THE ELECTION CASES.

The taking of evidence in the contested election cases in Kent county, was commenced before Justice Melvin on Monday. Mr. W. F. Anderson, of Still Pond, was on the stand all day, and testified that from 30 to 40 properly marked republican ballots were rejected. The hearing was not resumed until Thursday, when Mr. J. B. DeCourse was on the stand.

Unless Mr. Urie, who is the attorney for the contestants, succeeds in securing decidedly stronger evidence than that so far presented, the Kent county ballot boxes will never be opened for a recount of the ballots. The evidence upon which Mr. Urie and his clients base their hope for a recount (if Mr. Urie has such a hope) was shattered by Messrs. Hynson and Barroll, who appeared for the contestants. The republican claim so far is extremely weak and flimsy.
