Mr. Henry J. Gray's pretty new home is finished. This is one of the most modern homes in this community.

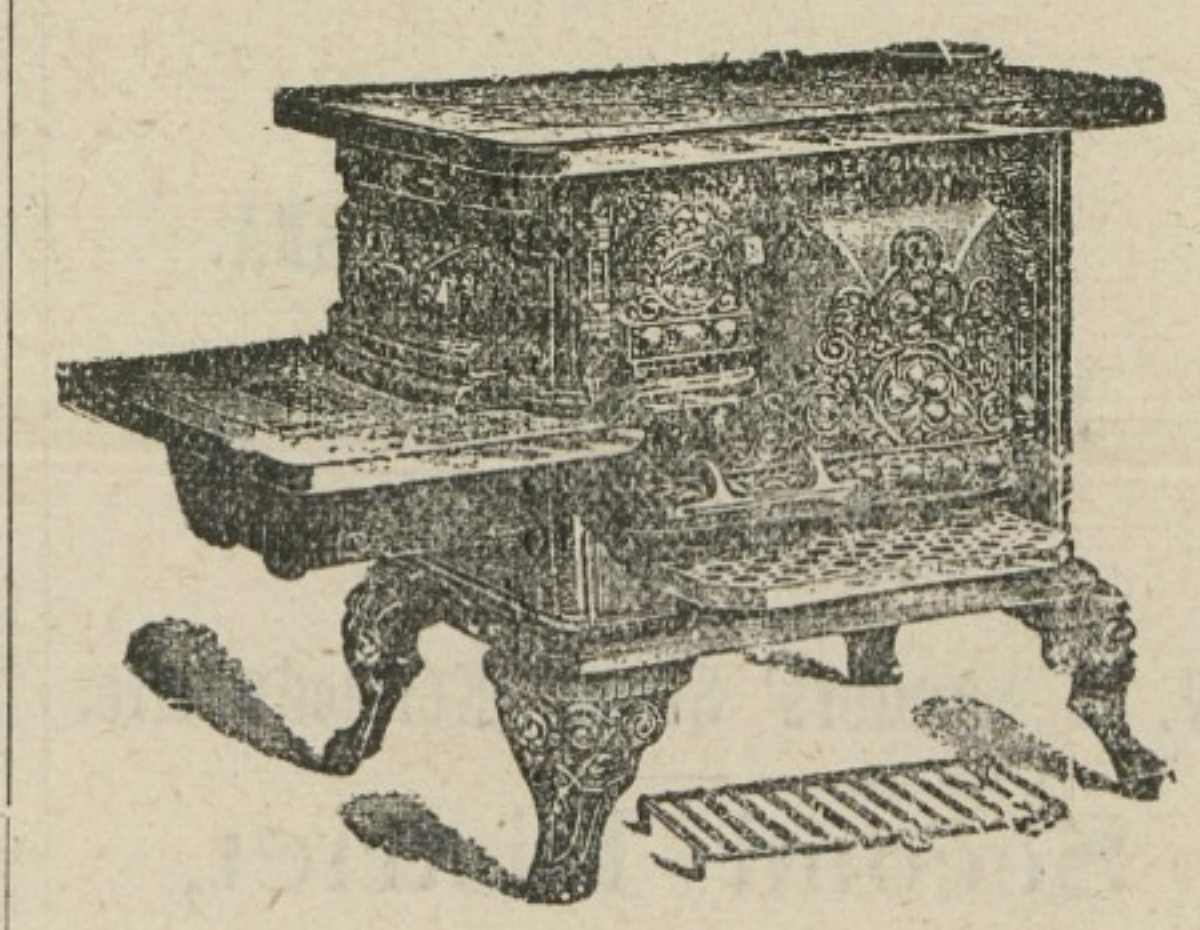
