AIR MEET HERE JULY 20

CONTRACT LET FOR SLAG ROADS
The contract for the laying of approximately 47 miles of Traffic Bound Slag Roads in Kent County was awarded Tuesday by the Kent Commissioners to T. Edge Russell and E. L. Major, of Frederick, Md.

The bid of Russell and Major was 41.4 cents per square yard or \$2.164 per mile. They will lay all of the road which is divided among the election districts with the appropriate mileage in each as follows:

First District, 6 miles; Second District, 6 miles; Third District, 11 miles; Fifth District, 7 miles; Sixth District, 10 miles; Seventh District, 8 miles.

The roads will be of a nine-foot width and will make up the secondary roads system of the county.

The total number of miles to be built will be around 47 miles.

Work will begin as soon as the contract can be drawn up between the County Commissioners and the successful bidder.

The whole work is expected to be finished by Nov. 15, 1929.
