

SAFETY ON OUR ROADS

It is significant to note that in each of three automobile accidents, happening in as many directions in or near this city the past week end, that State Police, in their charges, alleged that intoxicants played conspicuous roles.

This is more appalling when it is taken into consideration that spring, when the "open road" irresistibly calls, has just officially arrived and highways, in every direction, are being negotiated by an increasing number of cars.

Wishing neither to pass upon the guilt or innocence of the parties accused nor taking into consideration any punishments which have been or may be meted out in the premises, we do think that the time has arrived when drastic steps must be taken to keep from behind the wheel hooch-saturated drivers—every one of whom when he sets forth is nothing less than a potential murderer.

Our highways must be made safe for law-abiding citizens. Certainly they pay abundantly for such protection.

State Police seem to have already started their crusade and they should

continue to energetically inquire into circumstances surrounding every smashup and, if the proper evidence is at hand that a man is driving drunk, to insist upon heavy penalties. It is not our desire that one scintilla of disgrace should besmirch the character of an innocent driver.

If fines do not deter, then revocation or suspension of licenses and jail sentences, we believe, surely will.

Only a few days ago the case of a Frederica (Delaware) physician came to our attention. Important as was the calling of the professional man only the fact that a three month's jail sentence in his case would jeopardize the health of the community, due to there being but one other doctor, saved him from serving the sentence previously imposed. Instead he was fined \$200 and costs and must employ someone to do his future driving, for a while at least.

Whether some liquor laws, in their present form, can be enforced or not is a much mooted question. The fact remains, however, that violations of that part pertaining to operating a motor while drunk can be cut to a minimum by setting before the public the proper examples.

Following an accident this week our local Peoples Court Judge, at the instance of a young man's father, requested the Automobile Commissioner to permanently revoke the youth's permit to drive. That father, de-

parting from the usual procedure in such cases, the custom being rather to back the offspring in such instances, distinctly moved in the interest of public safety and his son as well, for, after all conviction for reckless driving is not a drop in the bucket to consequences that possibly might arise in the future by such operation of a motor car.—Salisbury Advertiser.

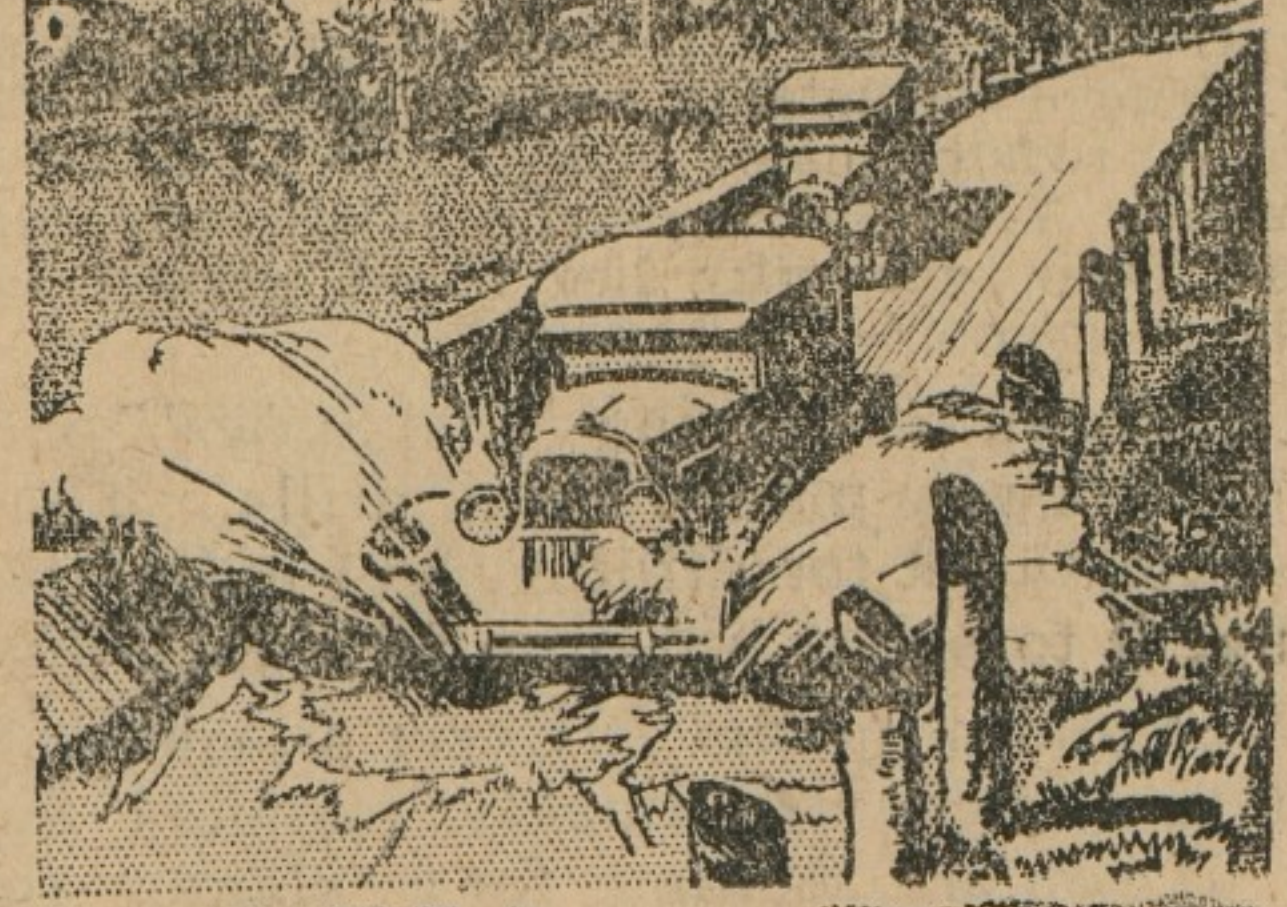

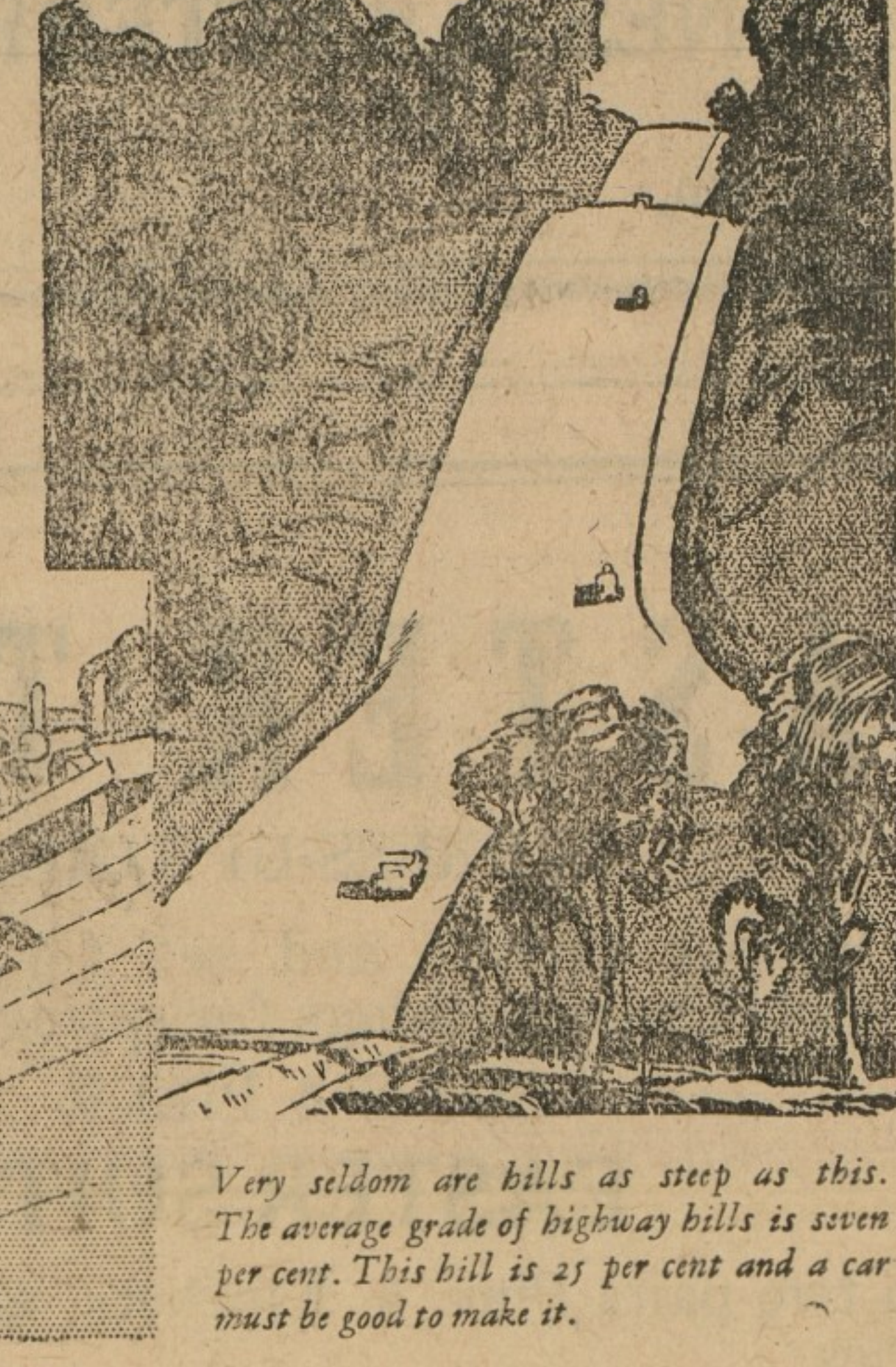

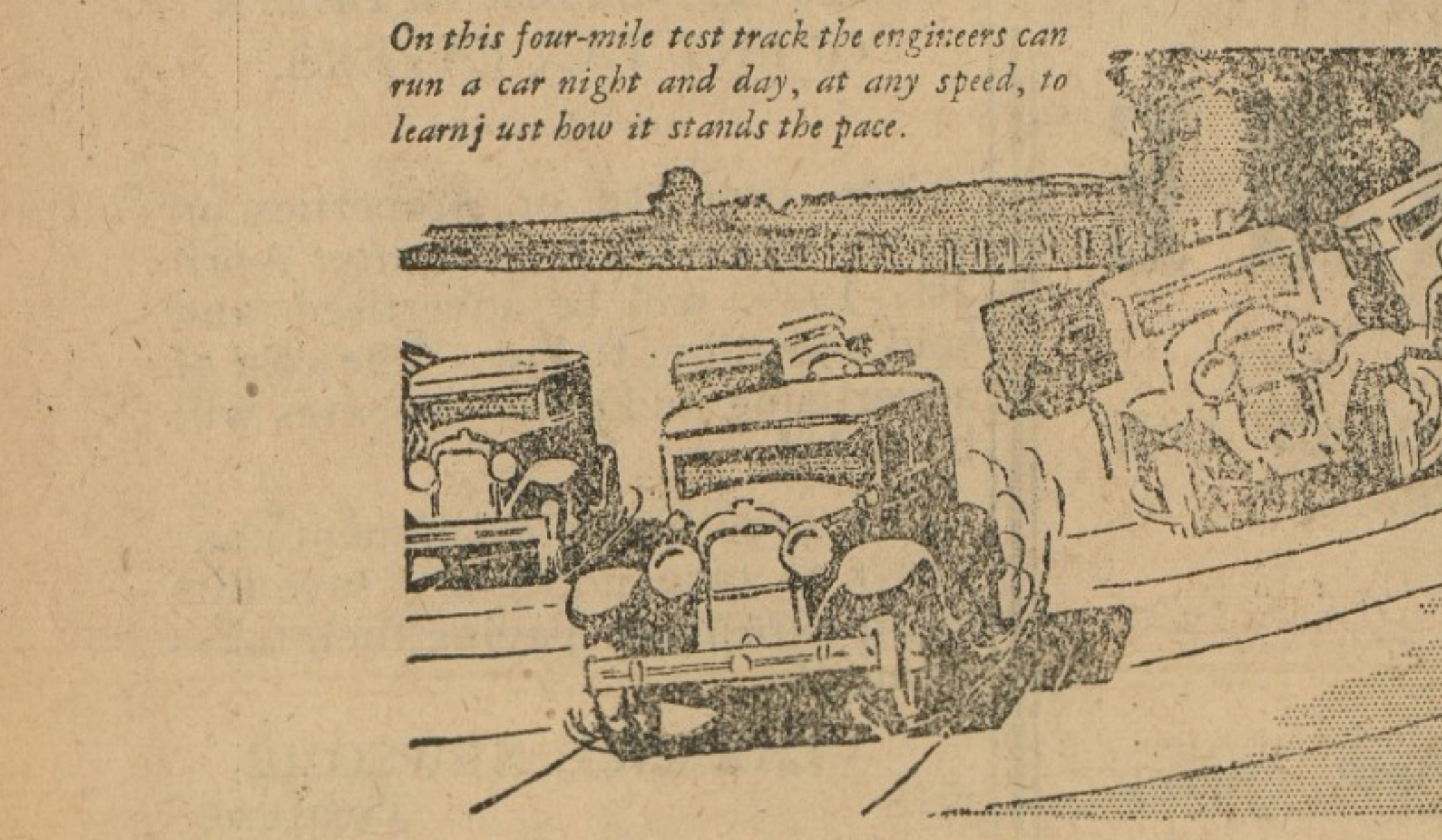
