COUNTY FINANCES.

Significant Comments of a Republican County Commissioner Upon the Financial Affairs of Kent County.

The editors of the TRANSCRIPT enjoyed a very pleasant and instructive call from a former County Commissioner of one of our neighboring counties the other day.

"If there is nothing wrong with the financial affairs of Kent county, why does not the Republican Board of County Commissioners, who are the custodians of the tax-payers' money, and who are responsible for the correct and safe-keeping of the books of the office, say to these tax-payers, 'Gentlemen, the books of this office are open for your inspection.'"

"Why, as the custodians of the books of the Commissioners' office, do they not come out and say frankly what has been done with that ledger and the leaves from the minute book?"

"If there is nothing wrong with the financial affairs of Kent county, why do not the Commissioners produce that ledger and those leaves and open them to the public?"

"This," said he, "would be the most honorable course for them to pursue, and until this is done the Republican Board of County Commissioners will be held responsible by the tax-payers for gross negligence in office."
