REV. J. A. HUDSON GUILTY, SUSPENDED

The Rev. J. A. Hudson was found guilty of imprudence and unministerial conduct by a jury of ministers of the Wilmington M. E. Conference and suspended. He was acquitted of charges of obtaining money by false pretense and of perjury.

The Rev. George A. Cooke, who has stirred Conference by a letter he had circulated during the session in which he spoke of some ministers as "crooks," and by his attempts to bring charges against the Rev. Dr. F. A. Lindhorst, director of religious education, during the sessions, has been placed on the inactive list. His attempt to have a letter read dealing with Conference studies, was halted by Conference at a stirring session.

INTERESTING REPORTS

Superintendent Omar E. Jones in his report to the Methodist Episcopal Conference last week had the following items:

"The Middletown District has twice known sorrow together as death has increased the parsonage home. After 55 years of wedded life, 39 of which were spent in faithful, loving supply service in our conference, the wife of Brother McLaine has been called to her Heavenly home. The whole district was shocked in the Summer by the drowning of the son of Brother McClintock, of Wye Mills. This was the going forth from us of a lad getting well on to manhood whose face was set towards the ministry. These are two good brothers of our local ministry, and our hearts go out to them and to the mother of this dear lad as we share with them their great sorrow.

"Many things have occurred on the district this year that would be of interest to you. Piney Neck has increased the pastor's support by \$50. This may seem like a small item, I know. Well, I wish all our churches could match it. There are only some 23 members in this little church, the \$700 they have been paying their preacher has meant pretty large per capita giving. This sixth year of Brother Barrett's stay with them, they said in the quarterly conference: 'We have got a good man for our preacher, and we love him. We want to do something to show our gratitude. We don't know how we are going to do it, but we want to give him \$750 this year.' Now, would any one think that a little thing, a small and unimportant item in the life of the district? I am perfectly willing to put that for its beauty and its greatness of spirit beside anything that has been done anywhere in our conference year.

"In these last two years, Rock Hall has paid off an indebtedness on the parsonage of \$2,180, renovated the church to the extent of \$1,700, purchased a church house for \$4,000, and installed a pipe organ, itself a gift, but costing \$1,160 for installation. This has been paid in full, together with the amount of the repairs on the church and the salary for the pastor this year has been advanced \$300. I cite this as just an example of what faith and courage and great devotion, combined with a sacrificial spirit, can accomplish.

"We are just as proud today as we can be that our church at Cecilton is freed from that awful burden and blight of debt. I do not know how it has been done at all. It seemed an entirely impossible thing that \$14,000 could be raised in this community, or through this community, after these years of generous giving and the repeated financial reverses that have touched this whole section of the country.

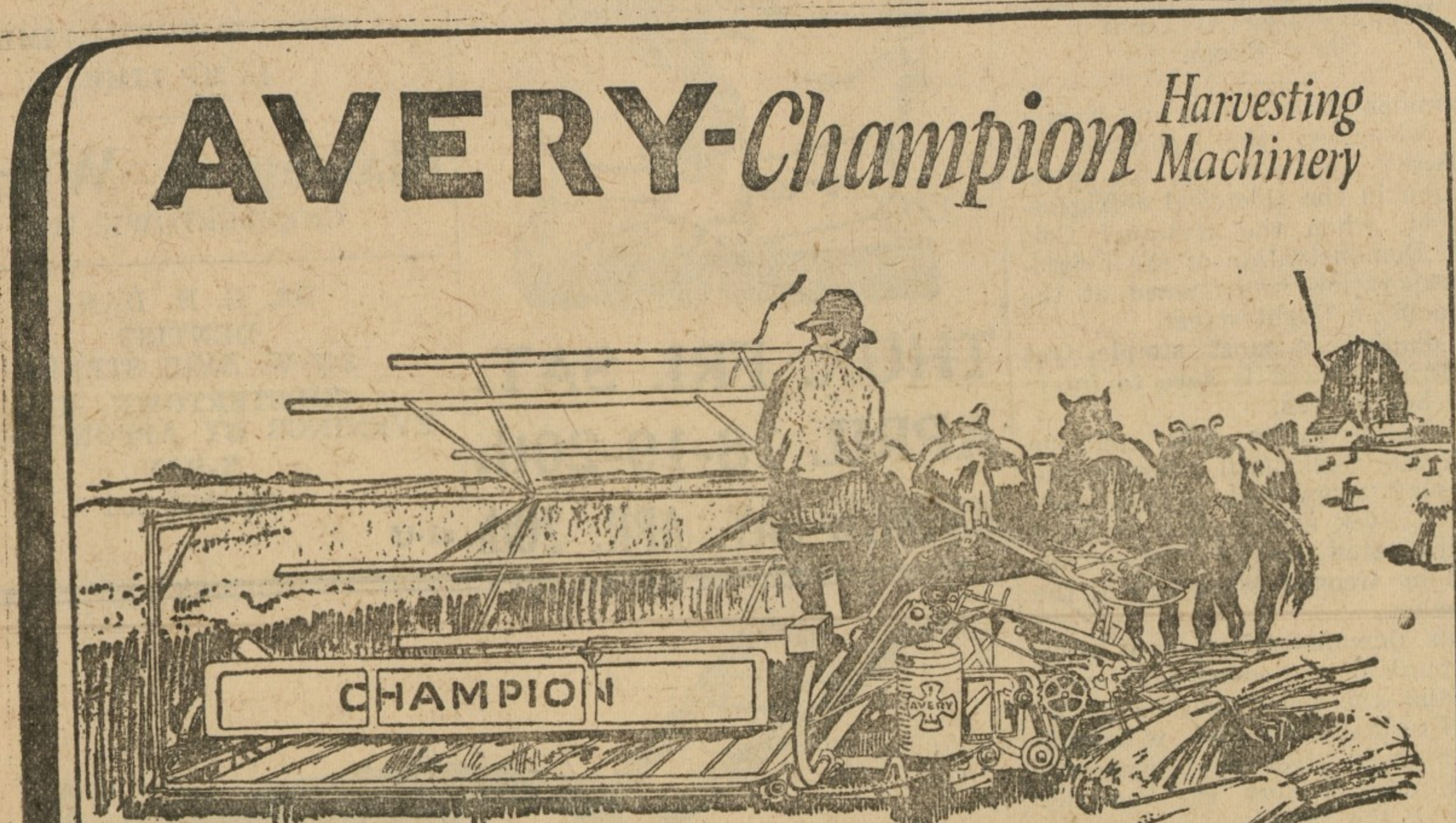

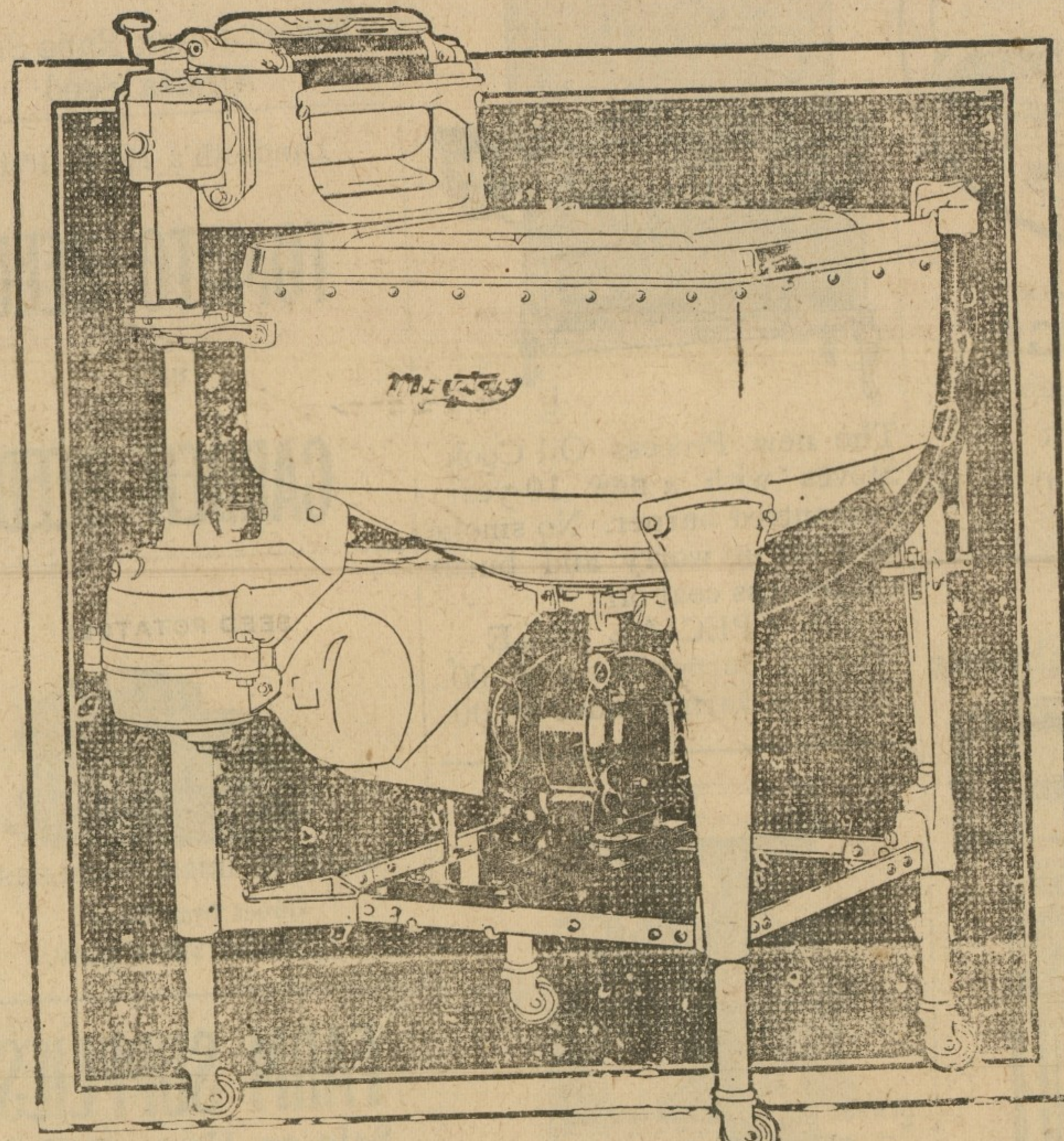
