HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

Tinware can be cleaned readily by rubbing it with a damp cloth dipped in soda; rub briskly and wipe dry.

Sift a little baking powder into the flour from which you make piecrust. It is an excellent factor in making "short," crisp crust.

Scatter salt over soot when it falls upon a carpet. The soot will adhere to the salt when brushed up lightly, and leaves the carpet perfectly clean.

Make your knot on the end of the thread that first leaves the spool, and you will sew with a smooth thread and an unruffled temper.—Good Housekeeping.

Tie up the small pieces of toilet soap, when reduced to a size inconvenient for use, in a linen bag. The bag can then be used as a cake of soap, and the linen allowing enough of the soap through to make a lather.

Scald four tablespoonsful of dry mustard with a cupful of boiling water and stir into it, when cold, one tablespoonful of vinegar, one of salad oil, one teaspoonful of white sugar and a pinch of salt. Beat to a cream. This is a delicious preparation of mustard and keeps well.

BEEF DRESSING.—One cupful vinegar, one-half cupful sugar, butter the size of a walnut, salt and pepper to taste, scant tablespoonful of cornstarch or flour. Mix thoroughly, boil till it thickens, pour over the sliced boiled beets and serve immediately.

ALL AROUND THE FARM.

Crush egg shells before feeding them to the fowls; otherwise you may teach them the vice of egg-eating.

Be on the lookout for a nice spot to plant some early potatoes. The earlier you get them in, the earlier they'll be ready to come out.

It is none too early to get your order in for seeds, tubers and plants. Don't wait until time to make garden before selecting and ordering these things. Shipments are often delayed and gardeners are rushed later in the season. Order early.

We like the idea of giving the farm a name. It adds to the individuality of the home and often proves of real help in locating places. Since rural electric lines are becoming more general farmers are urged to name their places and many are responding.

Do have a place for things and do put things in their proper places. Some men spend time enough hunting for a hammer or a wrench or some other necessary tool to do considerable valuable work. 'Twill save time to put things where they belong.

Now that prosperous days are with us and every farm product is bringing a good price, it is time to make leaps in reducing the indebtedness on the farm, or, if you are fortunate enough not to have such a burden, lay up a few hundred in the bank for "the time that may come." Don't be miserly or niggardly. Be wisely economical.

"Most farmers spend a great deal of time currying their horses and making them look sleek and clean, but these men utterly neglect their cows, thinking it a waste of time to clean them off. 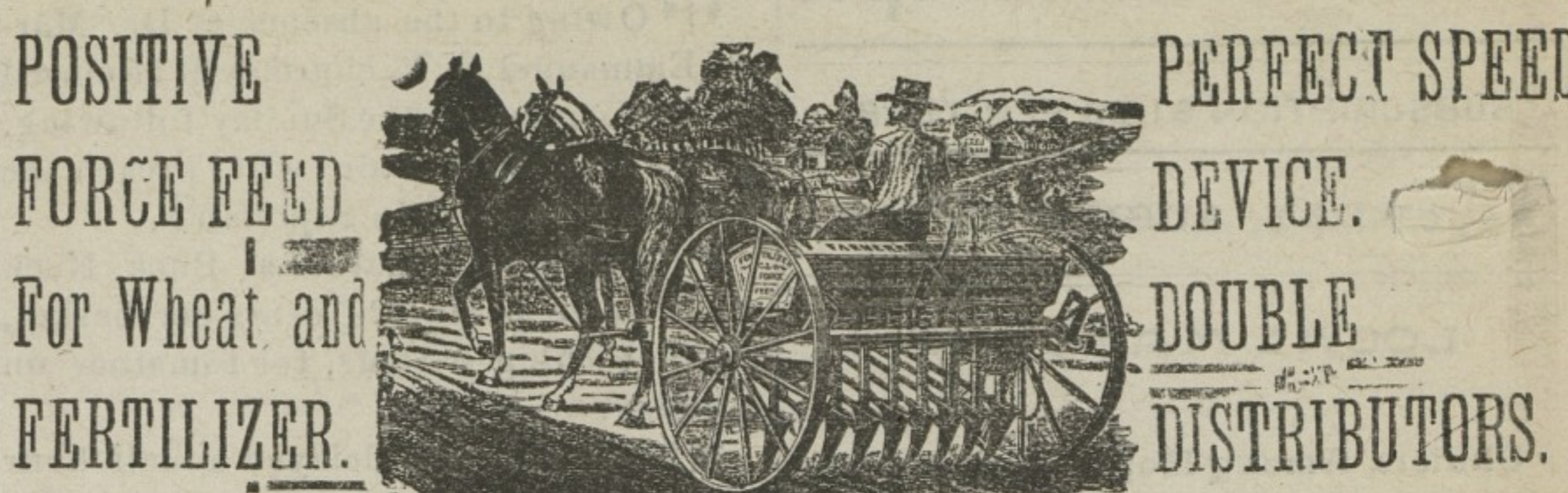

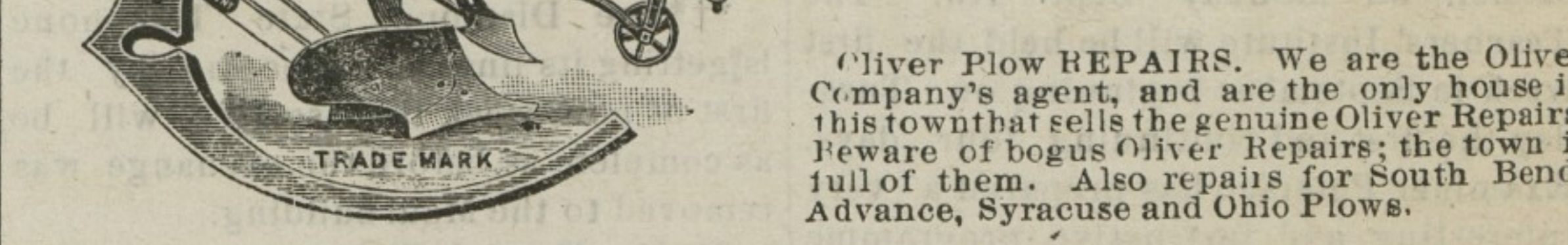
