

WALTER T. MORRIS HONORED

Walter T. Morris, former president of the Kent 4-H Calf Club, and Washington College senior, has been selected from among 2,600 club boys throughout the State as Maryland's representative at the Moses International Leaders Training School which will be held at Springfield, Mass., September 8-21, in connection with Camp Vail.

The choice was made by E. G. Jenkins, superintendent of Boys' Club work in the State after a survey of the work of club members. Walter Morris is one of the charter members of the Kent 4-H Clover Calf Club. He was a member of the State's dairy cattle judging team in 1926 at Detroit, was the State's representative at Camp Vail, Springfield, Mass., in 1923. He is the son of Mrs. Walter T. Morris and grandson of the late Dr. J. M. Sheridan.

Miss Anne Morrow, daughter of Ambassador and Mrs. Dwight W. Morrow, and Col. Charles A. Lindbergh were married at the bride's home Englewood, N. J., Monday afternoon.

The ceremony was performed by the Rev. William Adams Brown, of Union Theological Seminary, New York city.

The bride wore a simple white shifon dress, with short veil, made for her by Miss Mary Smith, the family dressmaker for years. She wore no gloves.

The complete informality of the wedding was attested by the fact that before it took place Colonel Lindbergh went into the garden of the Morrow home, picked a bouquet of blue larkspur and white columbine and handed them to his fiancée to carry at the ceremony. The colonel wore the same dark blue suit in

which he had appeared on all his visits to Englewood.

Besides the bridal couple and the clergyman five persons were present at the wedding. They were Ambassador and Mrs. Morrow, their daughters, Elizabeth and Constance, and Mrs. Evangeline Lindbergh, mother of the aviator.

Shortly after 7.30 o'clock Colonel Lindbergh and his bride left the Morrow home in an automobile for an unannounced destination. Lindbergh was hatless as they motored away. Ambassador Morrow had departed by motor car a short time before, after issuing the following announcement:

Mr. and Mrs. Dwight W. Morrow announce the marriage of their daughter Anne to Charles A. Lindbergh at Englewood, N. J., May 27, 1929.

News of the wedding came as a complete surprise. No advance announcement of the date had been

made, although there had been many guesses, most of which had favored mid-June.

Mrs. Florence Hope Blanchfield, of Chestertown, and James Thomas Semerteen were married Wednesday at the home of the bride's daughter, Mrs. S. C. Sparklin, 2407 Franklin street, Wilmington, at 8.30 by the Rev. R. H. Adams. They were attended by Mrs. Sparklin and Jesse Semerteen, a son of the groom. Only relatives and immediate friends witnessed the ceremony.

After a reception was held for them Mr. and Mrs. Semerteen left for a trip to the mountains of Western Maryland and on their return will be at home at 712 Lore avenue, Gordon Heights.

NEW METHOD OF RENDERING BILLS

A new system of rendering bills for telephone service has been inaugurated by the Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company of Baltimore City, according to an announcement just made by Miss Kathryn Smith, agent.

The new plan, according to Miss Smith's statement is known as "rotation billing," which means that instead of all subscribers' bills being dated the first of each month and mailed out at the same time each subscriber's monthly bill will be issued in one of six groups, dated either the 1st, 6th, 11th, 16th, 21st or 26th of the month and mailed out a few days later. The last bills under the former billing method were dated May 1. A notice explaining the new plan was mailed to each subscriber with this bill. Chestertown telephone subscribers

under the new plan will receive bills dated the 21st of each month; Galent, Millington-Rock Hall and Still Pond subscribers will receive bills dated the 6th of each month.

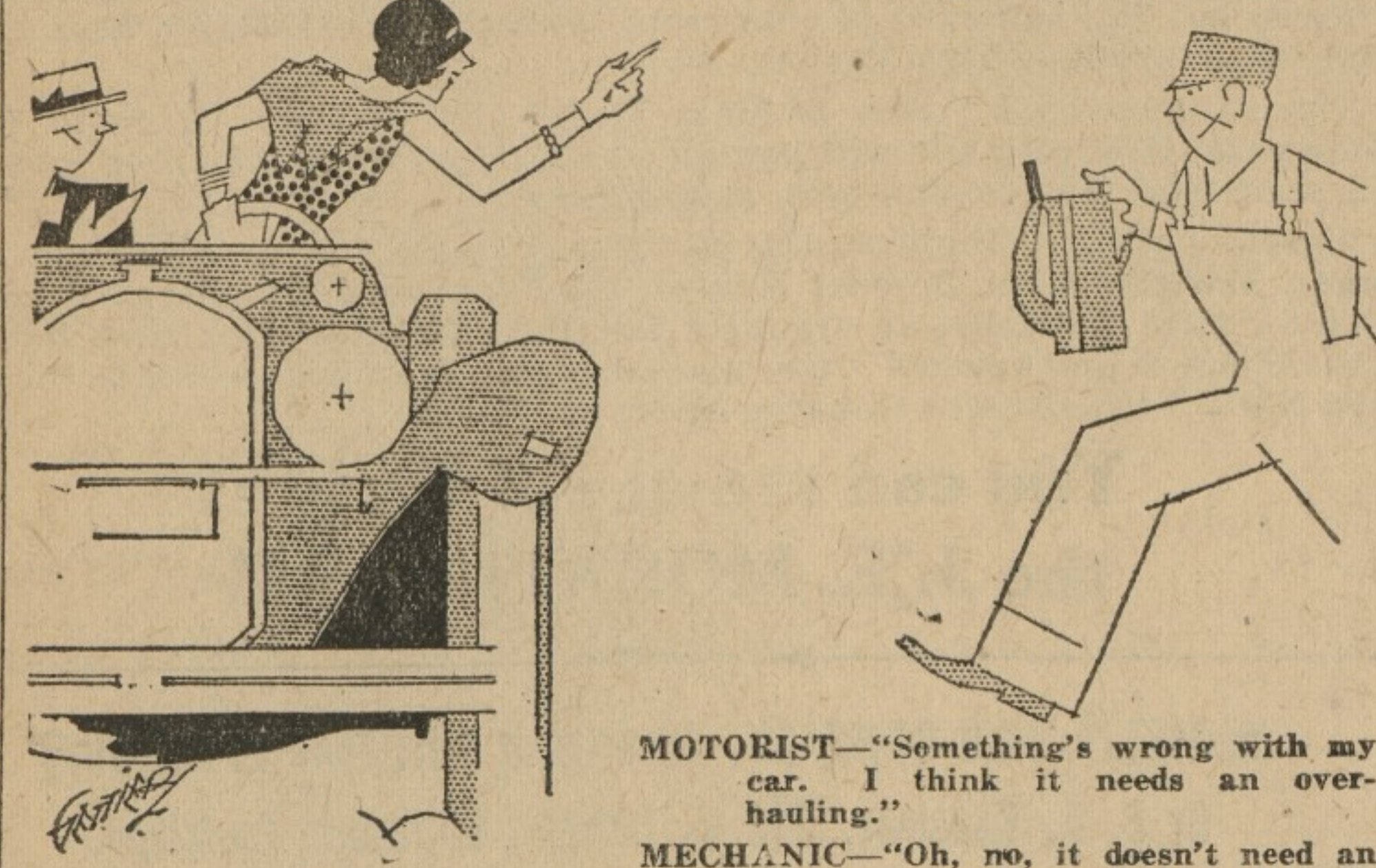

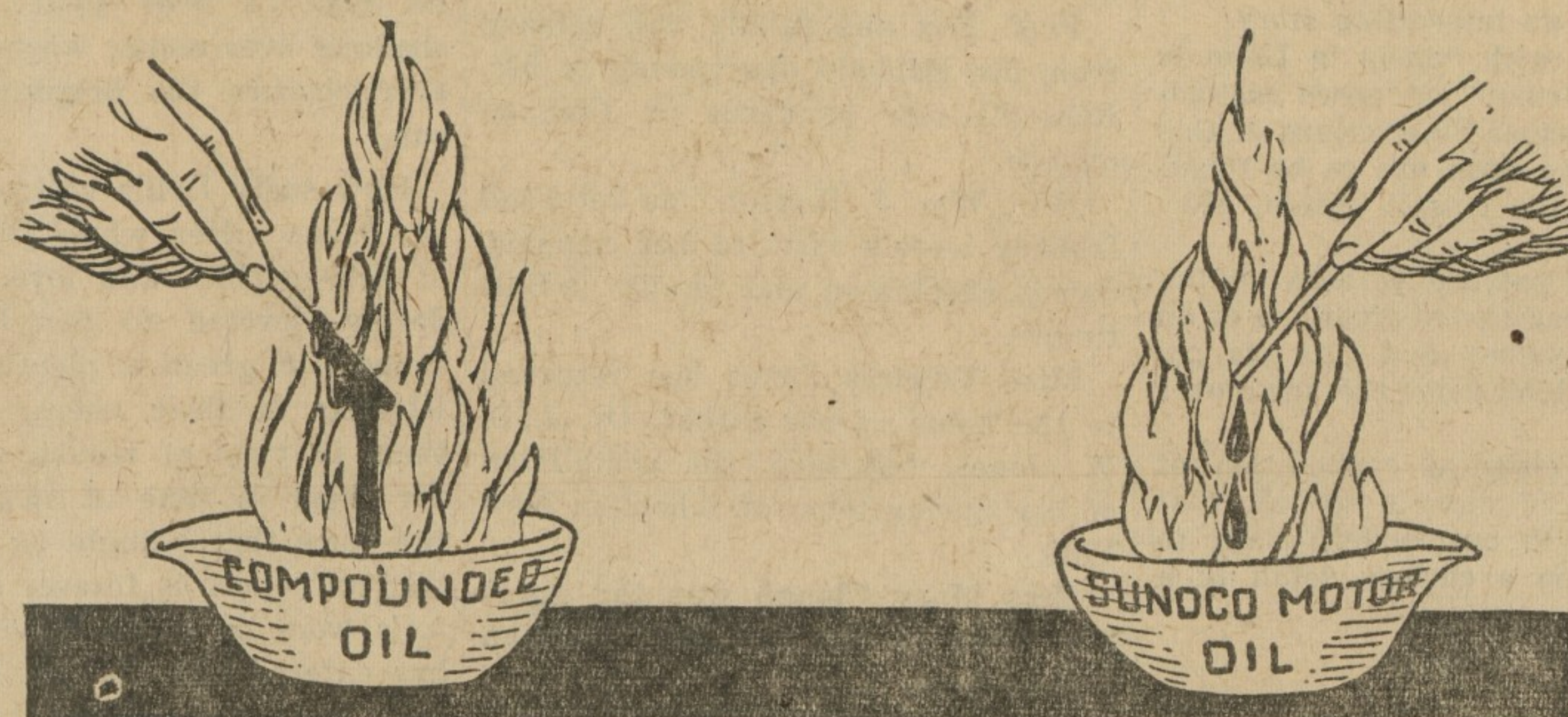

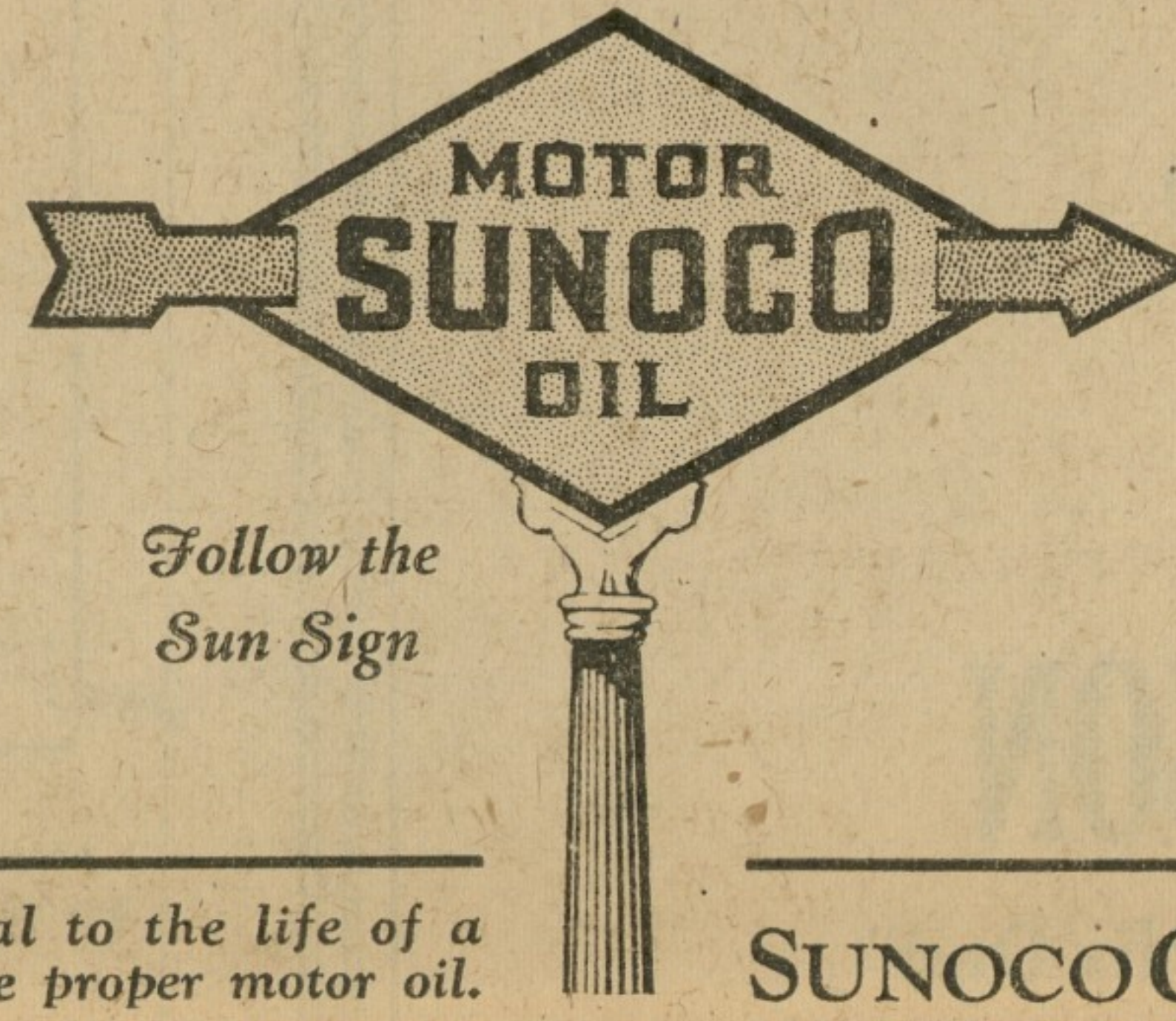
