1. If the hands are removable, they are easily bleached. If they are not, you will have difficulty in whitening them. Try rubbing them with finely powdered pumice-stone and water and exposing them to the sun, while still moist, under a glass shade to prevent desiccation and the occurrence of cracks. Ivory may also be bleached by immersing it for a short time in water holding a little sulphuric acid, chloride of lime, or chlorine in solution.

(2) Try cleaning your rug with corn-meal. It is going to be hard work, if the rug is very soiled to renovate it so, but I know nothing better to use. Rub it in well with a brush and allow it to remain a day or two. Then shake out. A sacred application may be necessary.

Any of the veterinary surgeons in the city will treat cats at their hospitals. A list of such surgeons will be found in the back of the City Directory under the head of "Veterinary." There is no free hospital for felines, but the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, if notified will send for ill animals and have them asphyxiated.

Please tell me what you can about sands of Towyn, in North Wales.

Towyn is a popular seashore resort on the west coast of Wales. I know of nothing peculiar about the sands there.

(1) The letter would best reach the bride and bridegroom after the ceremony; then it could be addressed to both, and could convey your wishes for their happiness to them as one. Send your card to the person in whose name the invitation is issued.

(2) Either of these plates may be used at any meal except dinner. Butter is not now generally served at dinner.

(3) No.

(4) At the evening meal. Use on the table. If a formal luncheon is given, darken the room and use the candelabra.

(5) At luncheon or tea, if you have a midday dinner.

(6) At breakfast, a fruit knife, a cereal spoon, a teaspoon and a breakfast knife and fork should be placed beside the plate. At dinner, an oyster fork, a soup spoon, a fork each for the fish, entree, salad and dessert, a large knife and fork, a knife for the fish and an after-dinner coffee spoon may be used if all these courses are to be served. The amount of silver used at luncheon and dinner depends entirely, as at every other meal, upon what is going to be served. If soup is the first course at luncheon, a soup spoon will, of course, be necessary; if a salad is a part of the menu, there should be an extra fork. Fruit knives must be added when whole fruit is used. Each piece of silver at the covers has its use, and by consulting your bill of fare you can tell much better than I can tell you exactly what will be needed.

(7) One sees in the houses of some "great" people huge bowls of visiting cards; at others not a card is left in sight. Do want you will with yours, only don't allow them to gather dust and microbes.

Kindly advise me concerning the style of suit (whether full dress, tuxedo or frock coat and light trousers), color and vest and style (whether white or black, single or double breasted) and style of tie (whether bow already tied or to be tied by one's self or four-in-hand), on each of the following occasions:

If he wears the latter, a black bow tie is the invariable accompaniment, just as a white bow tie must be worn with the dress coat. A man of good taste wears an already-tied cravat. He ties his own ties, of course. Double or single breasted white vests may be worn with both the tuxedo and dinner coat.

The proper afternoon dress for men consists of frock coat, black or white vest, light gray trousers, white or light colored ascot tie, silk hat, gloves. This should be worn at noon or morning weddings, either at home or at church, to the matinee, for visiting, and for afternoon receptions, in fact, for any function held before 6 o'clock P. M.

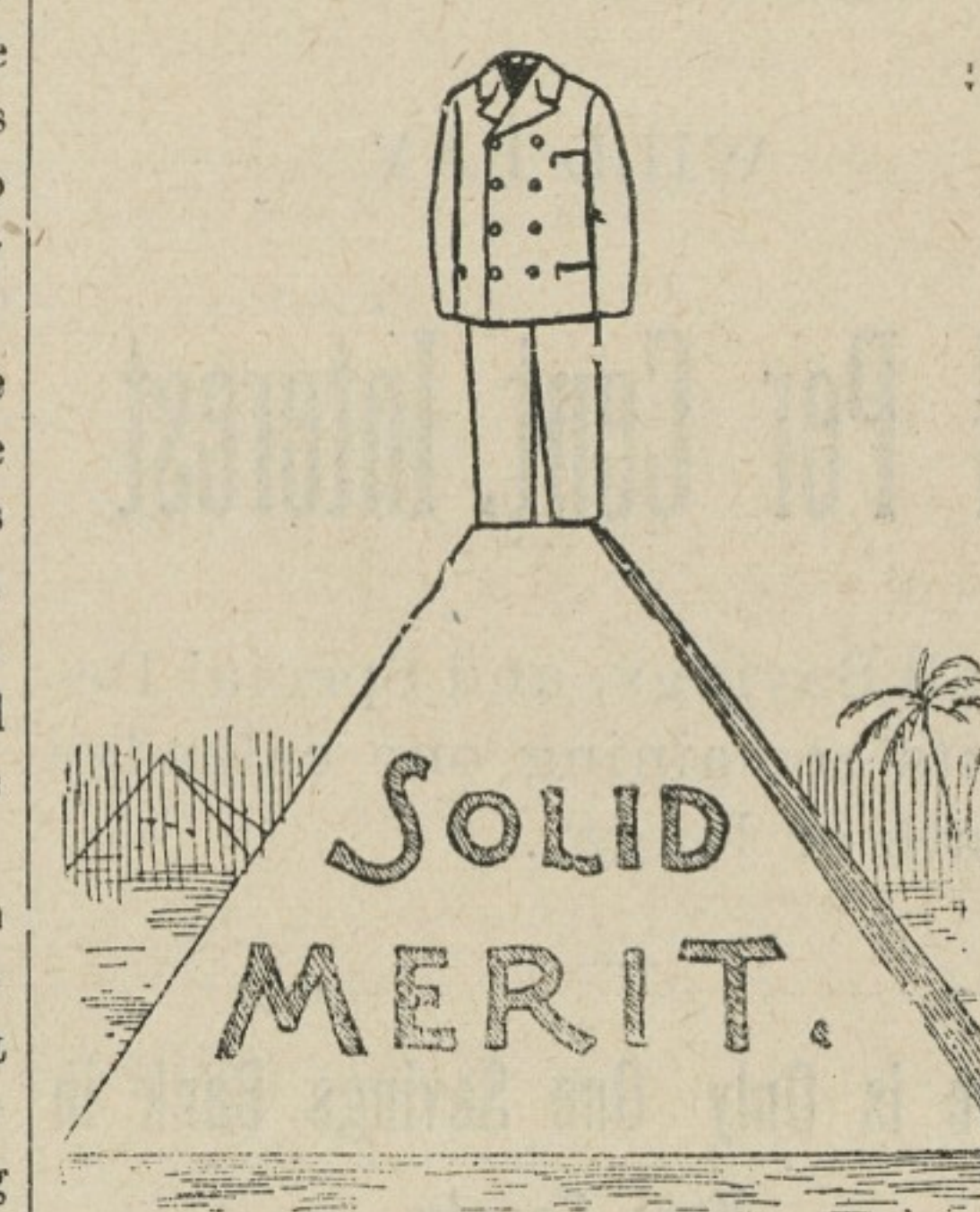
