, O. J. Coleman, and Howard Sinclair. They were interested in macadam roads and, because of the suggestion that the McDaniel stretch be built of macadam, wanted the opinion of Mr. Townshend. They were taken to see three pieces of macadam road, one that could be built for \$5,000 a mile, another for \$9,000, and both of these were on old bases. A third piece, built from the clay up, cost \$19,000 a mile. As the difference in the cost between this piece and concrete was so slight the committee has recommended that concrete be used on this road. In fact the Commissioners have never had any other plan. The committee would like to see the State experiment with a small piece of macadam road to cost about \$6,000, simply as a demonstration, and will ask Mr. Townshend to have this done if possible, leaving the road to be experimented on entirely to him.



