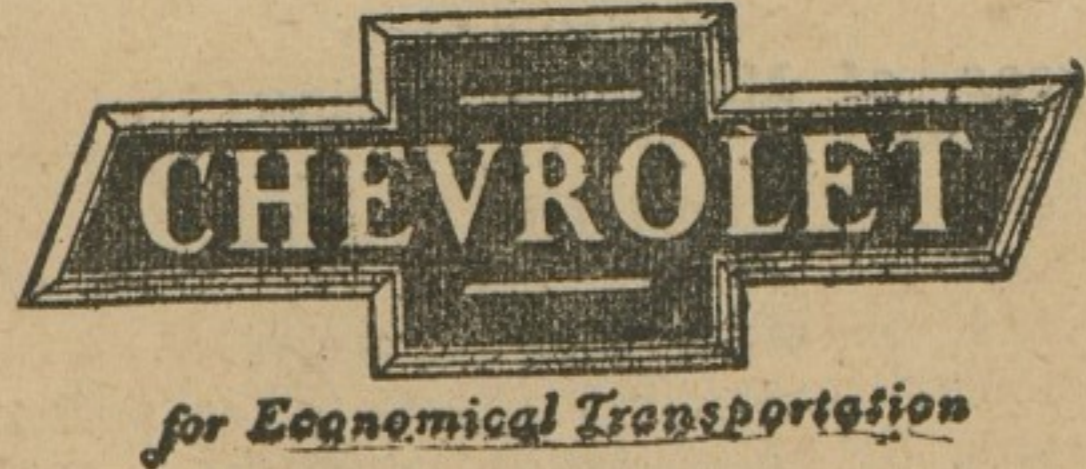

WALTER MOFFETT BENEFITS DAIRYING THE 4-H CLUBWAY

Some years ago, before the T. B. test was compulsory, Walter Moffett, of Broad Neck, in preparation for the entrance of his son into 4-H Club Work with purebreds tested his herd. The herd of 21 cows reacted. It looked like a severe blow but worked out to be a blessing.

In a recent conversation Mr. Moffett stated that he had been "cow poor" due not only to some poor cows but also to poor feeding and management on his part.

He purchased nine (9) cows to replace the 21 and determined to feed them well and in proportion to their ability to produce. He followed the practices recommended to his son in the 4-H Calf Club. The milk from each cow was weighed and tested for butterfat. A grain mixture suitable for his roughages was fed each cow in amounts determined by her production. His new practices brought surprise and satisfaction, for the nine cows gave as much milk as had the 21. The profits from handling the 9 good properly fed cows were materially greater than from the 21 alleged dairy cows fed on hit or miss plan.

Doubtless many other Kent County dairymen have had similar results if they have had sufficient feed and have fed well and economically. Should not this experience cause many farmers to think carefully before going out to buy as many cows as they had before the T. B. test? Why not provide adequate feed for the smaller number, feed them according to their production ability as determined by milk scales, Babcock test, and feed bill, eliminate those which cannot pay good returns over and above feed costs. Save the big investment—and the labor of housing and caring for the large number and make more money than under the old plan of being "cow poor" and poor cowmen.

Don't keep your business a secret. Take the public into your confidence. Tell them each week what you have to sell.
