

2ND INSTITUTE ON MAY 4TH

The Eastern Shore Institute of Public Affairs will hold its second annual conference Saturday, May 4, at Washington College, Chestertown. The first speaker will be Alfredo Banos-Contreras, Mexican Consul at Baltimore. Senor Banos will discuss "What Is Really Happening in Mexico."

Feng Djen Djang, of Ehanghai, will speak on "China Looks to the Future." "Making the Kellogg-Briand Pact Effective" is the subject of the other addresses announced for the morning session. It will be given by Dr. Clinton I. Winslow, associate professor of political science at Goucher College.

A discussion will follow, after which luncheon will be served.

Dr. Gordon F. Cadish, professor of political science at the University of Maryland, will discuss "Current Political and Economic Development in the Orient" at the session opening at 2.30 p. m. Irving Whitehead, of the United States Farm Loan Bank, will speak on "Credit as a Factor in Farm Relief."

M. L. Corey, of New York, former member of the Federal Farm Loan Board and author of "Cooperative Marketing," will talk on "Pending Farm Relief Legislation." "What Is Maryland's Interest in

the Federal Farm Relief Bill?" is a question that will be taken up at a general discussion to be led by Chas. C. Gelder, member of the State Board of Regents, University of Maryland.

Dr. Esther Dole, head of the department of history at Washington College, will preside at the morning session, and Miss Lavinia Engle, of the League of Women Voters, Baltimore, will preside in the afternoon.

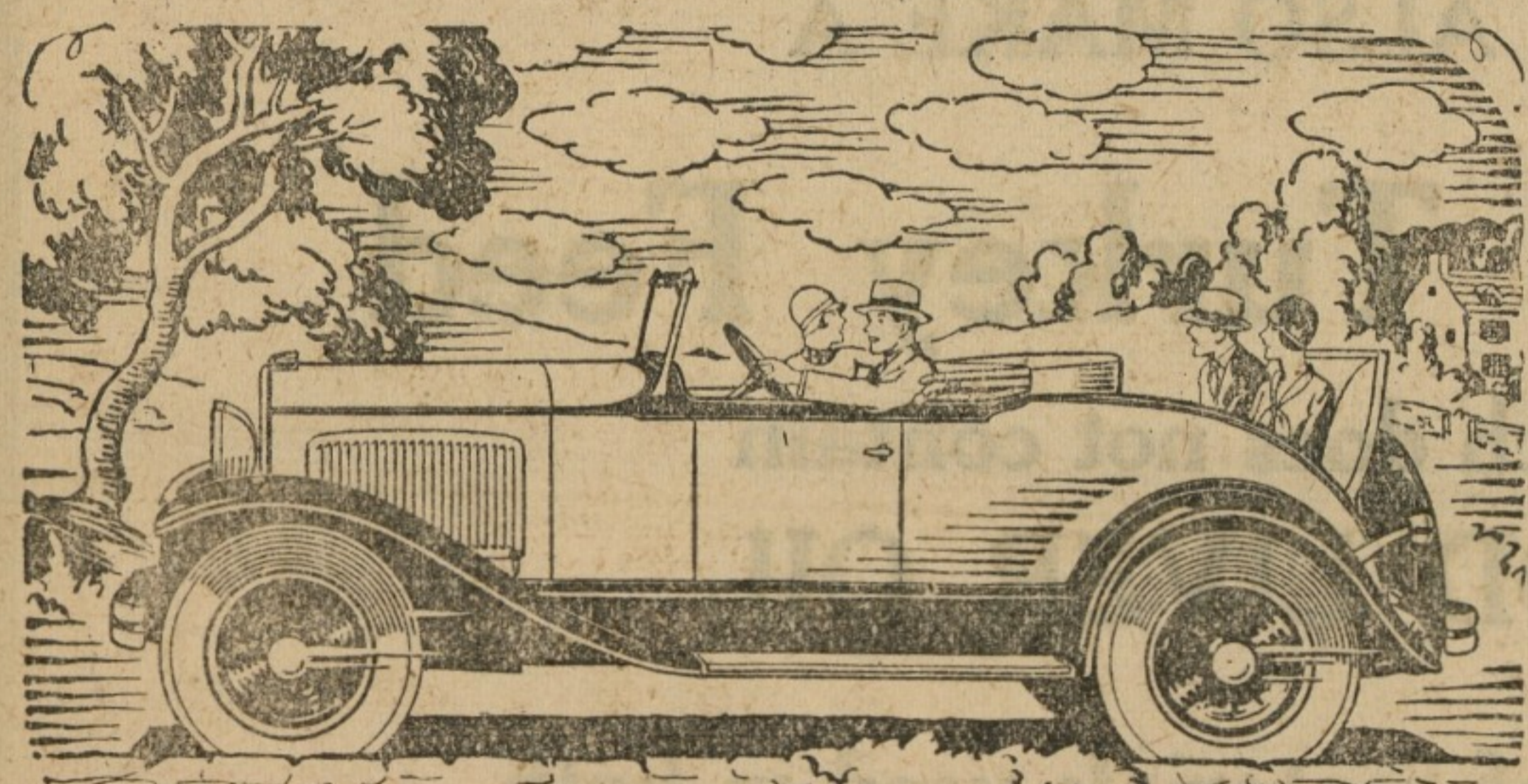
