STOCKHOLDERS' MEETING.
Baltimore and Delaware Bay Railroad Co.

Pursuant to a resolution of the Board of Directors of this Company, adopted at a meeting held on the fourth day of June, 1902, and conformable to the authority conferred by, and the provisions of an Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, approved March 28, 1902, entitled:
"An Act to authorize the Baltimore and Delaware Bay Railroad Company to change the northern terminus of its railroad from the present point on the boundary line between this State and the State of Delaware, to the point of intersection with the Townsend Branch of the Delaware Railroad; to discontinue operation of, and abandon the small portion of its railroad between said points; and to transfer and convey to the Delaware Railroad Company, and to authorize the Delaware Railroad Company to become lessee or purchaser thereof."
A special meeting of the stockholders of the Baltimore and Delaware Bay Railroad Company is called to meet at the office of the Company, in Chestertown, Maryland, on WEDNESDAY, the 26th day of June, 1902, at 10 o'clock A. M., to consider and determine in the manner provided by said Act, the question of changing the northern terminus of this Company's railroad, and discontinue and abandoning the operation of the small portion of the railroad between the present terminus and the point of intersection with the Townsend Branch of the Delaware Railroad Company; and to transfer and convey to the Delaware Railroad Company, and to authorize
